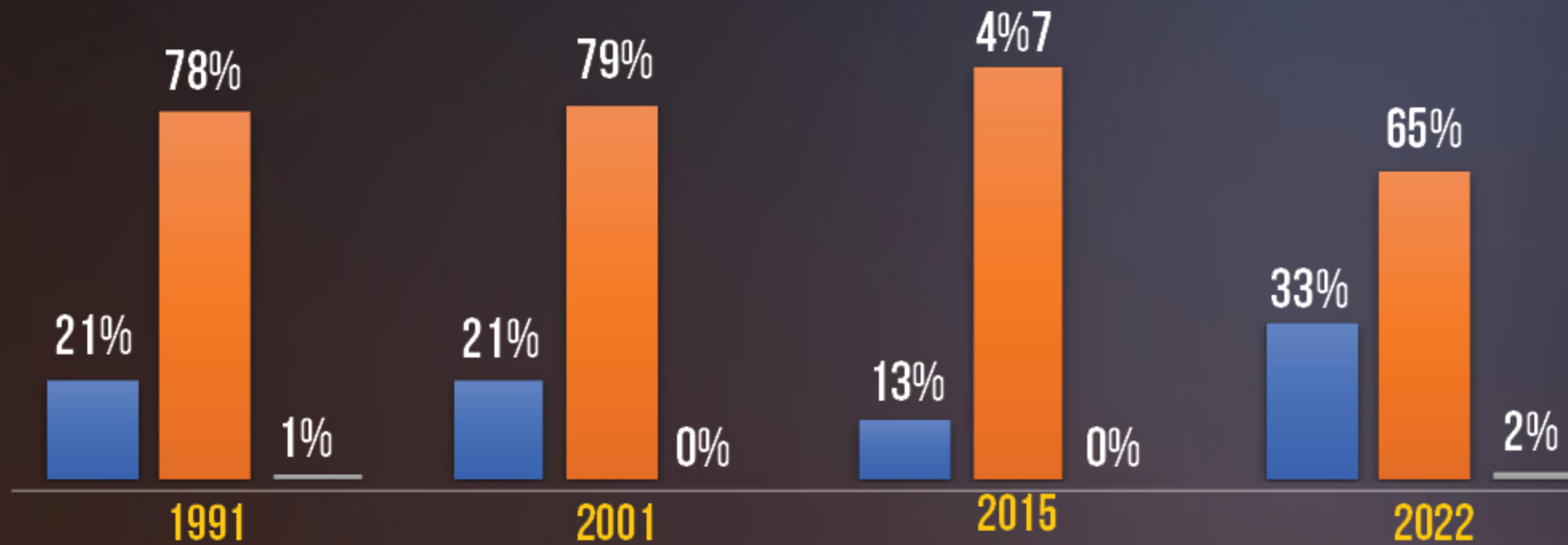

21% of respondents in 1991 as compared to 33% in 2022 reported that they admitted a member of their household to the hospital in the past year: Gallup & Gilani Pakistan History Project

In a Gallup & Gilani Pakistan National Survey conducted in the year 1991, a representative sample of adult men and women from across Pakistan was asked the following question “*In the past one year, was any member of your household (for example, husband, wife, son, daughter, brother, sister, father, mother, grandfather, grandmother, mother-in-law, father-in-law), admitted to the hospital?*” In response to this question, 21% said yes, 78% said no, and 1% didn’t know or gave no response.

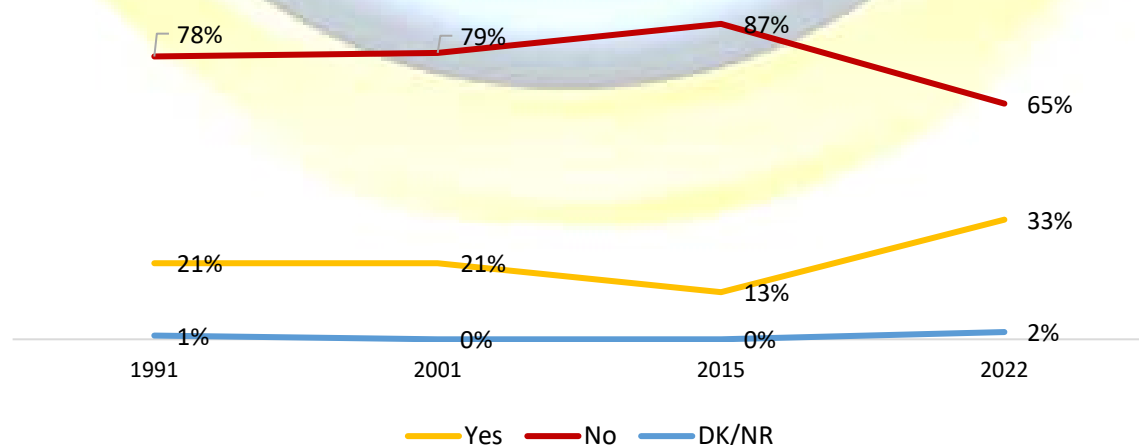
Comparative Picture: This question was asked again in 2022 to allow a comparison to be made across the years. In response to this question in 2022, 33% said yes, 65% said no and 2% didn’t know or gave no response.

Trend Analysis: 21% of respondents in 1991 as compared to 33% in 2022 reported that they admitted a member of their household to the hospital in the past year, showing an increase of 12%. Admission to the hospital was the lowest in 2015 with 13% of the respondents claiming it.

Admission to hospitals can be cyclical and depend on the general health conditions. The recent rise could be because of the COVID-19 upsurge in hospital admission. It could also be symptomatic of improved access to health care as well.

This press release has been made as part of the Gallup Pakistan History Project which aims to release historical empirical polling data to wider audiences. The objective is to sustain and encourage empirical decision-making in Pakistan.
