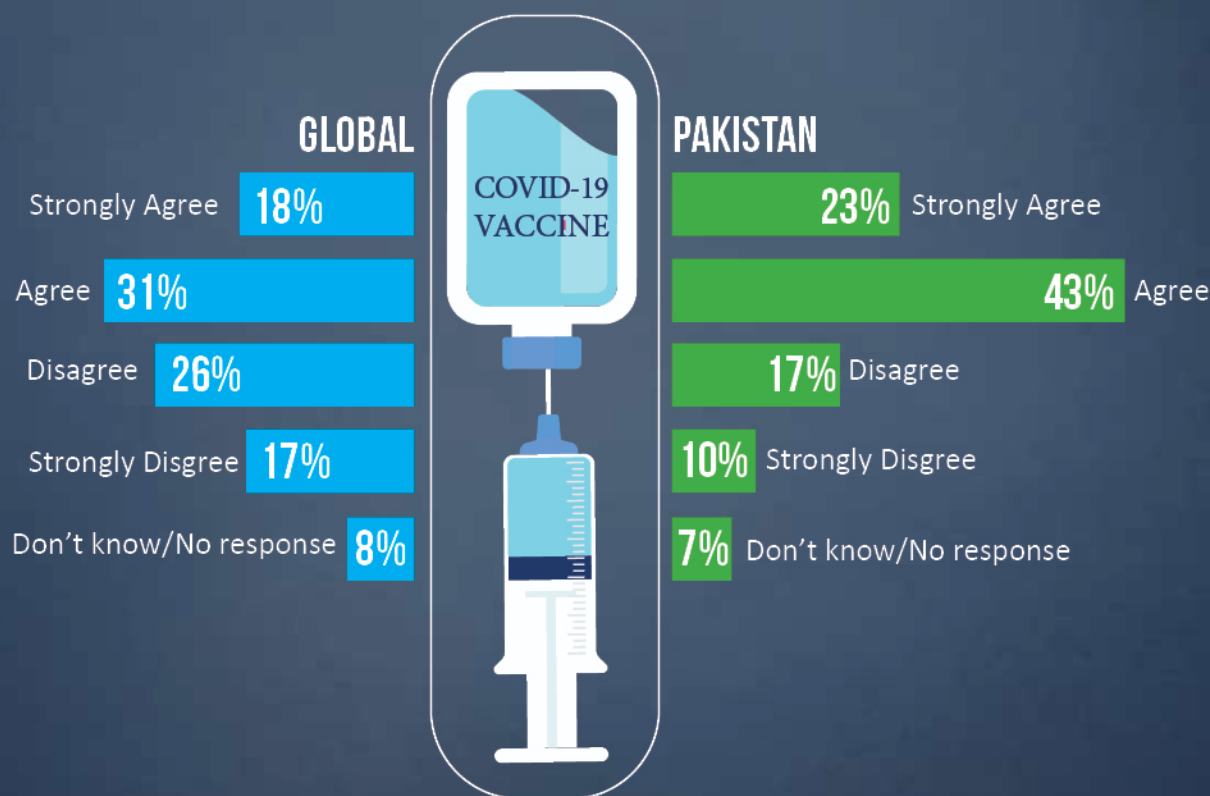

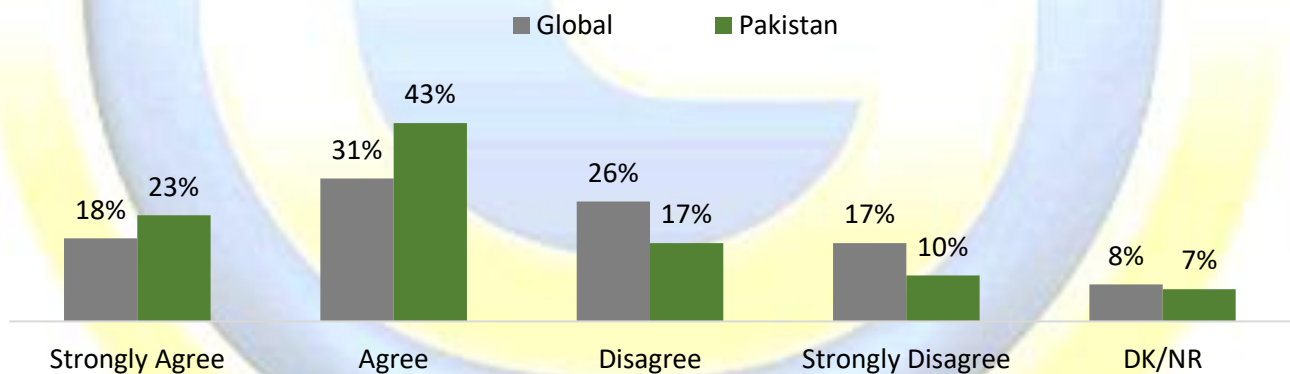
Two-third (66%) of Pakistanis report that they have doubts about the effectiveness of the COVID-19 vaccine; 49% of global respondents claim this: Gallup International Survey in collaboration with Gallup Pakistan

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, two-third (66%) of Pakistanis report that they have doubts about the effectiveness of the COVID-19 vaccine; 49% of global respondents claim this.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the four provinces was asked the following question, “Thinking specifically about the Coronavirus (COVID-19) how strongly do you agree or disagree with each of the following statements? - I have doubts that/whether the vaccines against Coronavirus are really effective.” In response to this question in Pakistan, 23% said strongly agree, 43% said agree, 17% said disagree, 10% said strongly disagree, and 7% didn’t know or gave no response.

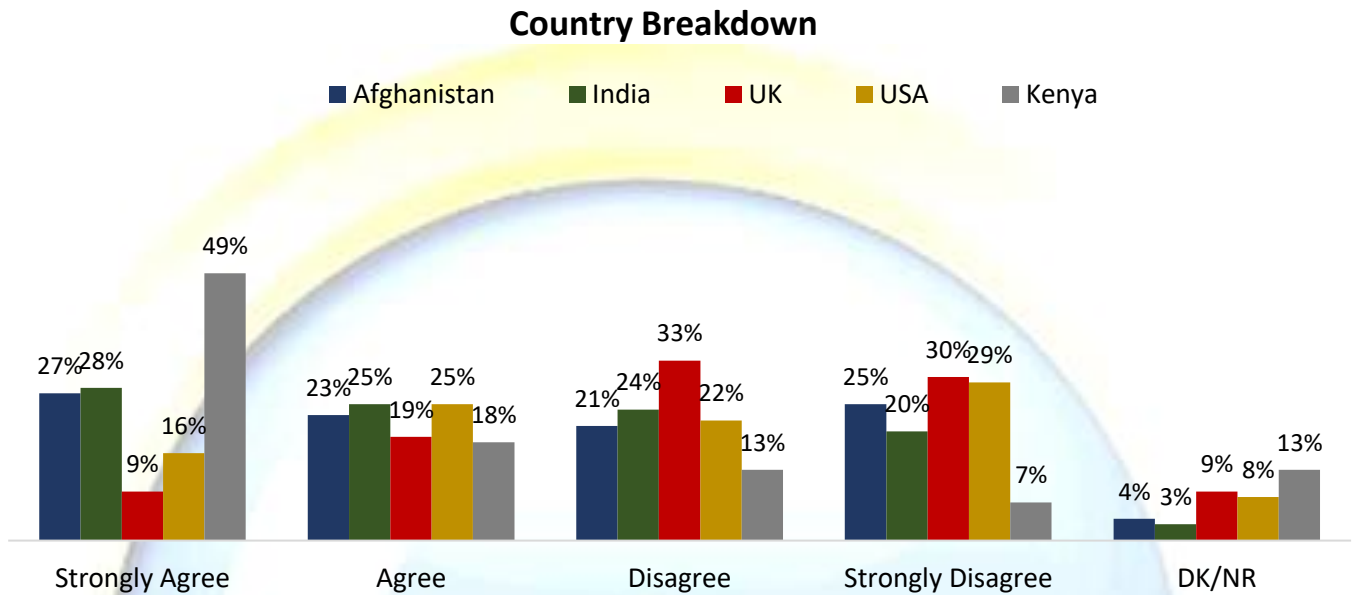

Country Breakdown

Respondents from Kenya (67%) have the most doubts about the effectiveness of the COVID-19 vaccine followed by India (53%) and Afghanistan (50%).

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1000 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, from December 22, 2021 - January 15, 2022. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was CATI.
