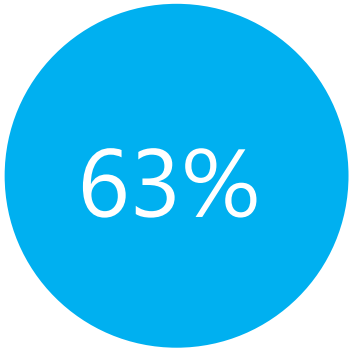

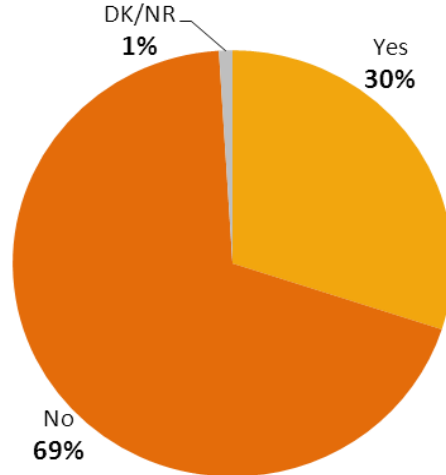

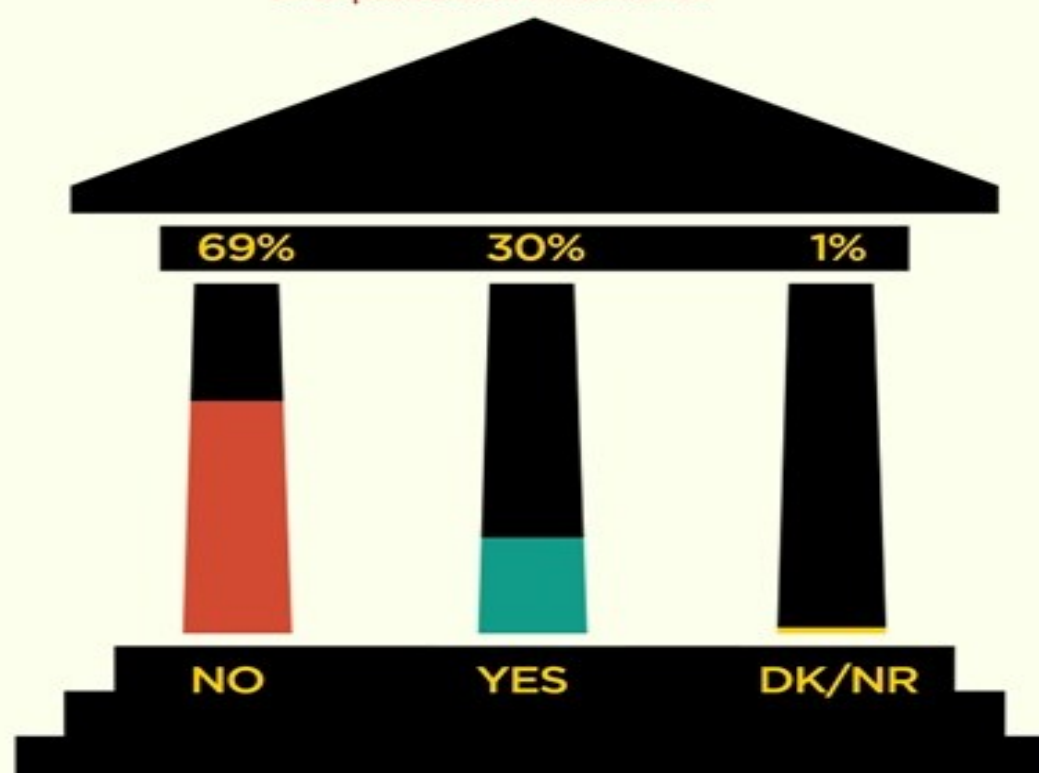

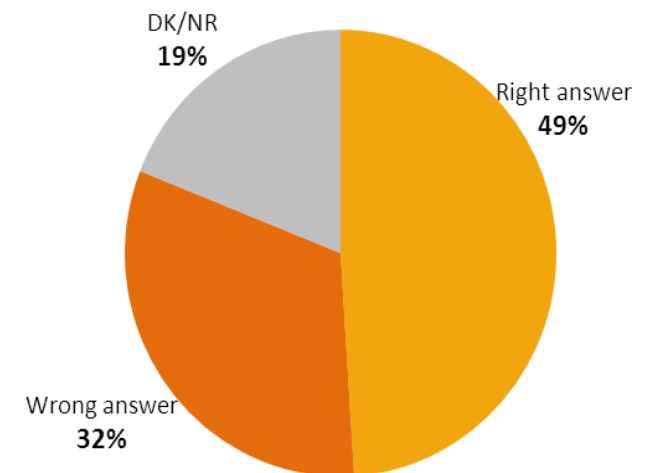

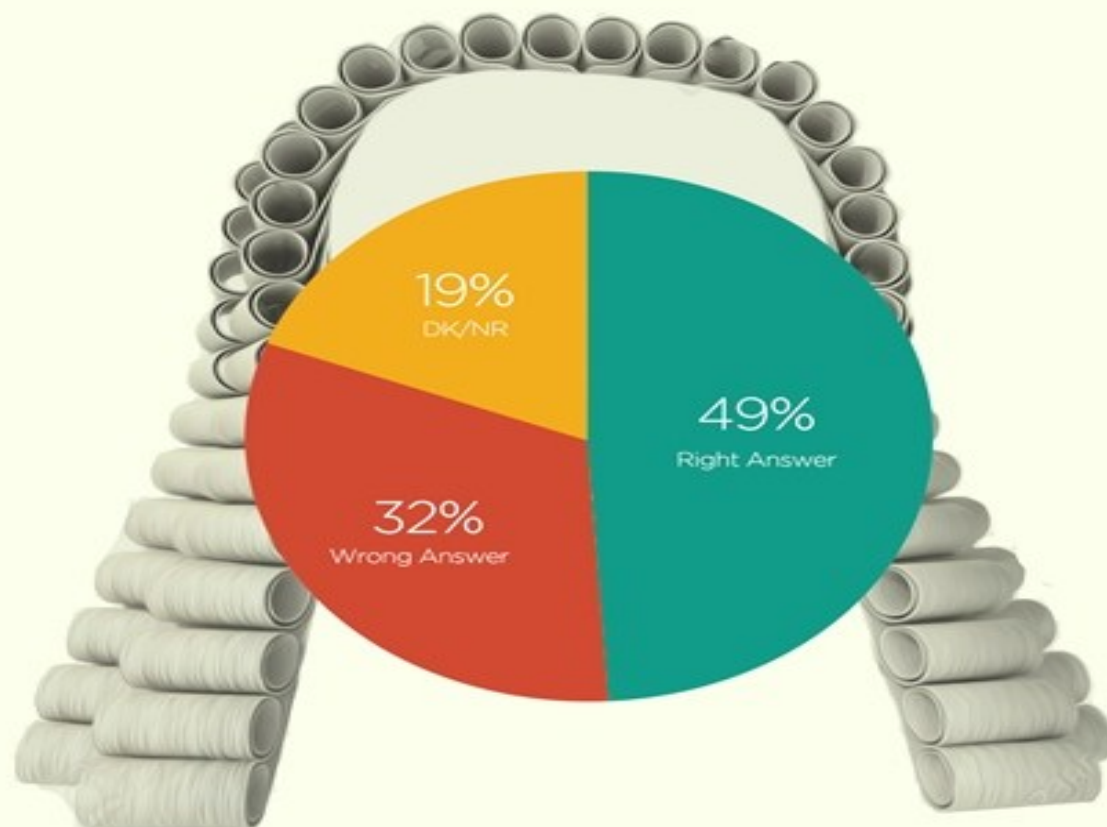

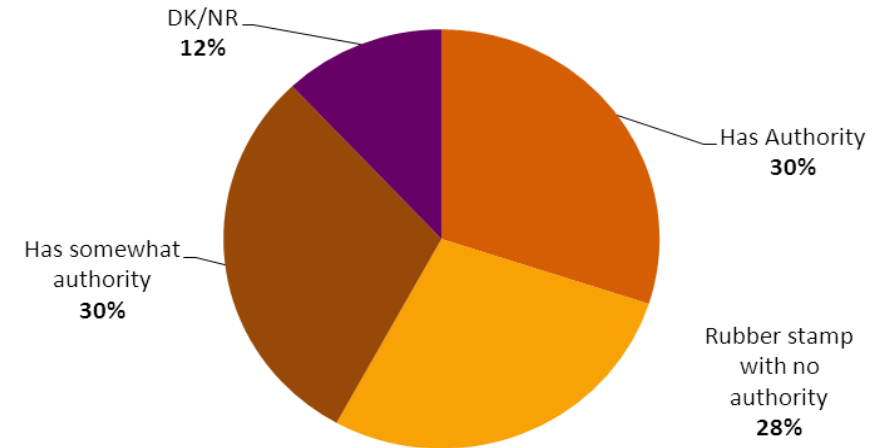

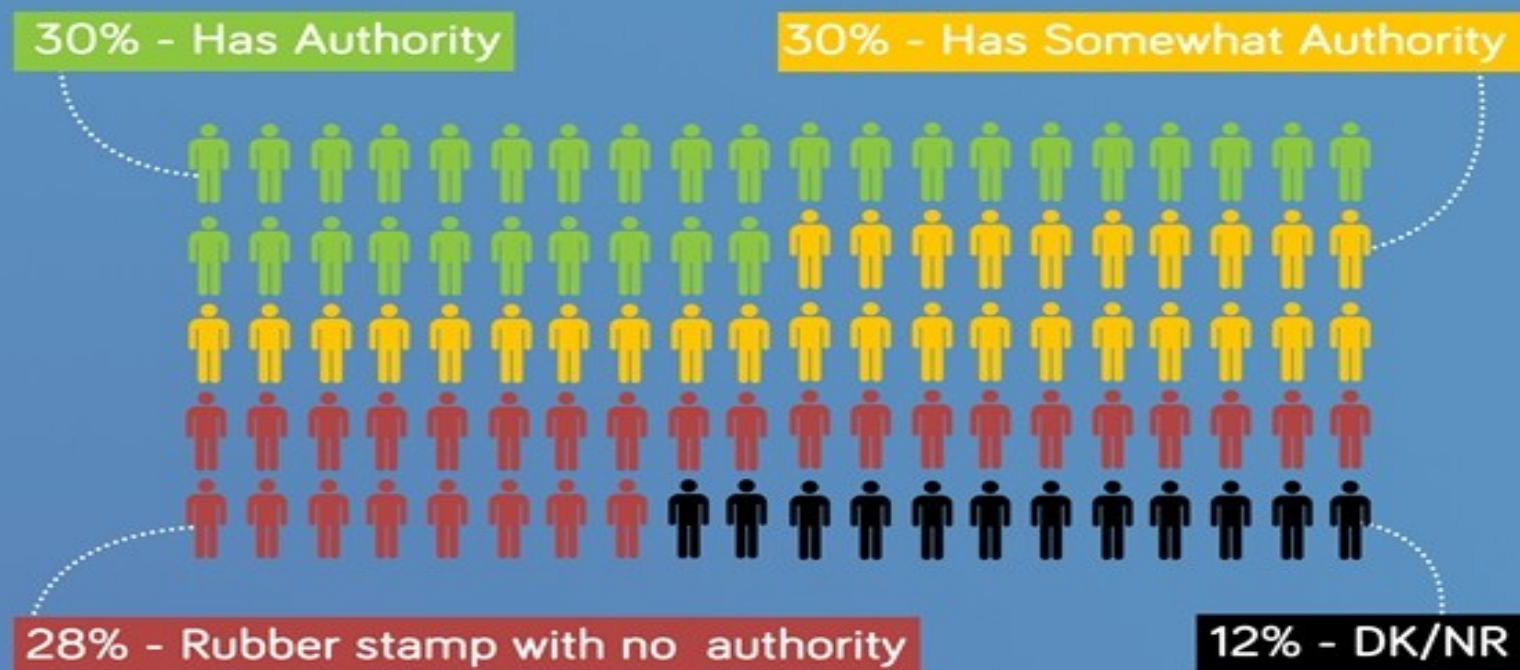

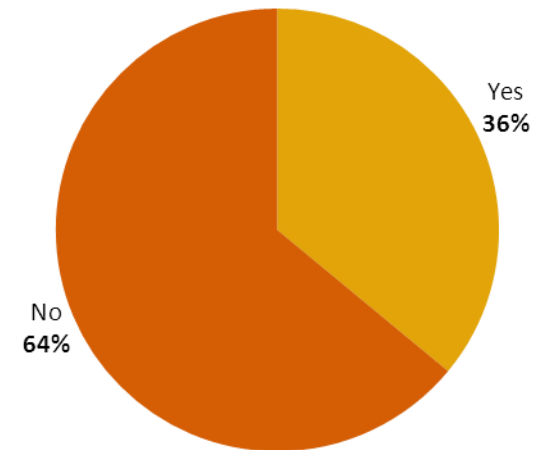

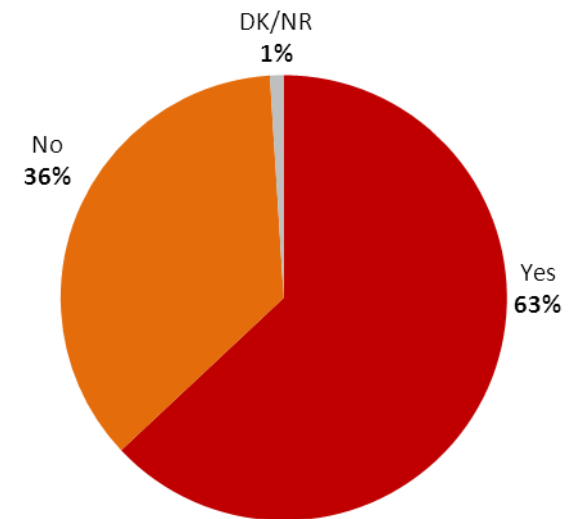

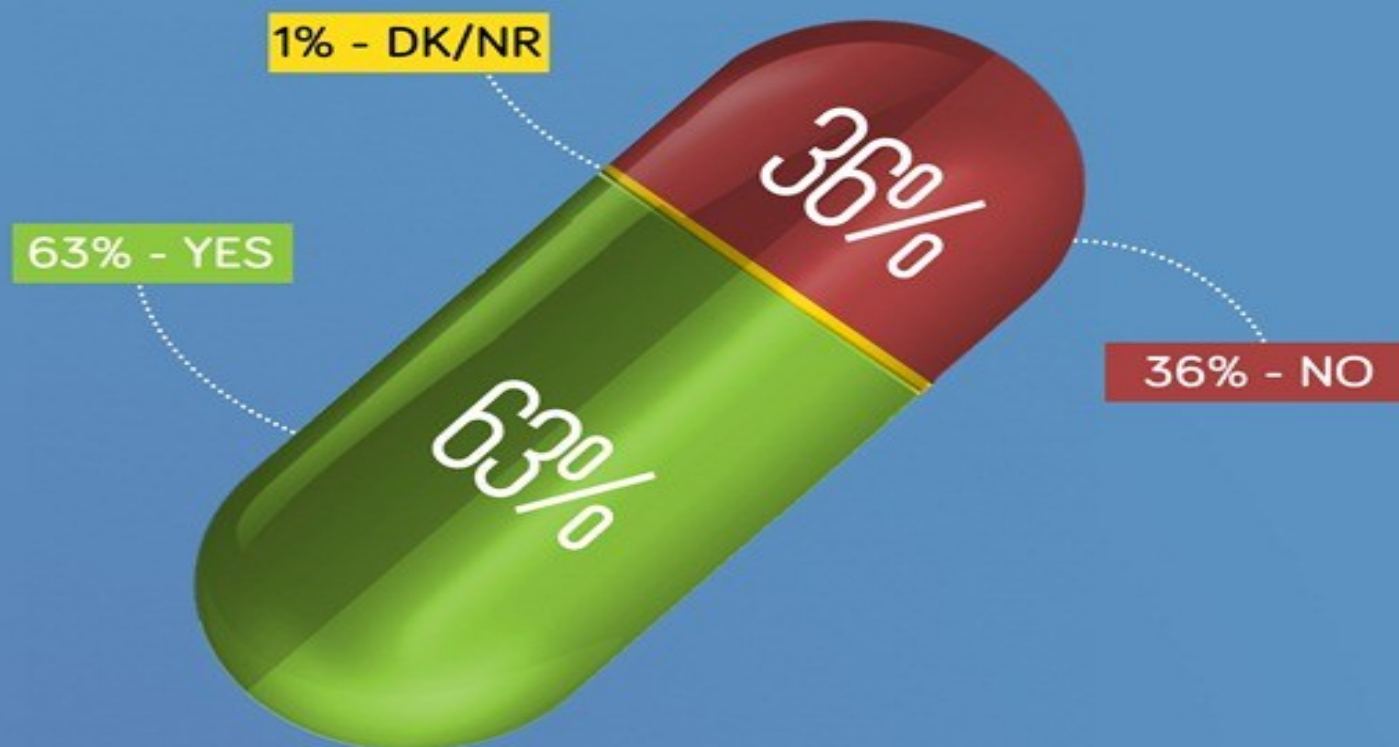
A nationally representative sample of adult men and women who have taken antibiotics from across the four provinces was asked, “Do you ever forget to take your antibiotic medication when you were completing the antibiotic course?” In response to this question, 63% respondents claimed that they do forget to take medication while 36% said that they do not, 1% respondent did not respond.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 682 men and women in rural and urban areas of all four provinces of the country, during May 18 – May 25, 2015. Error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ per cent at 95% confidence level.
