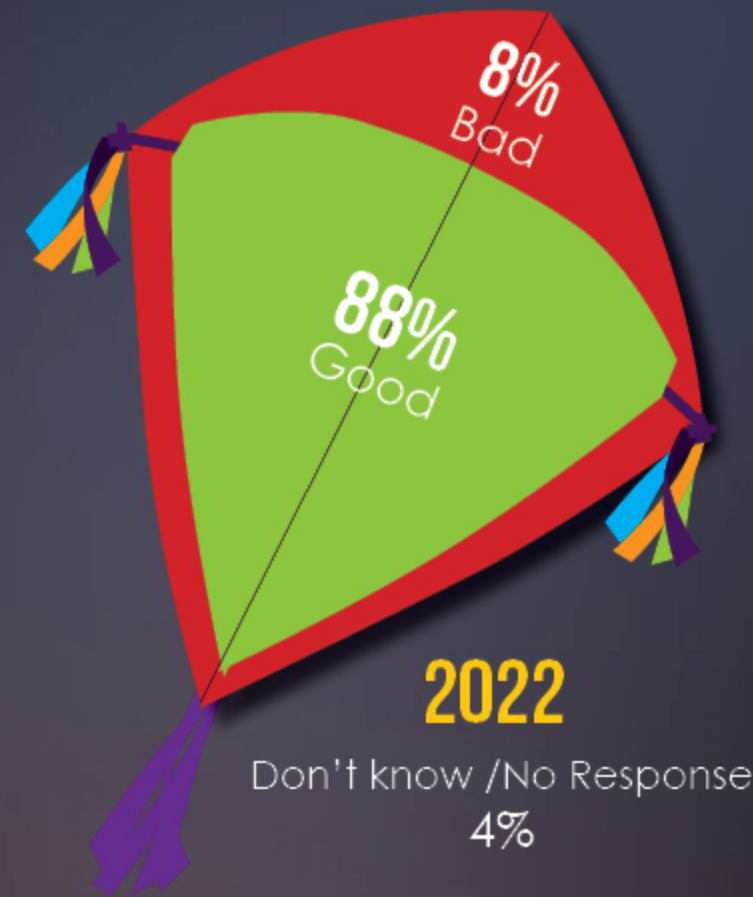
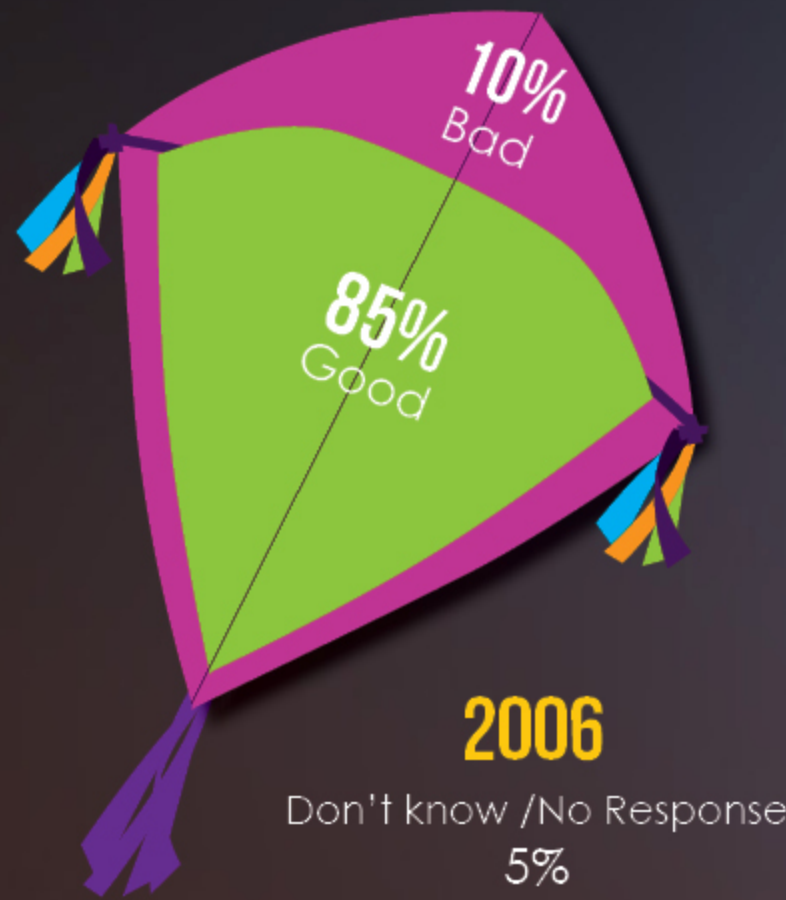

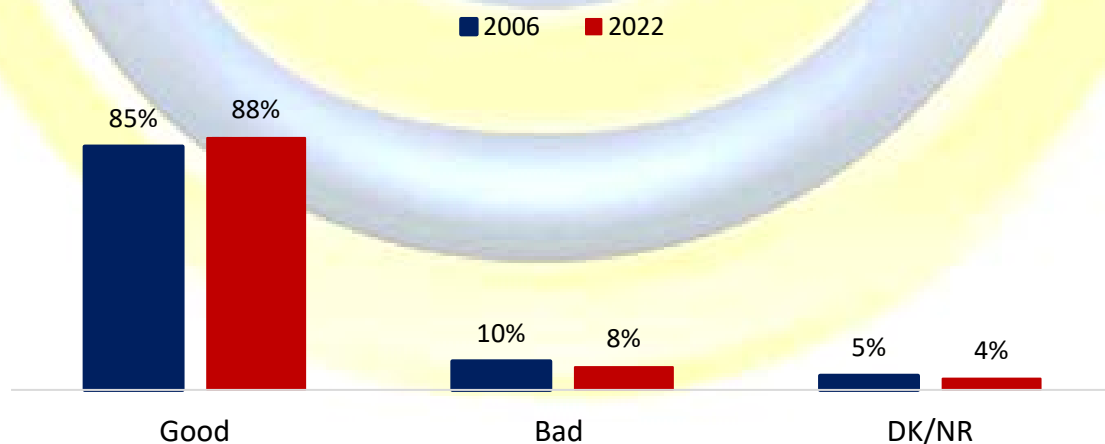
In a Gallup & Gilani Pakistan National Survey conducted in the year 2006, a representative sample of adult men and women from across Pakistan was asked the following question, “Do you think the government has done good or bad by banning Basant and kite flying?” In response to this question, 85% said good, 10% said bad and 5% didn’t know or gave no response.

Comparative Picture: This question was asked again in 2022 to allow a comparison to be made across the years. In response to this question in 2022, 88% said good, 8% said bad and 4% didn’t know or gave no response.

Trend Analysis: Support for a ban on Basant and kite flying has remained relatively stable throughout the years; 85% of respondents in 2006 and 88% in 2022 support the decision of the government to ban Basant.
