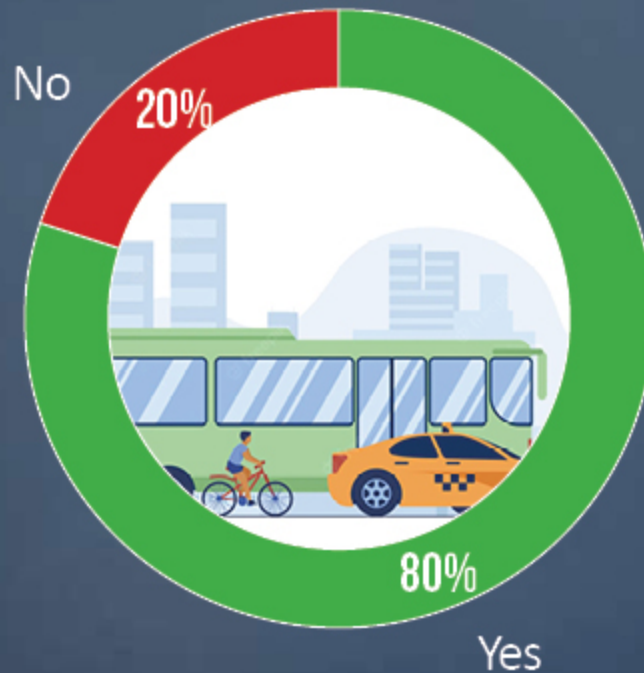

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 4 in 5 (80%) Islamabadis believe that the federal capital is in need of a good transport system.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the capital was asked the following question, “Does Islamabad require a good public transport system?” In response to this question, 80% said yes and 20% said no.

All Islamabad



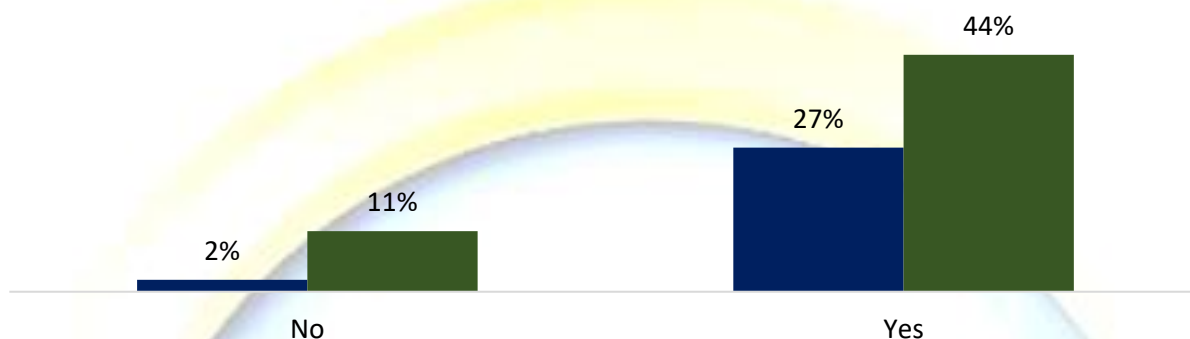

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 482 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, from December 22, 2021 - January 15, 2022. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was CATI.
