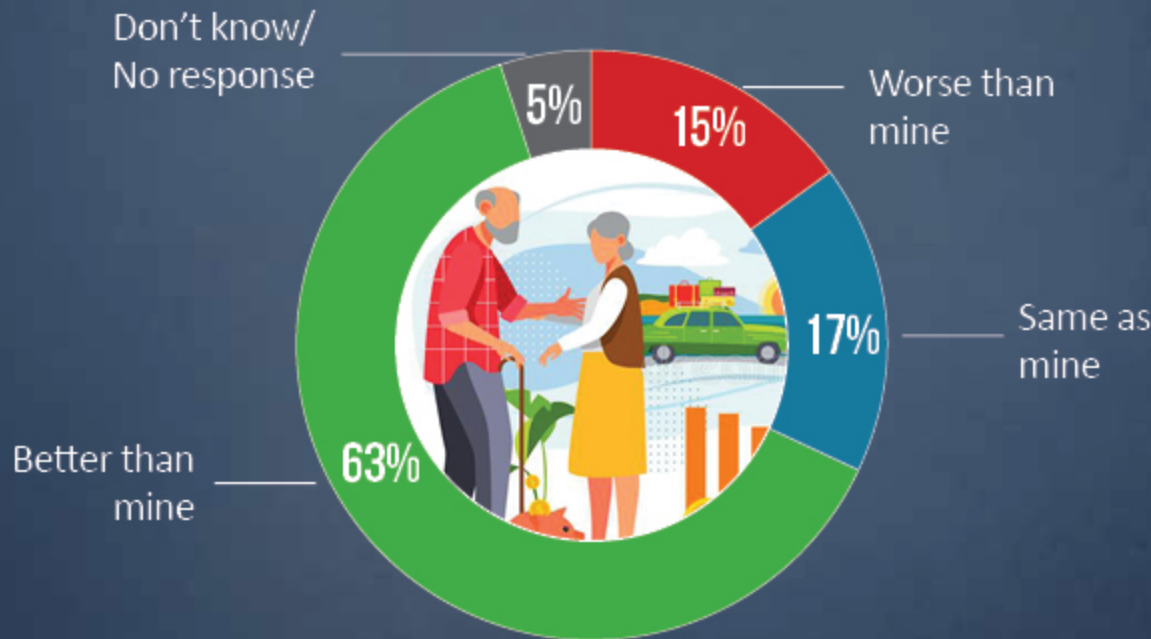

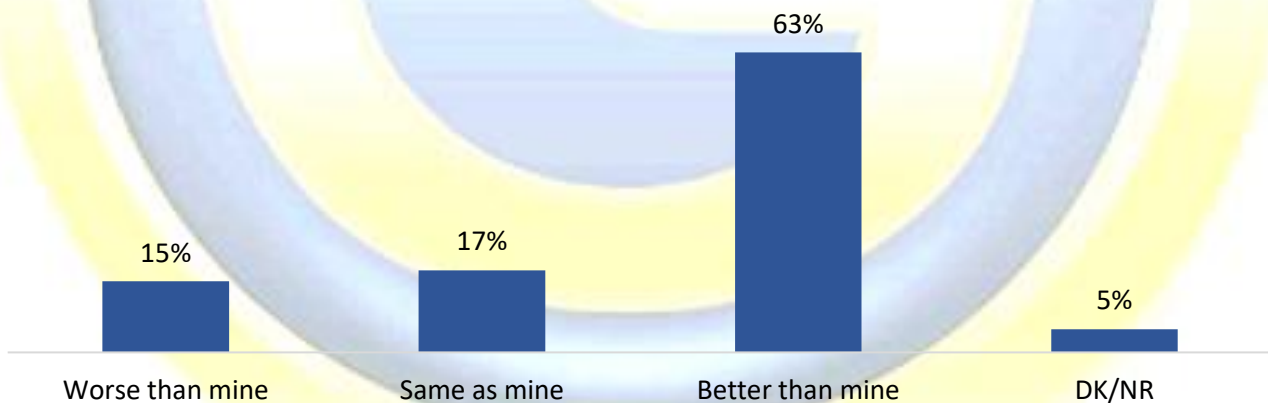

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, two-third (63%) Pakistanis consider their parent's standard of living to be better than theirs; more males (66%) compared to females (59%) claim this.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the capital was asked the following question, "When your parents were as old as you are now, do you think their standard of living ...?" In response to this question, 15% said worse than mine, 17% said same as mine, 63% said better than mine and 5% said don't know and no response.

Question: "When your parents were as old as you are now, do you think their standard of living...?"

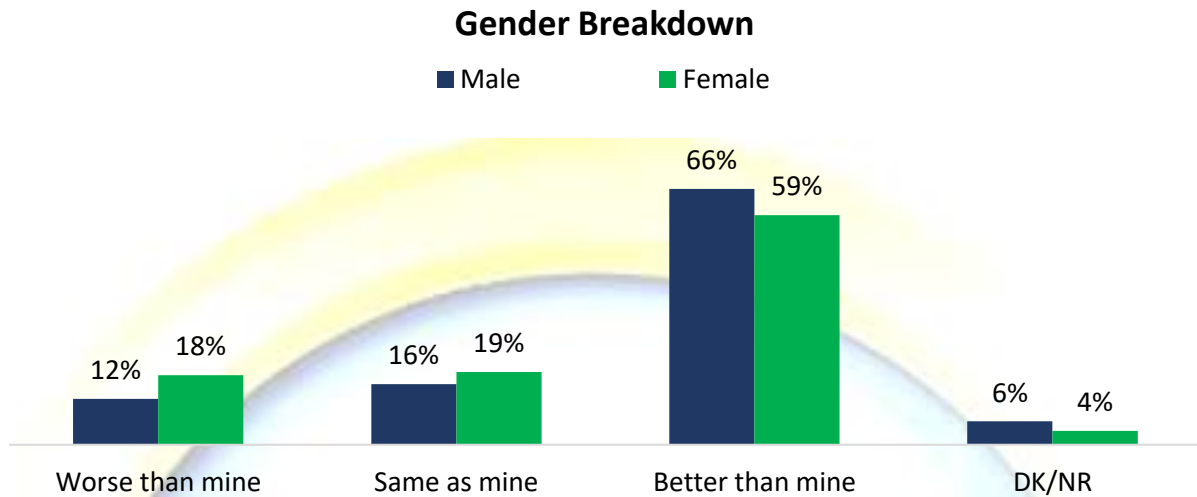

Gender Breakdown

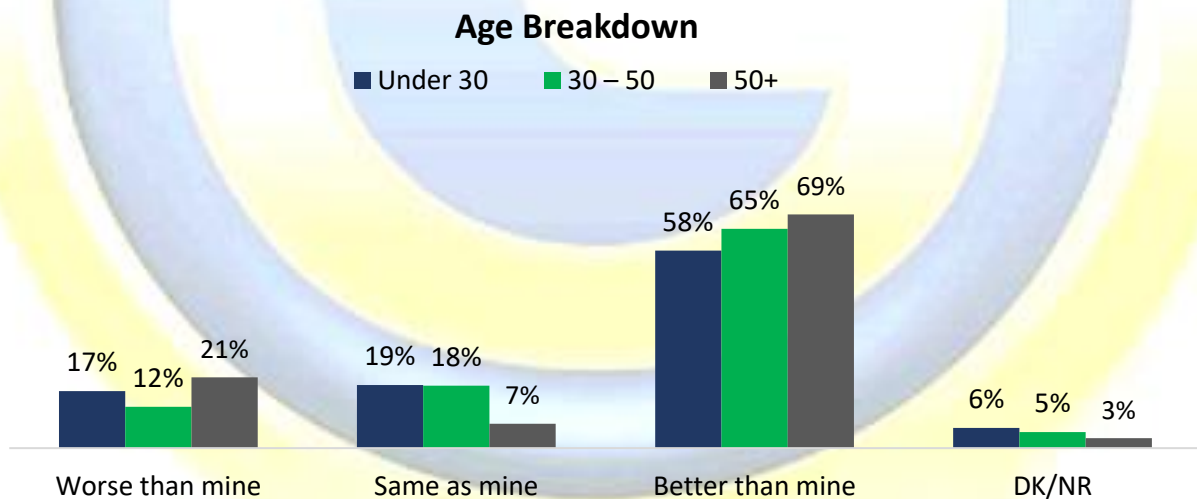
More males (66%) compared to females (59%) consider their parent's standard of living to be better than theirs.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1103 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, from March 15, 2022 - March 23, 2022. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was CATI.
