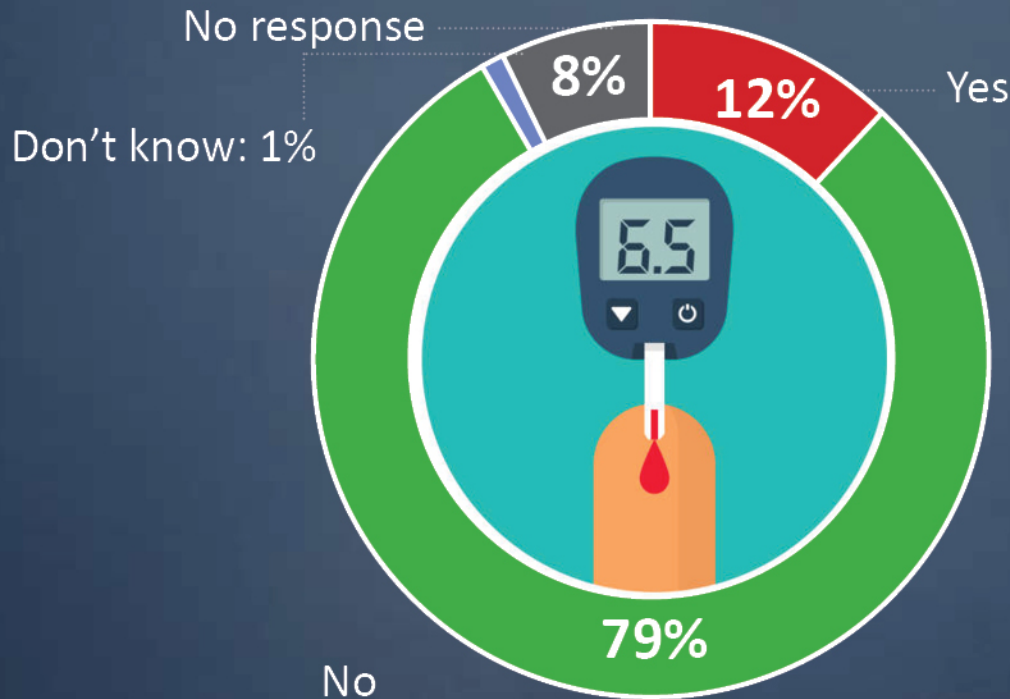

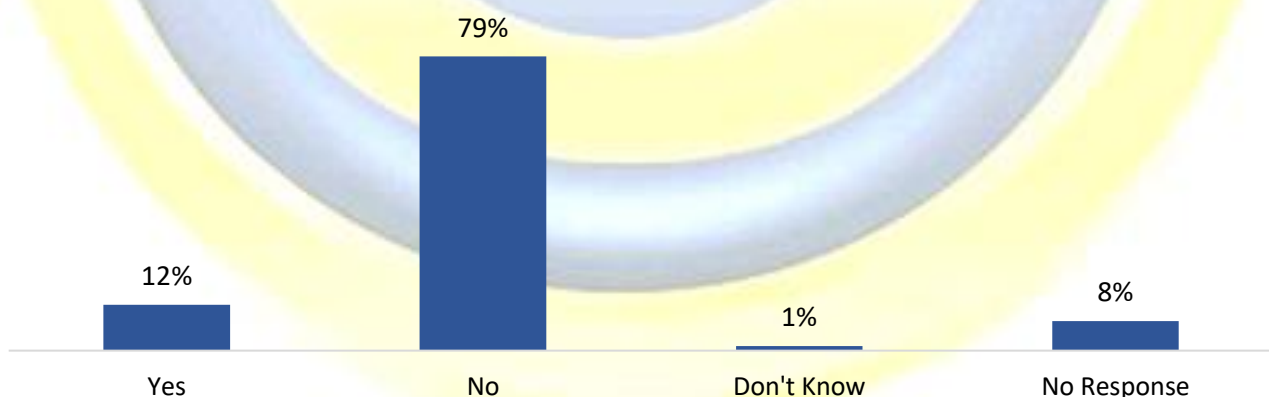

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, nearly 1 in 10 (12%) Pakistani households report that someone in their household suffers from sugar/diabetes; this response is more common in females (14%) as compared to males (11%).

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, “Please tell us, God forbid, whether you or anyone in your household is suffering from the following diseases? - Sugar/diabetes? (Please give only one answer)?” In response to this question, 12% said yes, 79% said no, 1% didn’t know and 8% gave no response. According to the Pakistan Journal of Medical Sciences, the prevalence of diabetes in Pakistan is 14.62%. However, the actual incidence may be higher because of undiagnosed diabetes.

Question: “Please tell us, God forbid, whether you or anyone in your household is suffering from the following diseases? - Sugar/diabetes”

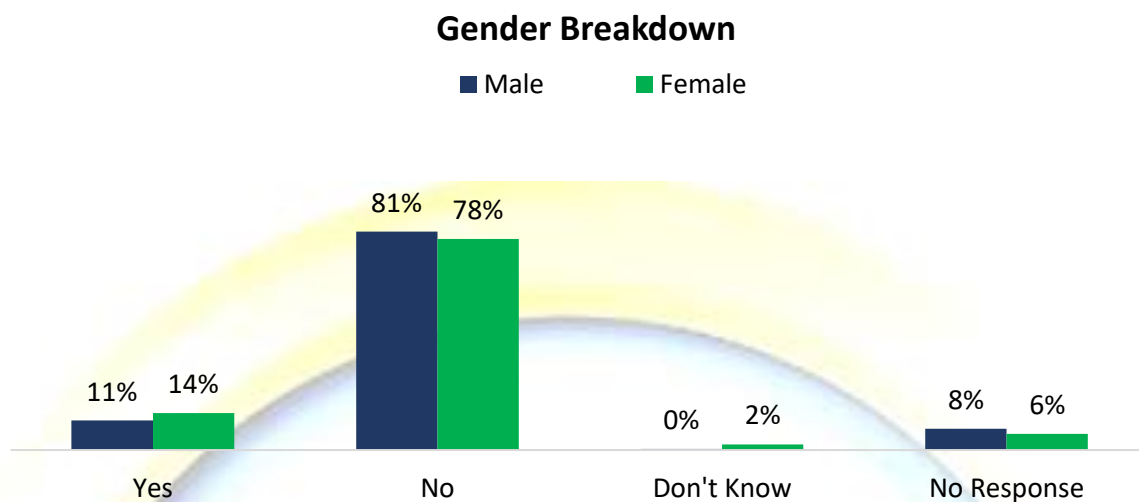

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1865 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, from December 22, 2021 - January 15, 2022. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was CATI.
