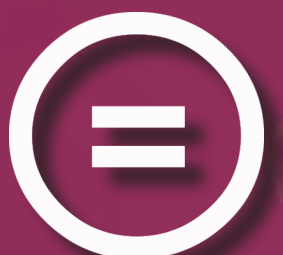
How has the COVID-19 situation impacted your income?

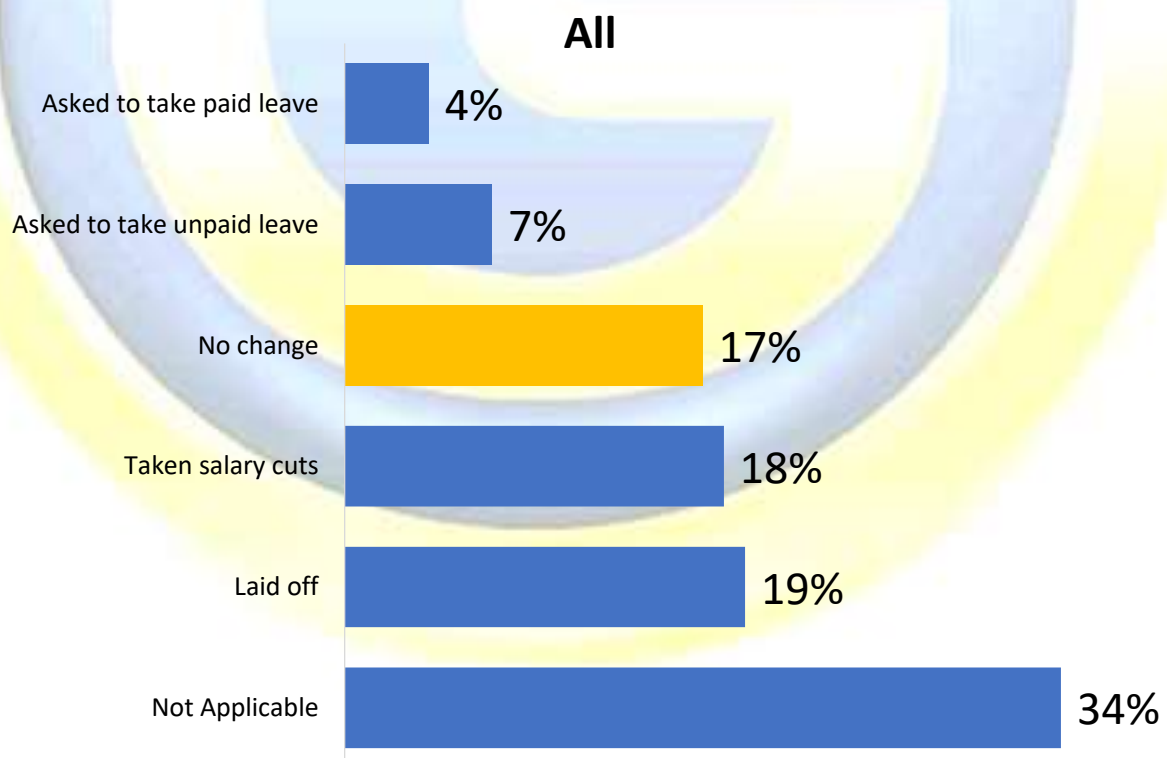

According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 1 in 5 (19%) Pakistanis say they have been laid-off due to the COVID-19 situation. A similar proportion have taken salary cuts.

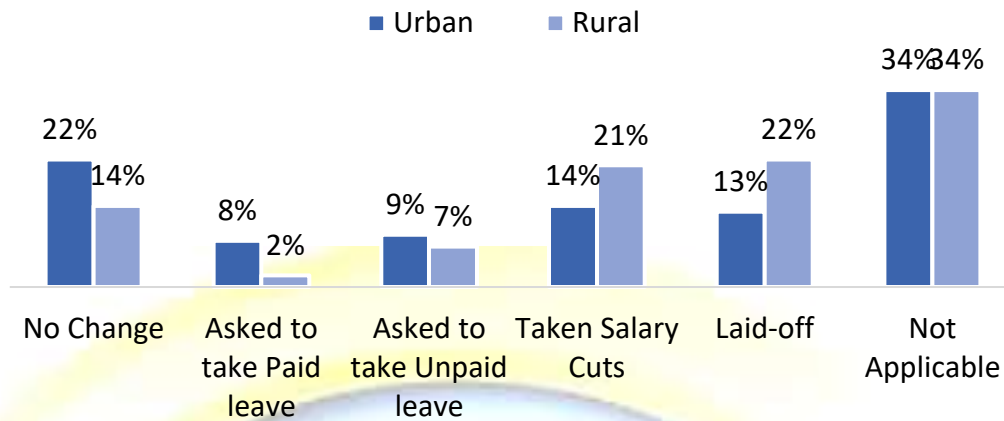
A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, “*How has the COVID-19 situation impacted your income?*” In response to this question, 4% said they were asked to take paid leave, 7% were asked to take unpaid leave, 17% experienced no change in their income, 18% reported taking salary cuts, 19% reported they had been laid off. 34% said that this question was not applicable to them.

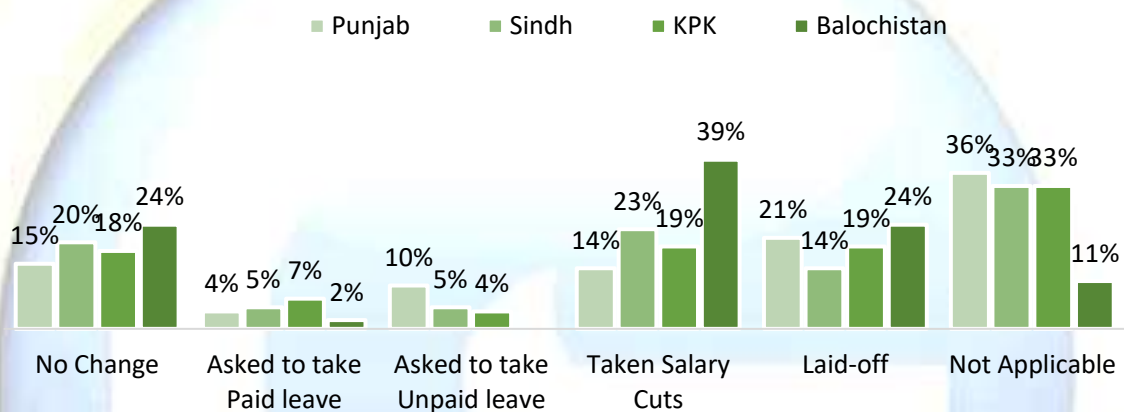
Question: “How has the COVID-19 situation impacted your income?”



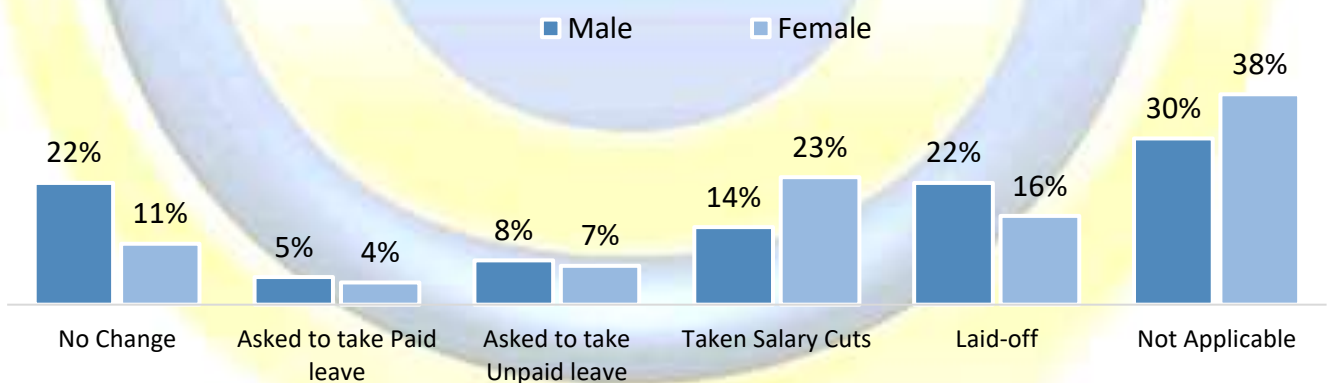
Urban-Rural

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out through telephonic interviews among a sample of 1,050 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during June 04 – June 13, 2020 as a part of Gallup Pakistan Coronavirus Attitude Tracker Survey 2020, Wave 6. The error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 3 percent at the 95% confidence level.
