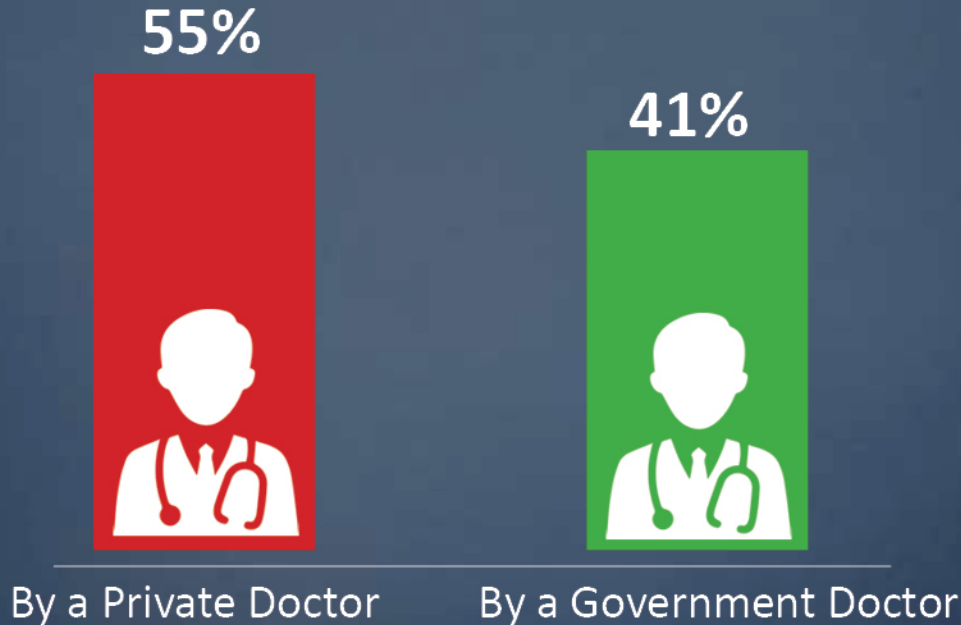

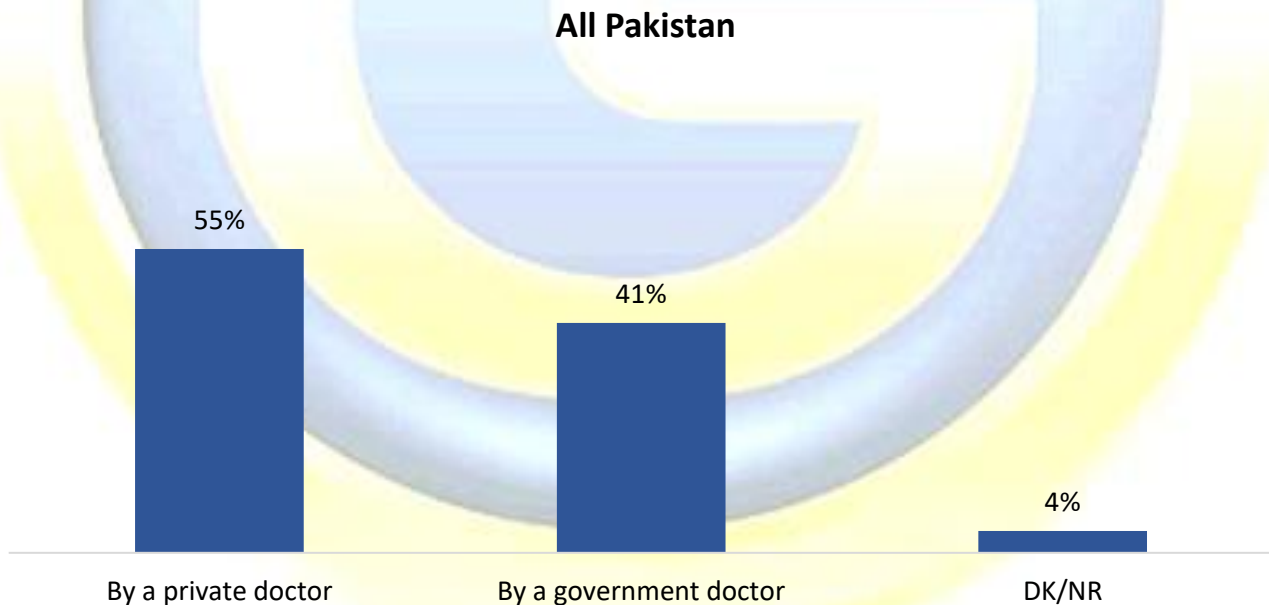

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 55% of Pakistanis utilized the services of a private doctor for their last consultation.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, *“In reference to your last examination by the doctor, please tell us whether you had the examination done by a private doctor or a government doctor?”* In response to this question, 55% said they were examined by a private doctor and 41% said they were examined by a government doctor. 4% didn’t know or gave no response.

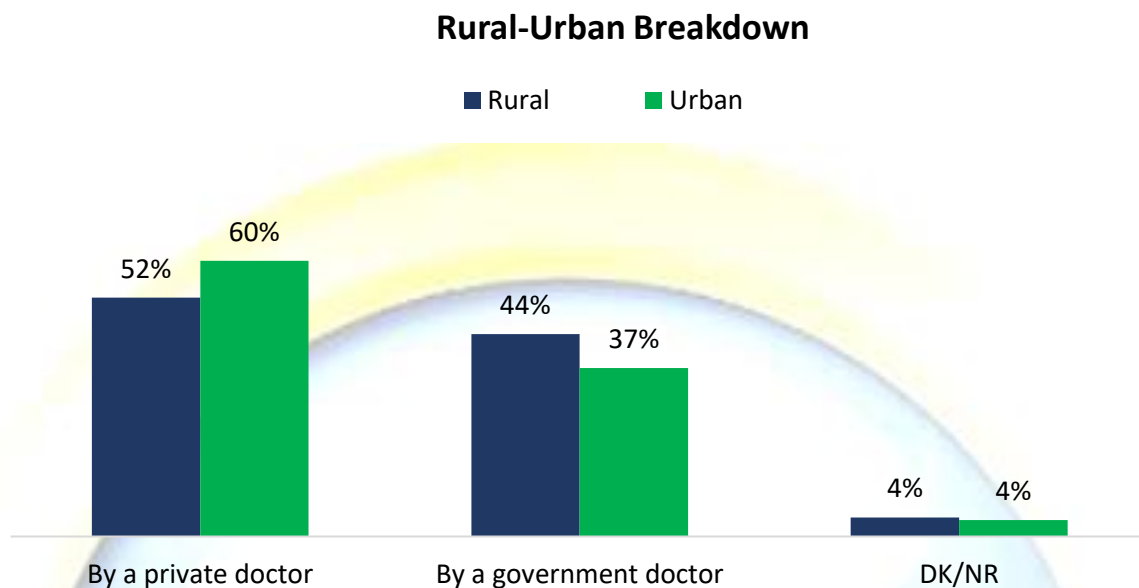
Question: “In reference to your last examination by the doctor, please tell us whether you had the examination done by a private doctor or a government doctor?”

More people from the urban areas (60%) as compared to rural areas (52%) said they relied on the services of a private doctor for their last medical consultation.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1440 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, from December 22, 2021 - January 15, 2022. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was CATI.
