According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, three-quarter (73%) Pakistanis believe that while their political party may not be especially good, the rest are much worse.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the country was asked the following statement, “*My political party is not especially good, but the rest are much worse.*” In response to this statement, 73% agreed and 27% disagreed.

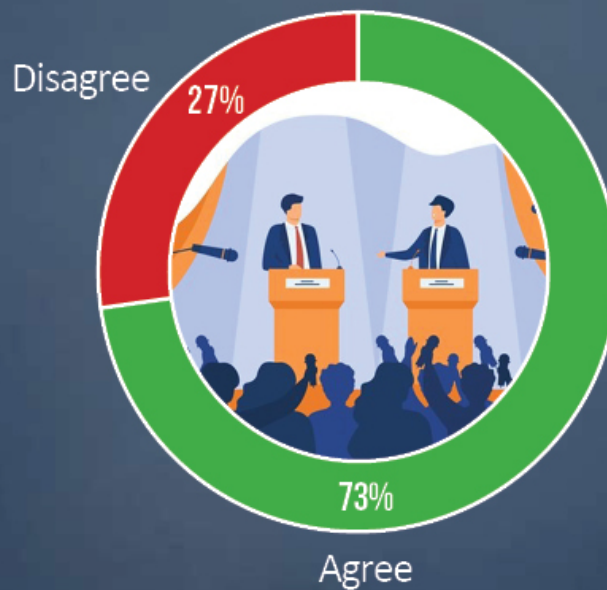

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1234 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, from 30 May 2022 – 13 June 2022. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was CATI.
