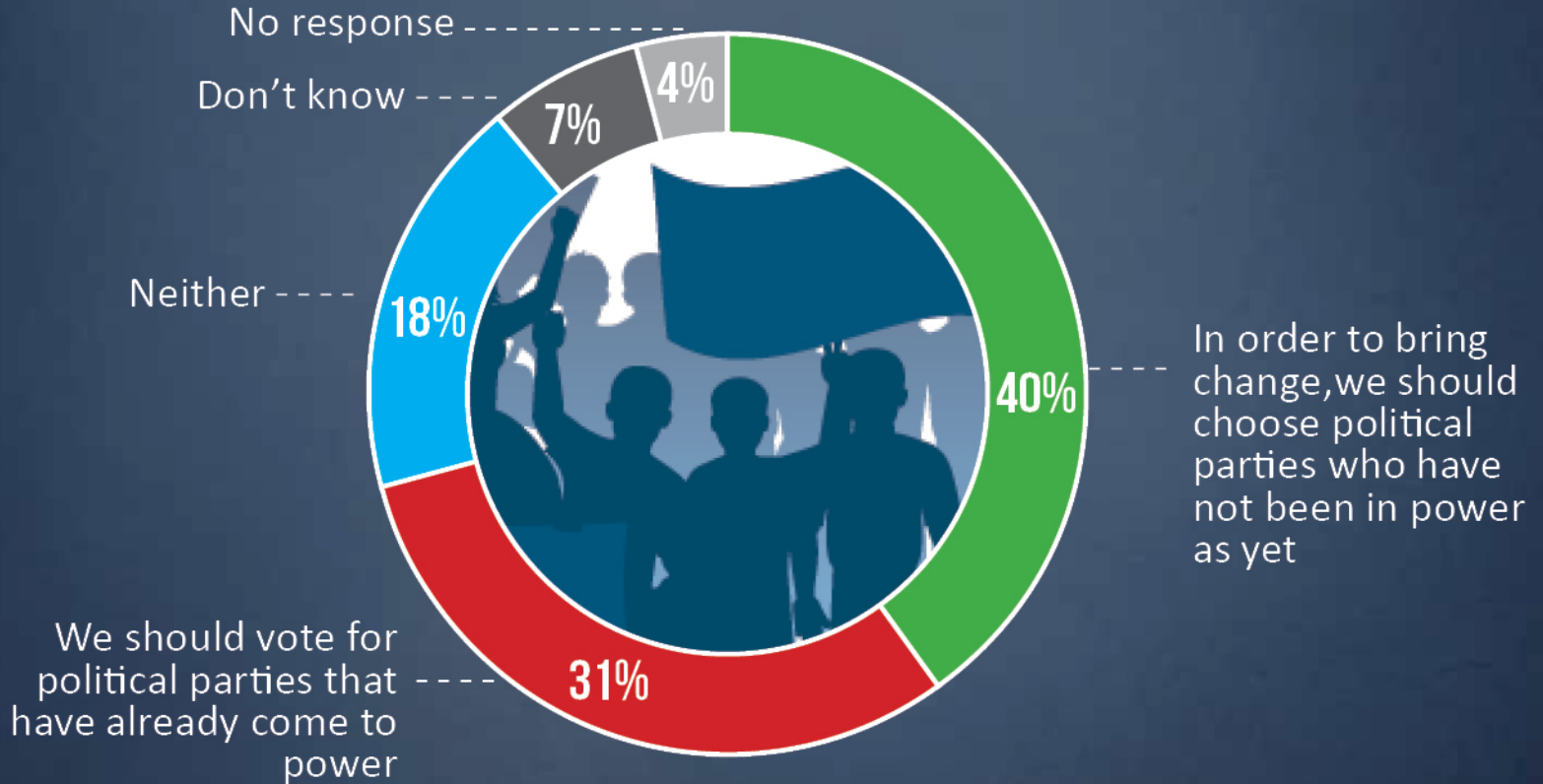

## Opinion Poll General Political Opinions

### **2 in 5 (40%) Pakistanis feel that in order to bring change, we should choose political parties who have not been in power yet: Gallup & Gilani Pakistan**

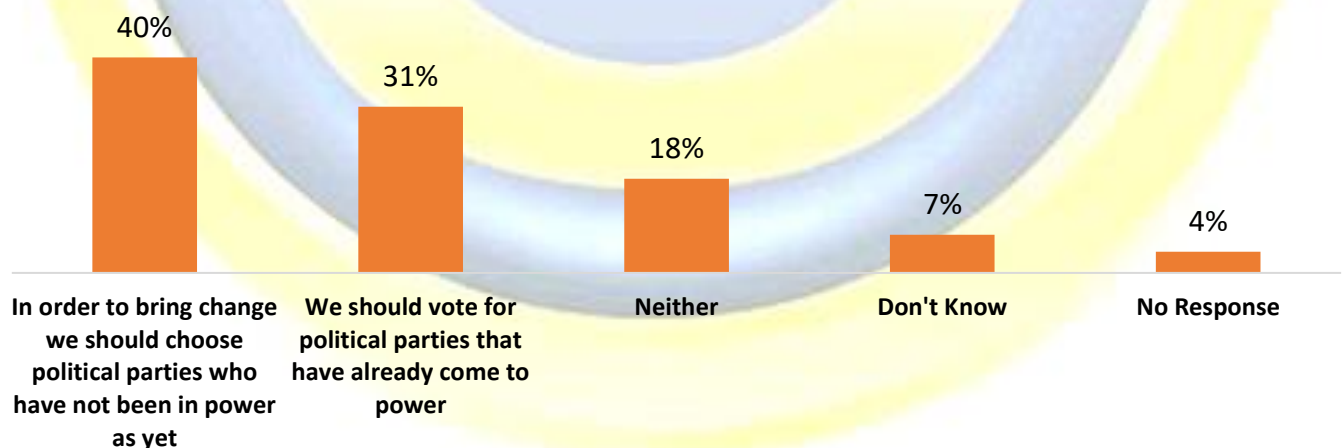

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 2 in 5 (40%) Pakistanis feel that in order to bring change, we should choose political parties who have not been in power yet.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, “Which of the following statement represents your opinion best (In order to bring change we should choose political parties who have not been in power as yet, We should vote for political parties that have already come to power, Neither)?” In response to this question, 40% said in order to bring change we should choose political parties who have not been in power as yet, 31% said we should vote for political parties that have already come to power, 18% said neither and 7% said don’t know. 4% provided no response.

**Question: “Which of the following statement represents your opinion best?”**

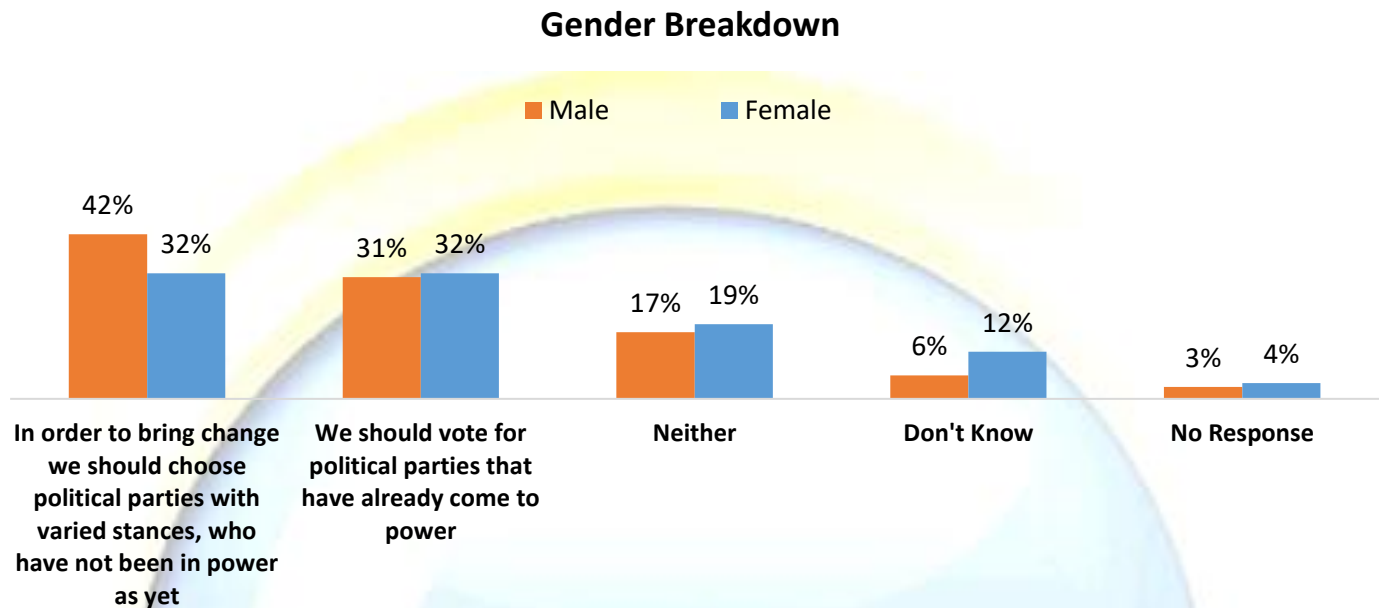

## Gender Breakdown

As compared to females (32%), more males (42%) are of the opinion that in order to bring change we should choose political parties with varied stances, who have not been in power as yet.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1730 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during September 23, 2021 – October 8, 2021. The error margin is estimated to be approximately  $\pm 2$ -3 percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was CATI.
