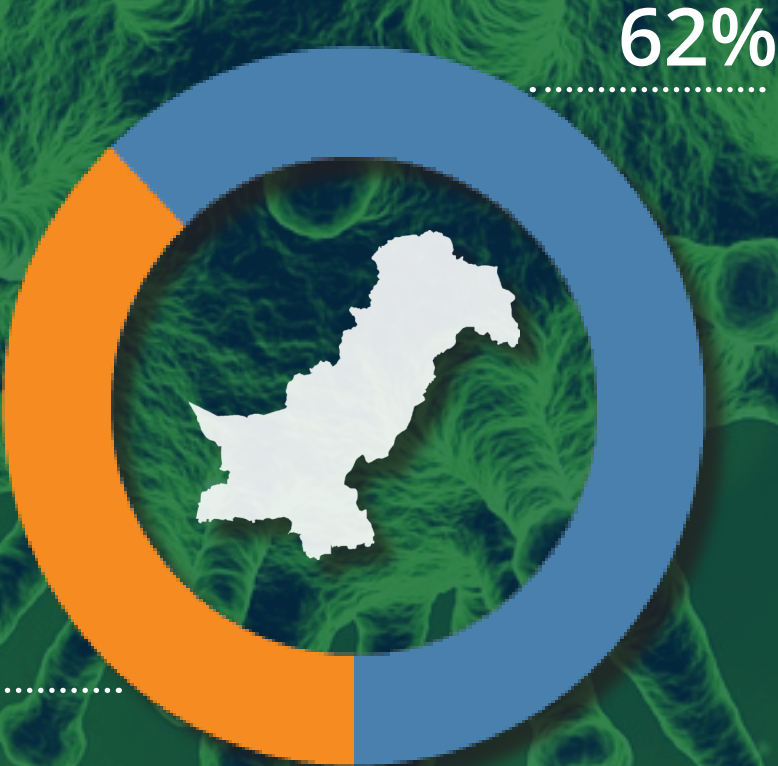


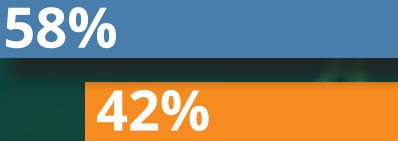

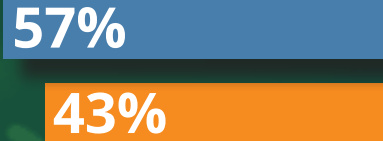

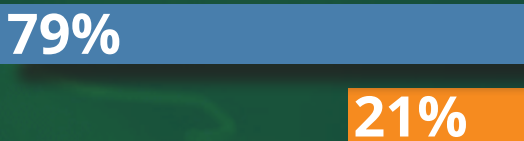

Opinion Poll CORONAVIRUS

Since March, over 3 in 5 Pakistanis continue to believe that the threat of coronavirus is exaggerated (Gallup & Gilani Pakistan Weekly Coronavirus Perception Tracker)

Islamabad, April 28, 2020

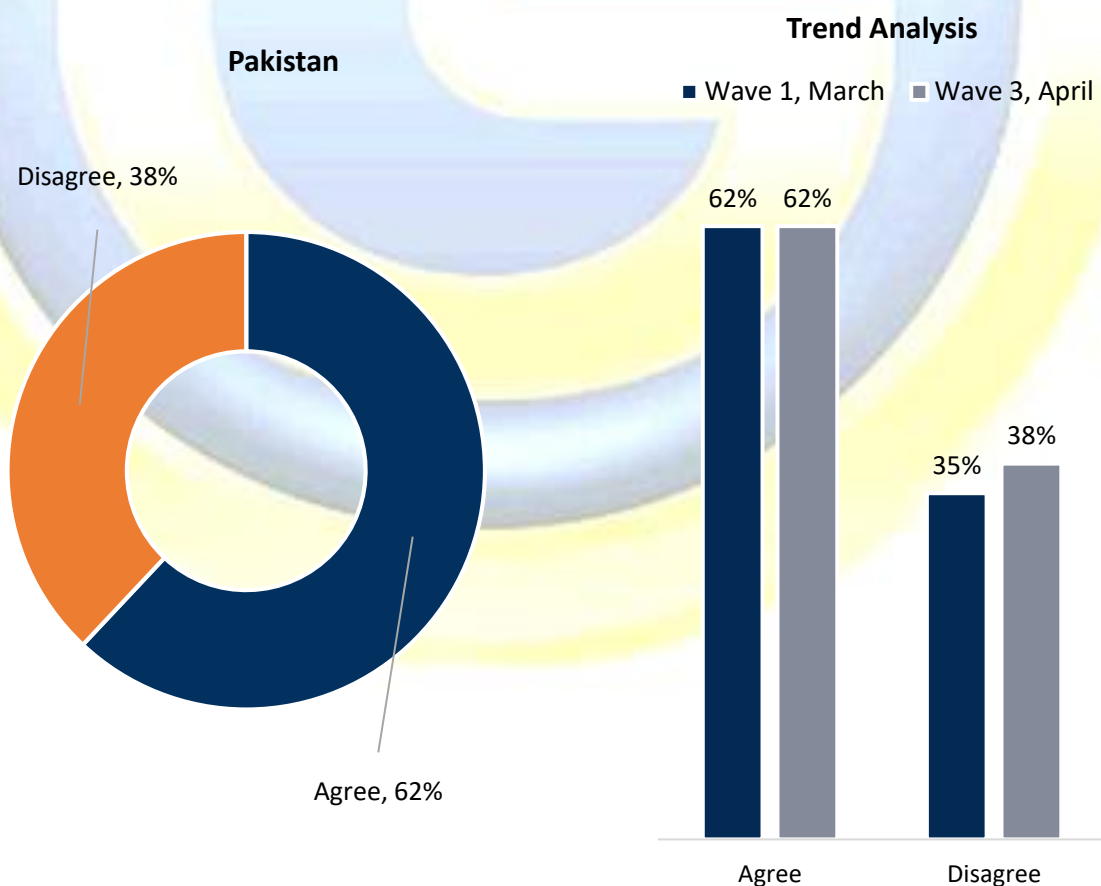
According to a Gilani Research Foundation Survey carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, since March, 3 in 5 Pakistanis continue to believe that the threat of coronavirus is exaggerated.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, *“To what extent do you agree/disagree that the threat of Coronavirus is being exaggerated?”* In response to this question, 62% agreed that the threat is exaggerated while 38% disagree.

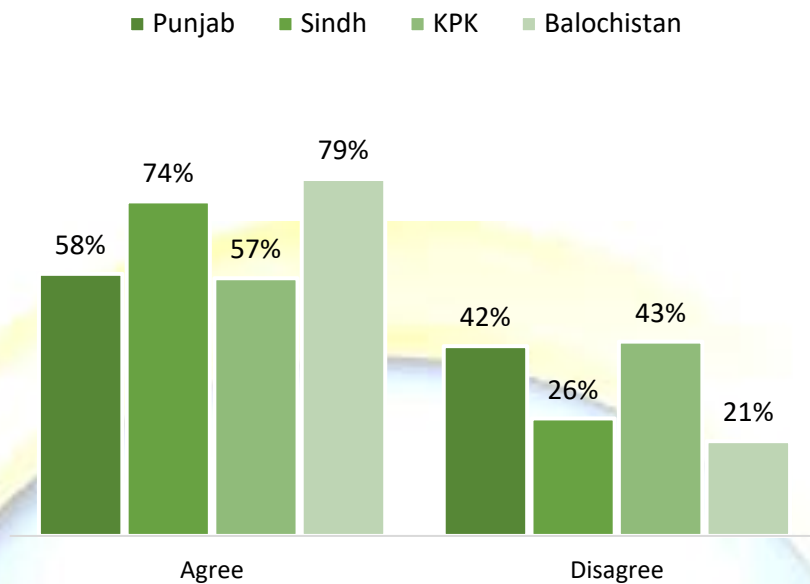
Provincial Breakdown: Nearly 3 in 4 respondents from Sindh and Balochistan believe that the threat is exaggerated

Out of the total respondents, 58% from Punjab, 74% from Sindh, 57% from KP and 79% from Balochistan believe that the threat from coronavirus is exaggerated.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out through telephonic interviews among a sample of 1,014 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during April 04 – April 10, 2020 as a part of Gallup Pakistan Coronavirus Attitude Tracker Survey 2020, Wave 3. The error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 3 percent at the 95% confidence level.
