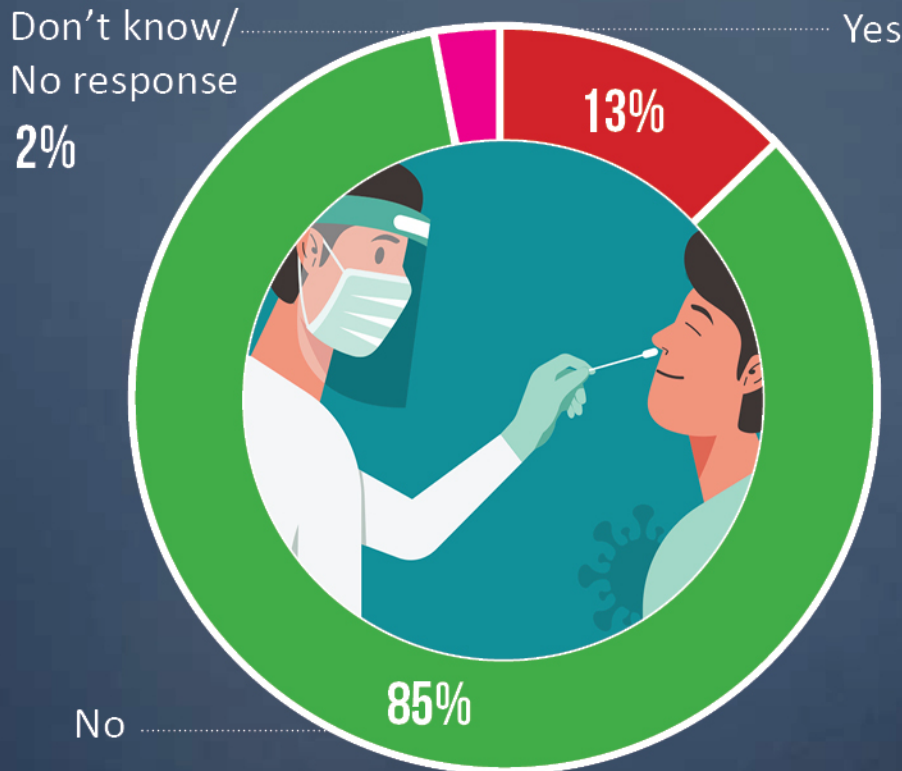

13% of Pakistanis know someone from their social circle who got COVID-19 again after being vaccinated against it: Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

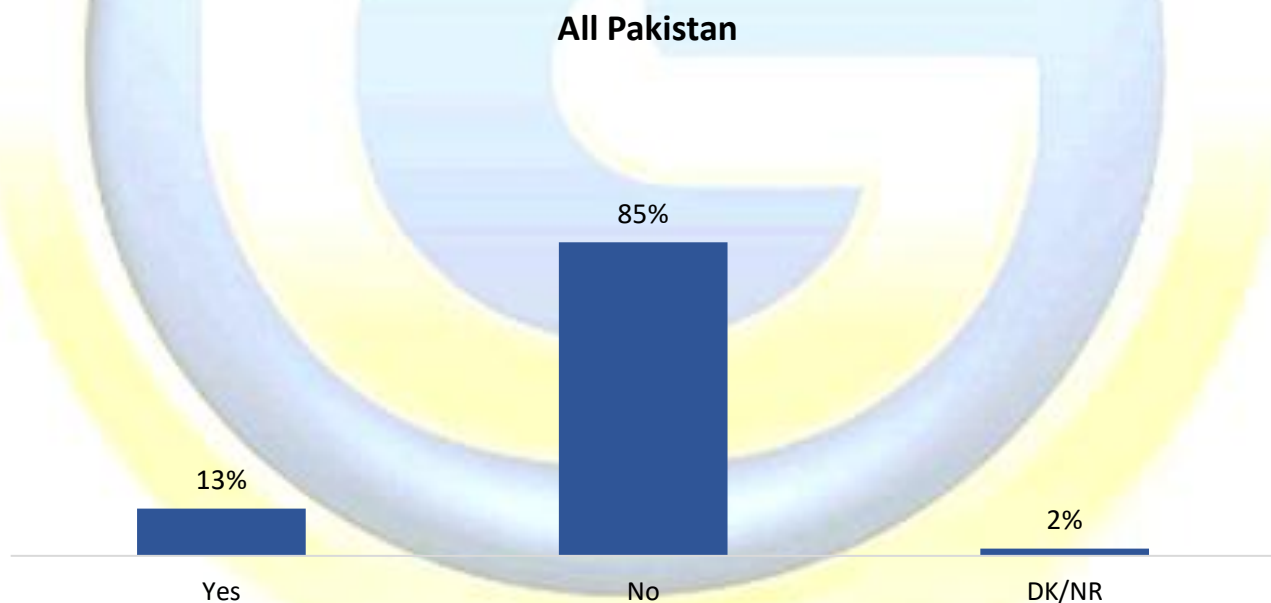

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 13% of Pakistanis know someone from their social circle who got COVID-19 again after being vaccinated against it.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, “Do you know anyone from your social circle or people that you meet who...? - Has been vaccinated against COVID-19 and got infected with Coronavirus again” In response to this question, 13% said yes, 85% said no and 2% didn’t know or gave no response.

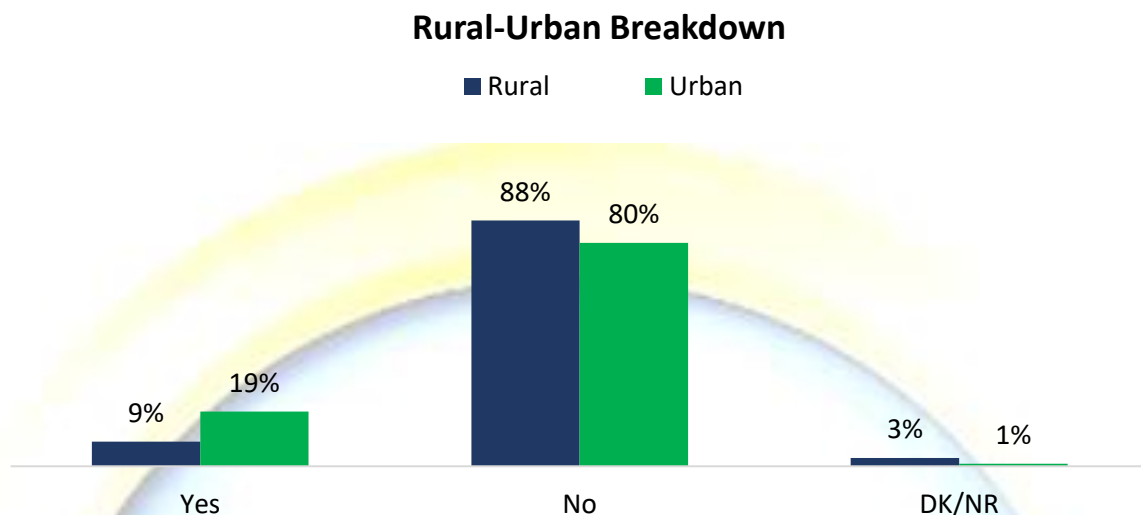
Question: “Do you know anyone from your social circle or people that you meet who...? - Has been vaccinated against COVID-19 and got infected with Coronavirus again”

Rural-Urban Breakdown

More people from urban areas (19%) as compared to those from rural areas (9%) know someone who got infected with COVID-19 again after being vaccinated.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1865 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, from December 22, 2021 - January 15, 2022. The error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 2 -3 percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was CATI.
