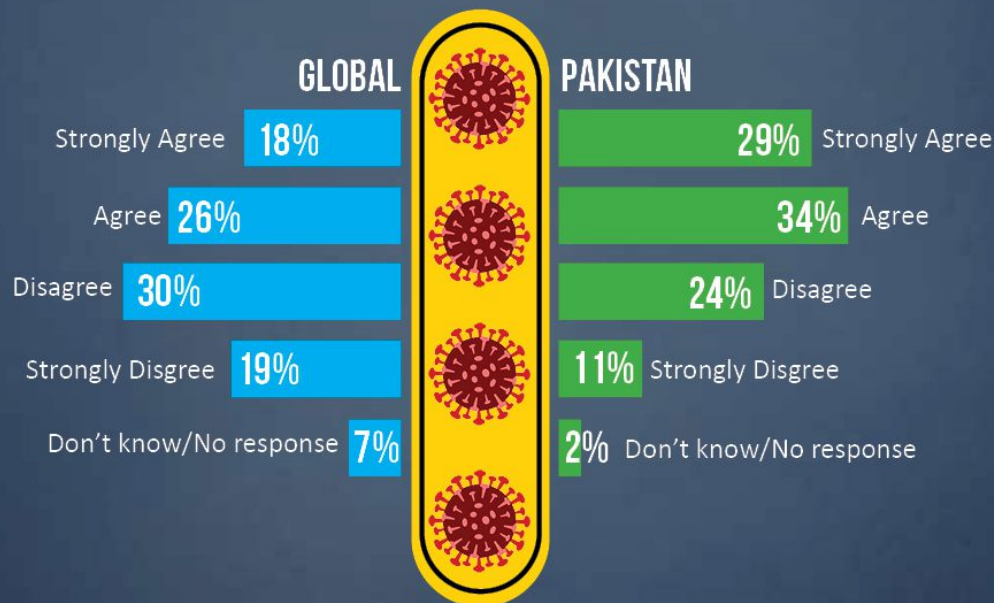

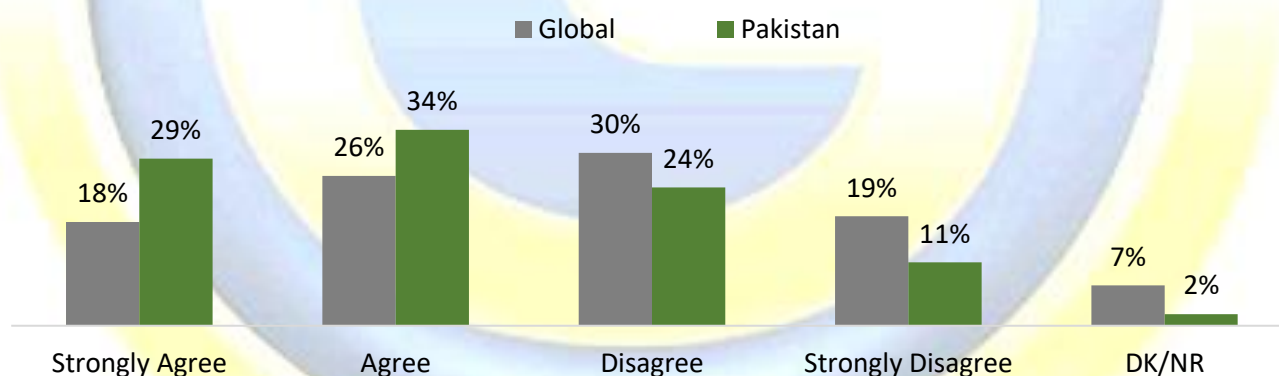
63% of Pakistanis compared to 44% of global respondents believe that the threat from Coronavirus is exaggerated: Gallup International Survey in collaboration with Gallup Pakistan

(Islamabad), March 8, 2022

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 63% of Pakistanis compared to 44% of global respondents believe that the threat from Coronavirus is exaggerated.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, *“Thinking specifically about the Coronavirus (COVID-19) how strongly do you agree or disagree with each of the following statements? - I believe the threat from the Coronavirus is exaggerated.”* In response to this question in Pakistan, 29% said strongly agree, 34% said agree, 24% said disagree, 11% said strongly disagree, and 2% didn’t know or gave no response.

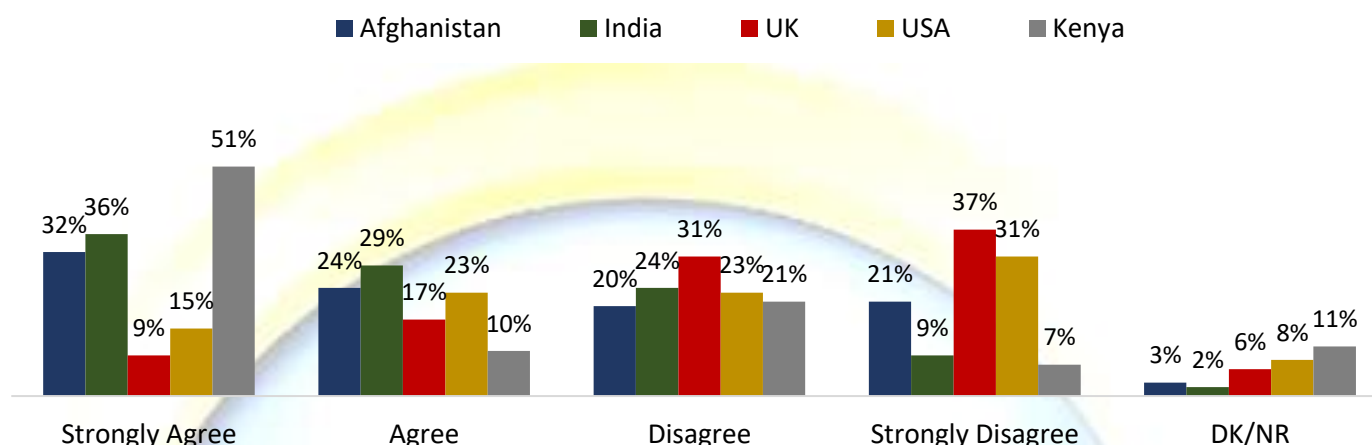

Country Breakdown

More than half of the respondents from Kenya (51%) strongly agree that the threat of coronavirus is exaggerated while 37% of the respondents from the United Kingdom strongly disagree with the statement.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1865 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, from December 22, 2021 - January 15, 2022. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was CATI.
