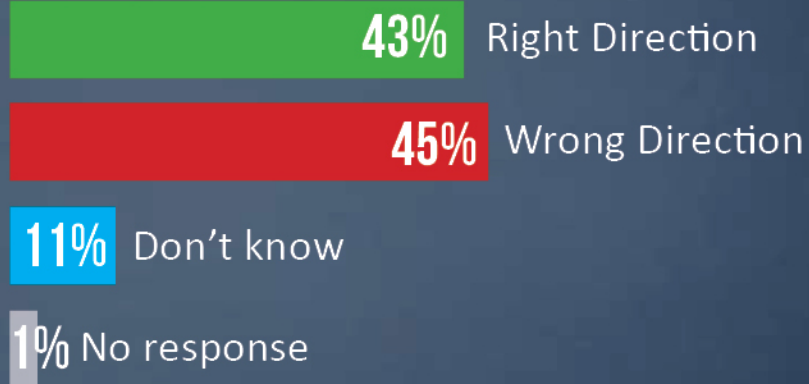

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, almost half (45%) Pakistanis believe the country is moving in the wrong direction; the figure is almost stable throughout PTI government's tenure with youngsters more like to say the country is moving in the right direction.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, *"Do you think our country is moving in the right direction or in the wrong direction?"* In response to this question, 43% said the right direction, 45% said the wrong direction, 11% said don't know and 1% gave no response.

Question: "Do you think our country is moving in the right direction or in the wrong direction?"

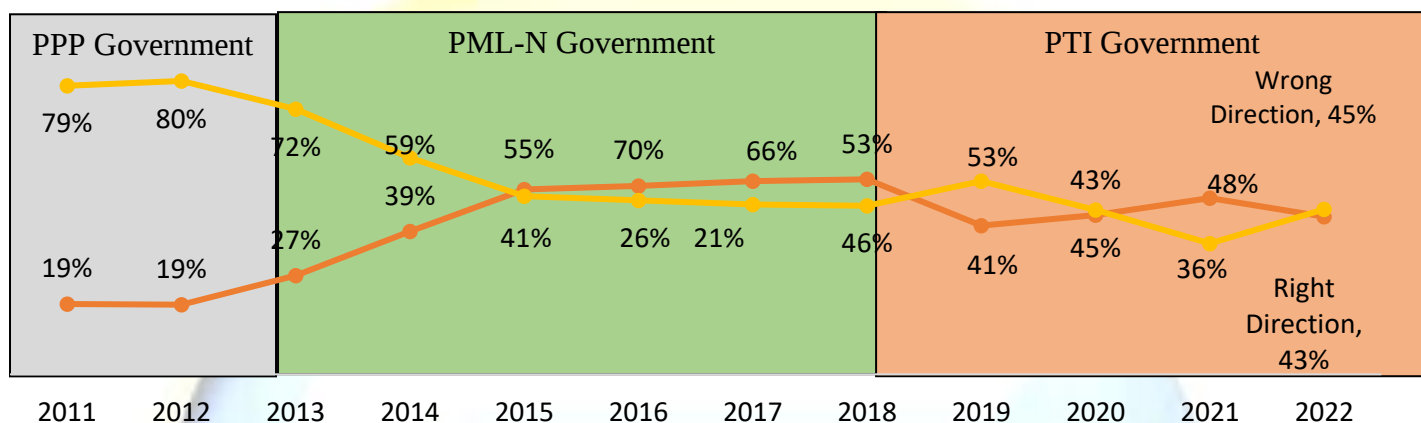

Trend Analysis

Over the years, confidence in the direction of the country has increased; it has moved from 79% of the population thinking the country was headed in the wrong direction in 2011 to 45% in 2022.

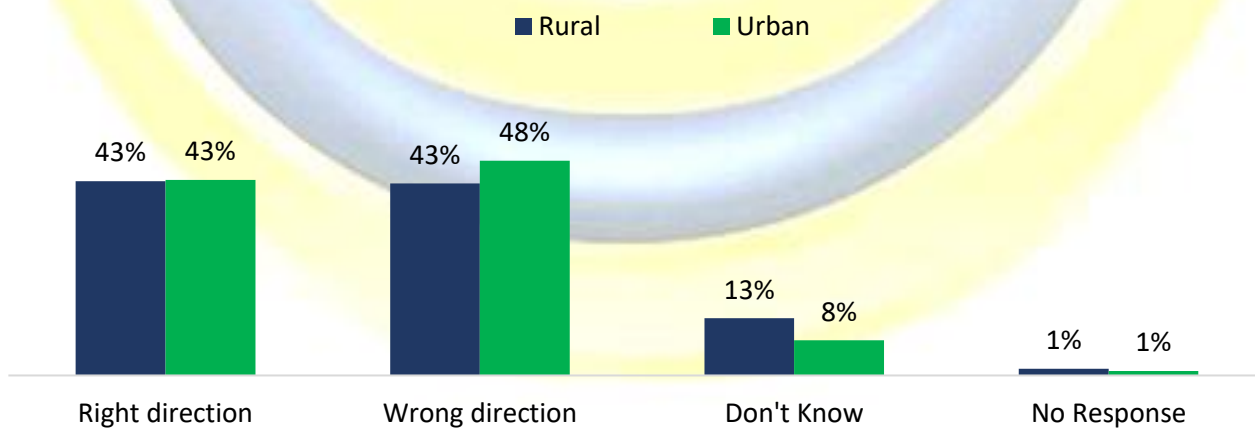

More urban residents (48%) in comparison to rural residents (43%) believe the country to be going in the wrong direction.

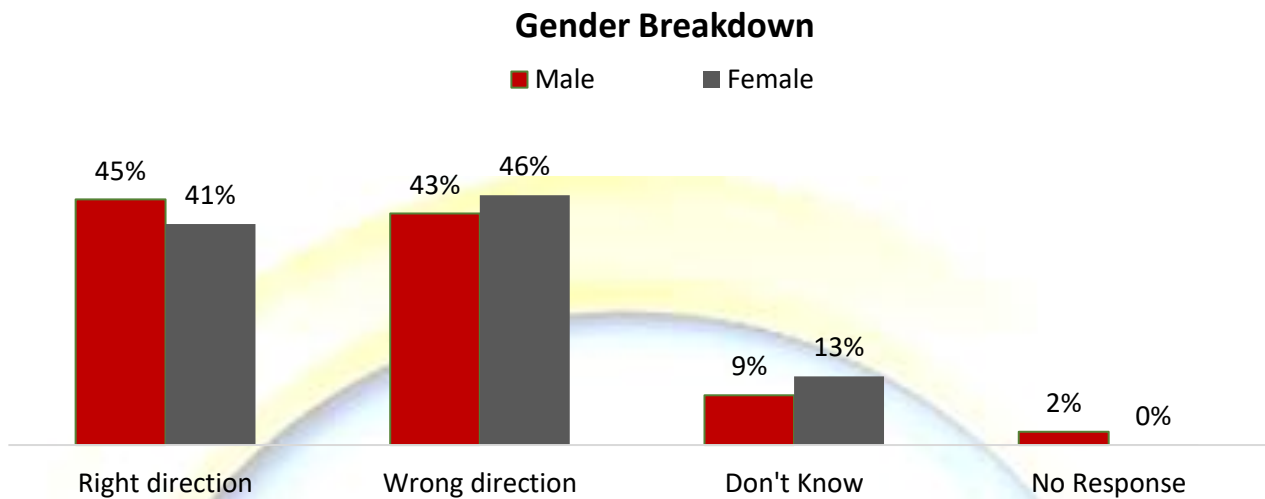
Rural-Urban Breakdown

Gender Breakdown

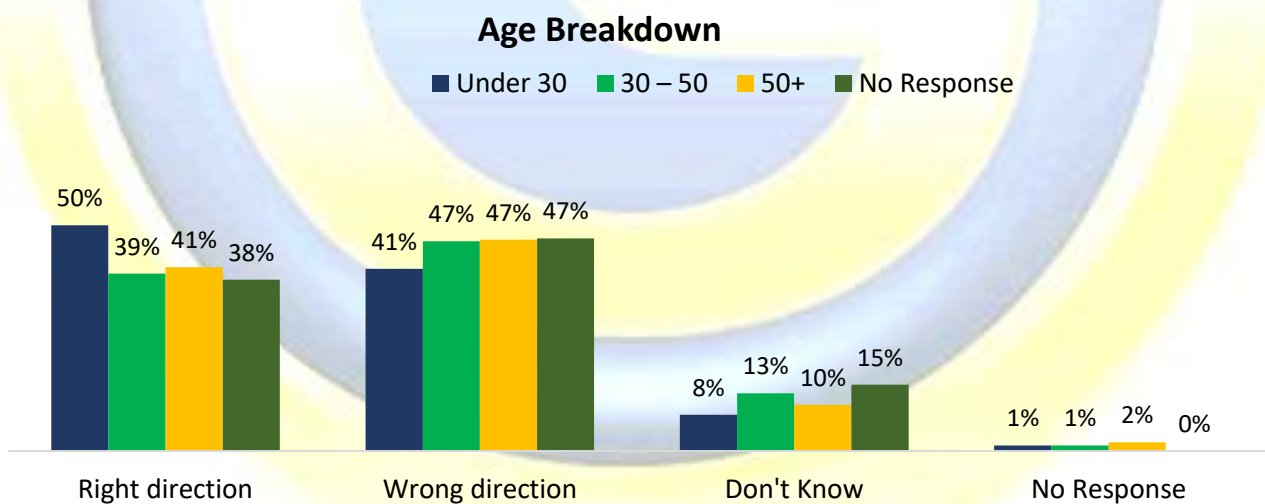
More females (46%) as compared to males (43%) believe the country is headed in the wrong direction.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1865 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, from December 22, 2021 - January 15, 2022. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was CATI.
