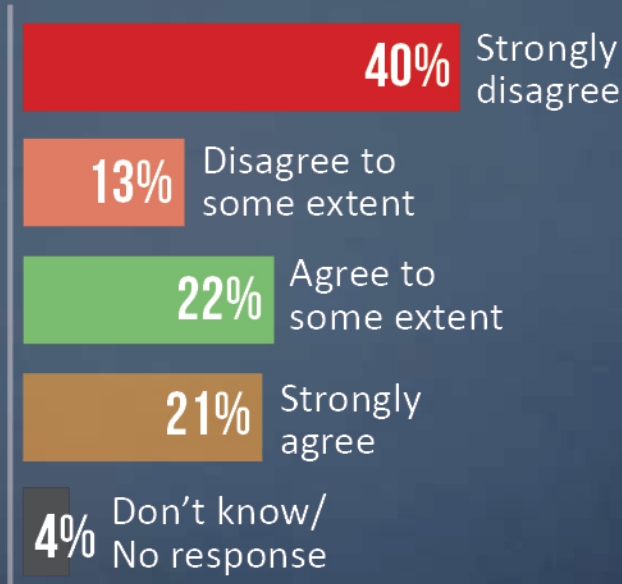

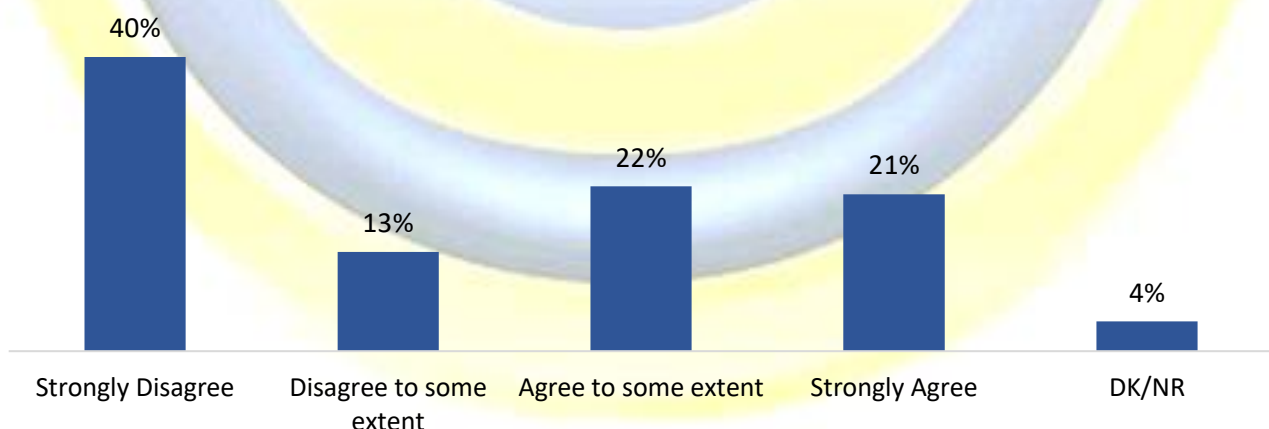
According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, while 59% in August 2021 were afraid that they or someone in their family would be infected by COVID-19, this number has fallen to 43% in Wave 13 of Gallup Covid Tracker polled in January 2022.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, “Please tell us to what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statements? - I fear that I or someone in my family can possibly be infected with the Coronavirus” In response to this question, 40% said strongly disagree, 13% said disagree to some extent, 22% said agree to some extent, 21% said strongly agree, 4% didn’t know or gave no response.

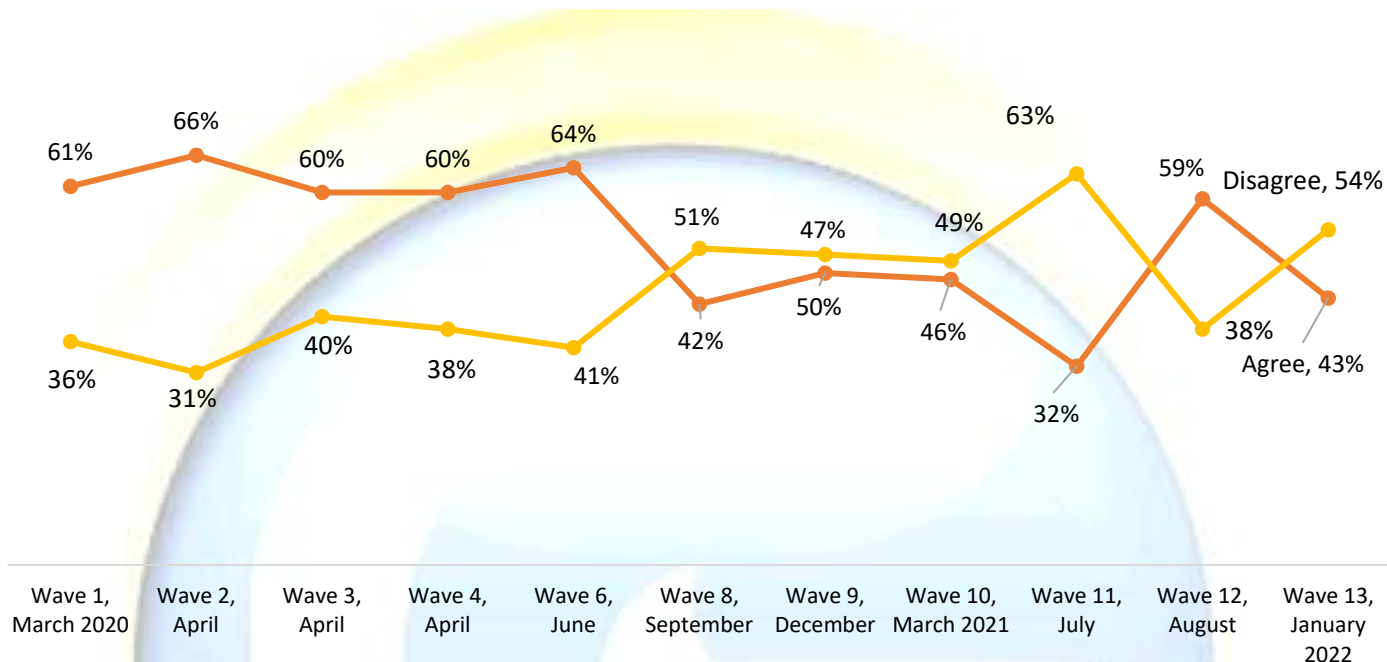

While 59% in August were afraid that they or someone in their family would be infected by COVID-19, this number has fallen to 43% in Wave 13 of Gallup Covid Tracker.

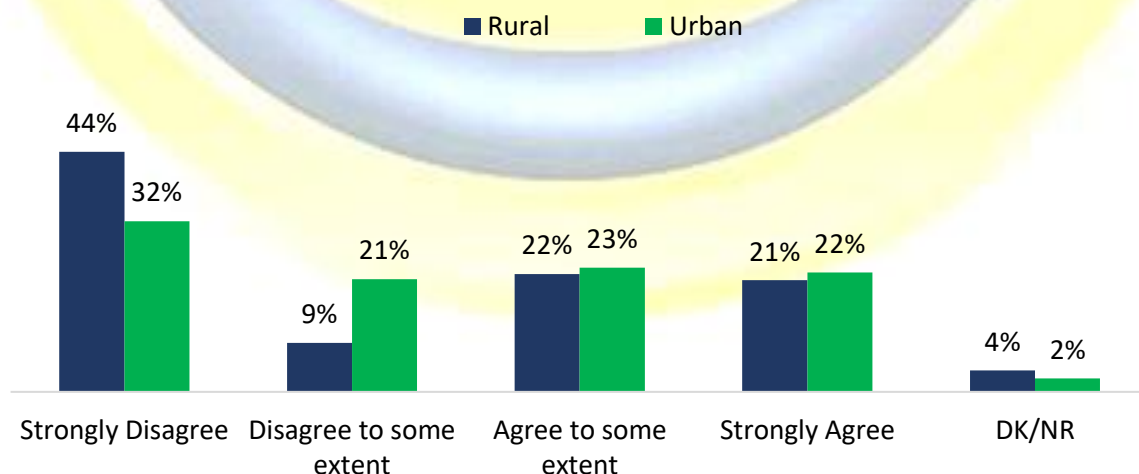
Trend Analysis



Rural-Urban Breakdown

44% of rural residents as compared to 32% of urban residents claim that they do not fear that they or someone in their family can possibly be infected with the Coronavirus.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1865 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, from December 22, 2021 - January 15, 2022. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was CATI.
