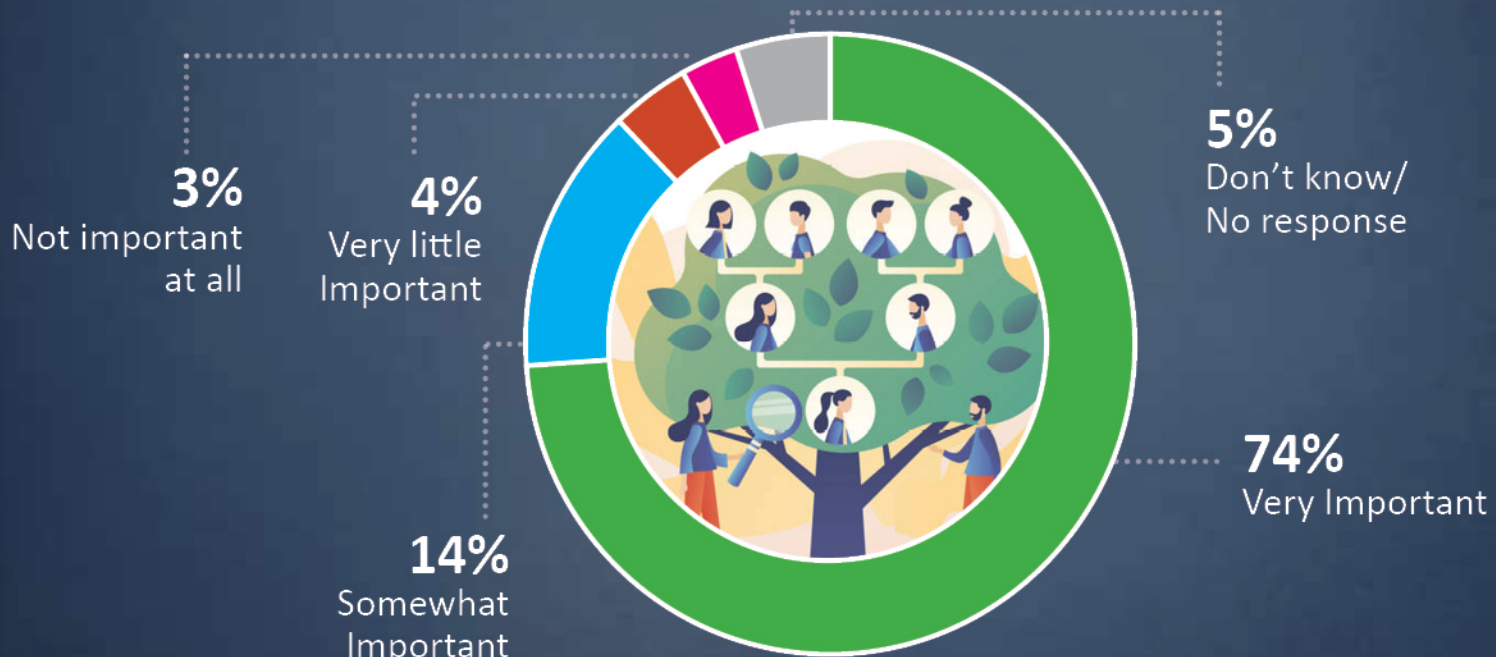

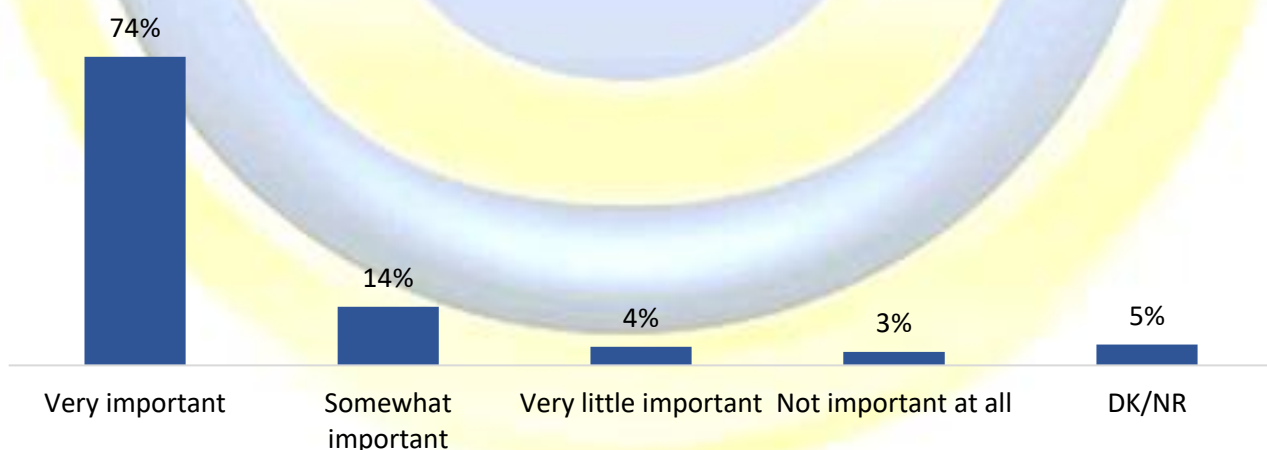

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, nearly 3 in 4 (74%) Pakistanis believe that in order to be a true Pakistani, one's forefathers should originate from Pakistan (before partition).

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, *"Some people think it is important to have following points to be a true Pakistani whereas other people think these are not as important. To what extent do you agree? (Your forefathers originating from Pakistan (before partition))."* In response to this question, 74% said very important, 14% said somewhat important, 4% said very little important, and 3% said not important at all. 5% did not know or provided no response.

Question: "Some people think it is important to have the following points to be a true Pakistani whereas other people think these are not as important. To what extent do you agree? (Your forefathers originating from Pakistan (before partition))."

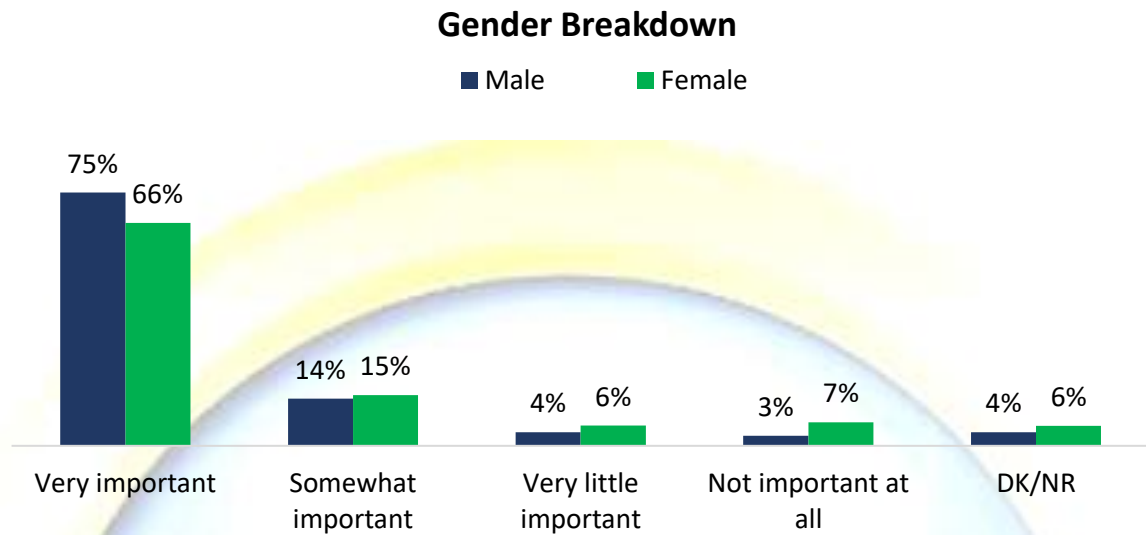
All Pakistan

75% of males as compared to 66% of females believe that in order to be a true Pakistani, one's forefathers should originate from Pakistan (before partition).

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1730 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during September 23, 2021 – October 8, 2021. The error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 2 -3 percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was CATI.
