1 in 3 Pakistanis blame the government for problems in Pakistan and almost a quarter (27%) blame the politicians: Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

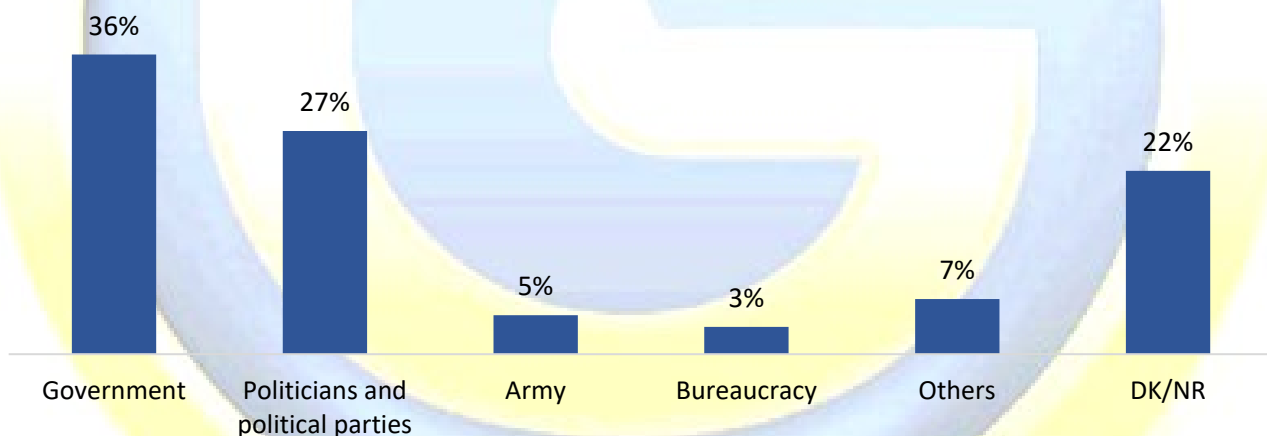
(Islamabad), June 6, 2022

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 1 in 3 Pakistanis blame the government for problems in Pakistan and almost a quarter (27%) blame the politicians.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across Pakistan was asked the following question, “*Who do you think is most responsible for problems in Pakistan?*” In response to this question, 36% said government, 27% said politicians, 5% said army, 3% said bureaucracy, 7% said others and 22% didn’t know or gave no response.

Question: “Who do you think is most responsible for problems in Pakistan?”

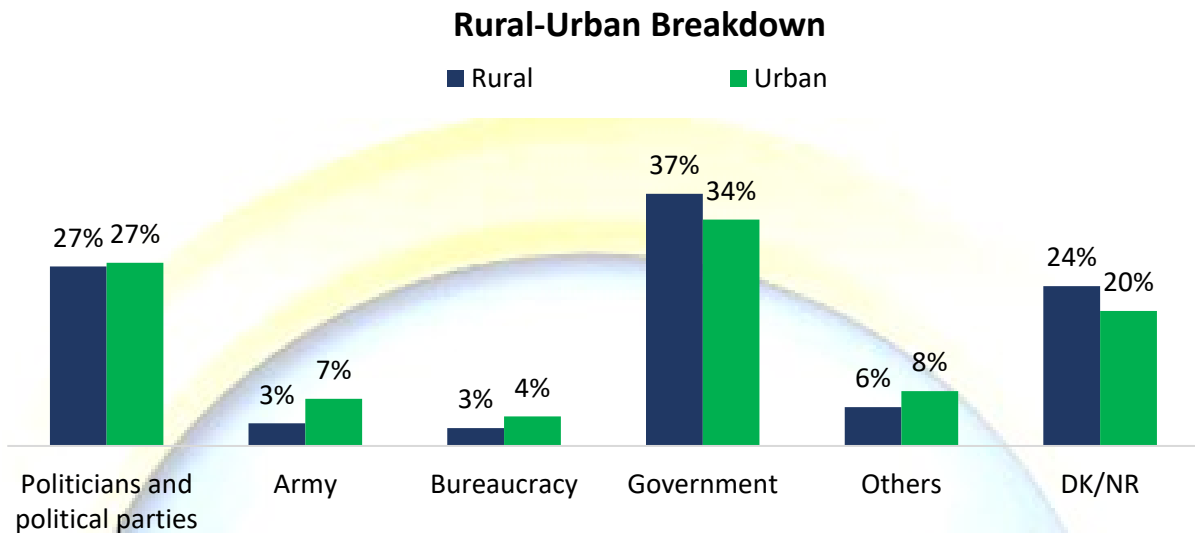

Rural-Urban Breakdown

More rural residents as compared to urban residents believe the government is responsible for the problems in Pakistan.



The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1103 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, from March 15, 2022 - March 23, 2022. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was CATI.
