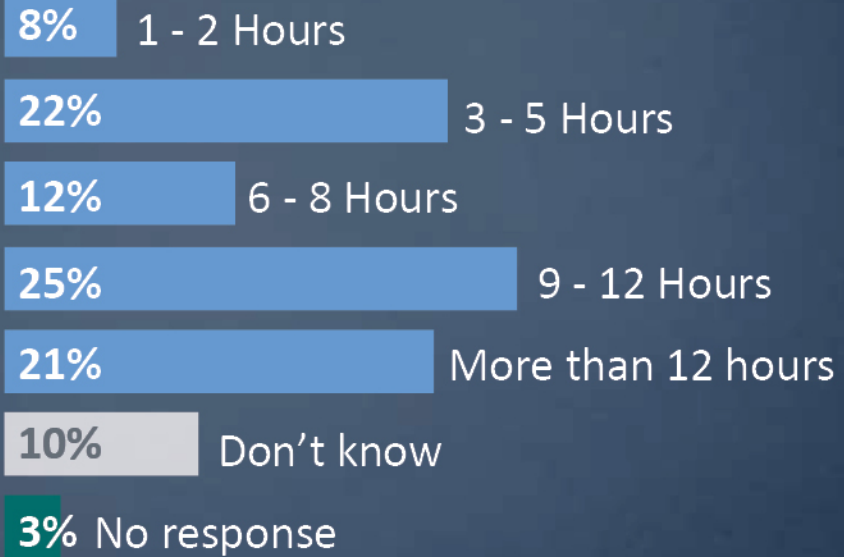

Amongst those who experienced gas load shedding, nearly 50 % Pakistanis had no gas for more than half of the day: Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

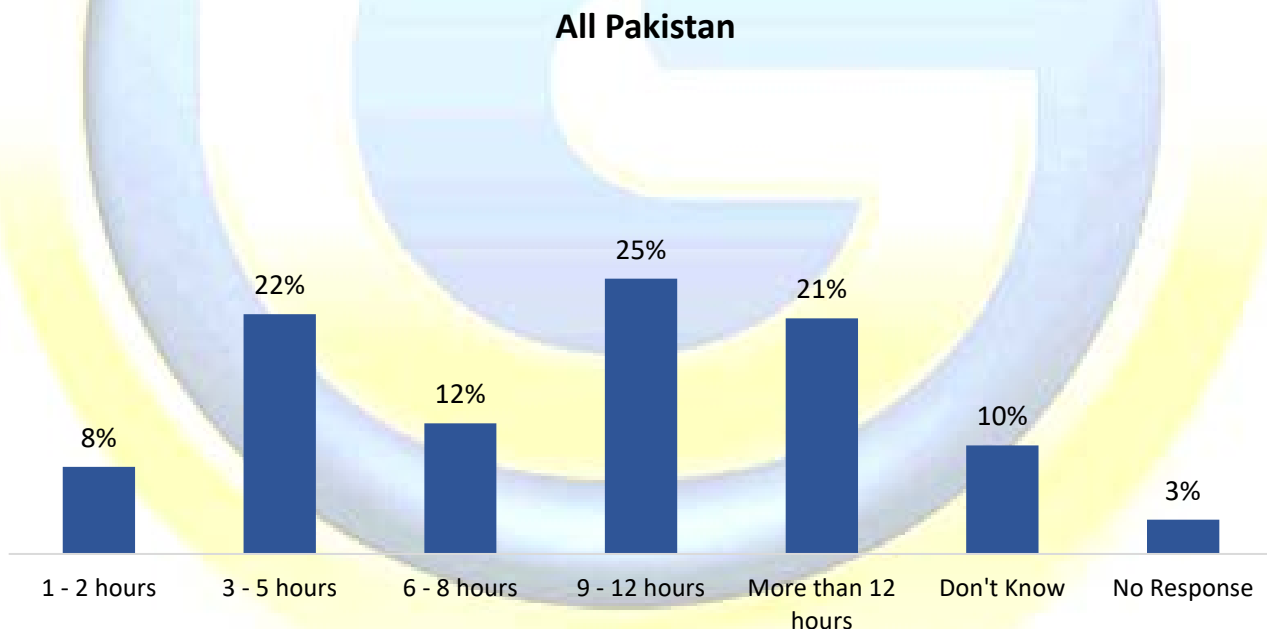
In our yesterday's release available [here](#), 50% Pakistanis claimed that they had experienced gas load-shedding the previous day, with the response being more common in urban areas.

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, among those who experienced gas load shedding the previous day, nearly 50% Pakistanis had no gas for more than half of the day.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, "What was the duration of gas load-shedding in your area yesterday?" In response to this question, 8% said 1-2 hours, 22% said 3-5 hours, 12% said 6-8 hours, 25% said 9-12 hours, 21% said more than 12 hours, 10% didn't know and 3% gave no response.

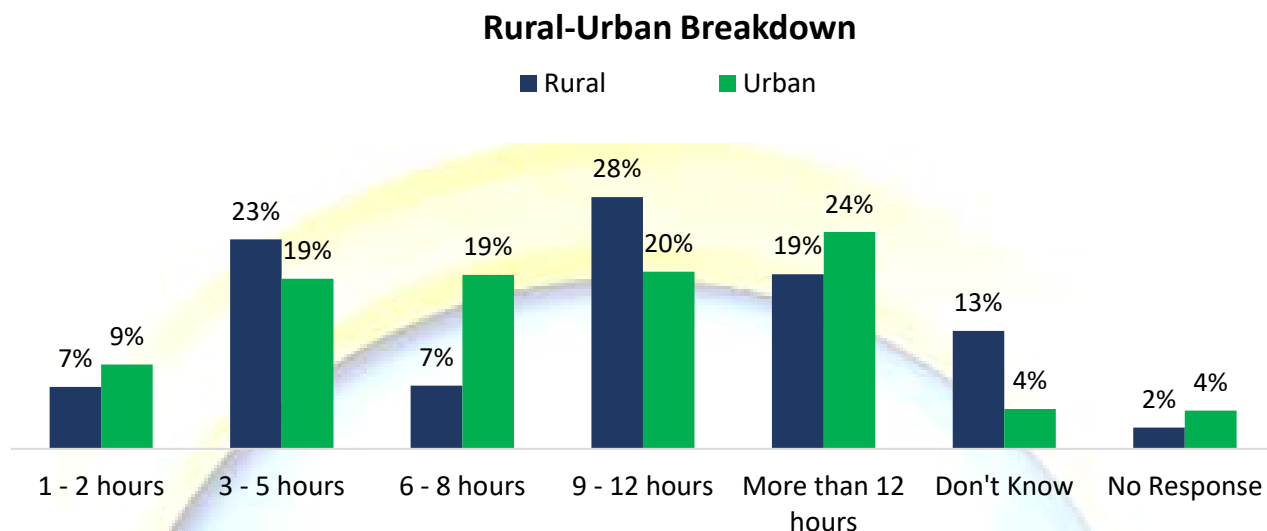
Question: "What was the duration of gas load-shedding in your area yesterday?"

Rural-Urban Breakdown

Gas load-shedding was more common in rural areas (28%) in comparison to urban areas (20%) for people who said they experienced 9 to 12 hours of load-shedding in their area the previous day.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1865 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, from December 22, 2021 - January 15, 2022. The error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 2 -3 percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was CATI.
