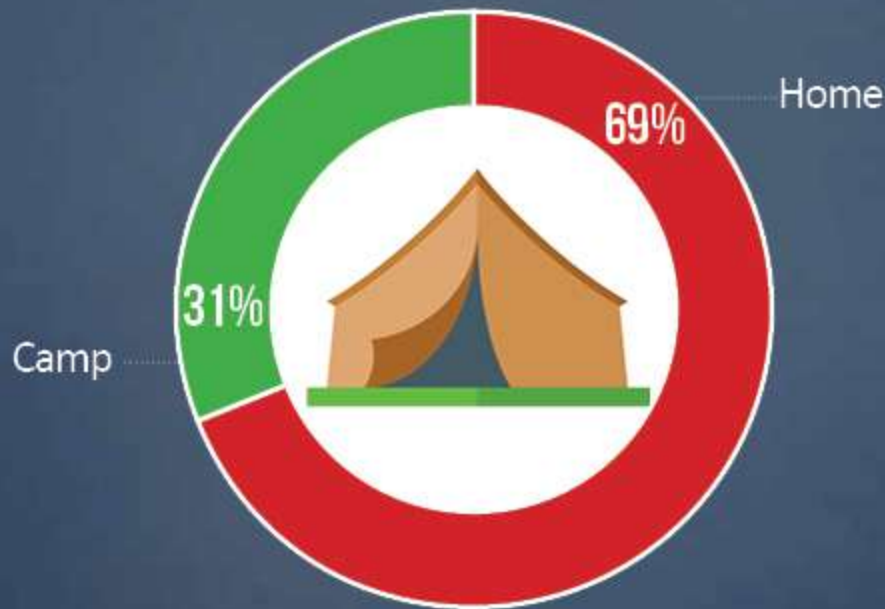

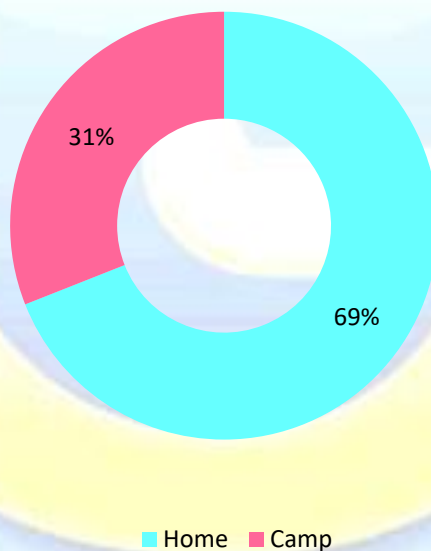
31% Pakistani's from flood affected areas reported having to relocate to a camp: Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

(Islamabad), October 14th, 2022

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 31% of respondents reported having to relocate to a camp

A representative sample of adult men and women from the flood borne areas was asked the following question: "Are you at your home or at a camp these days?" 69% responded that they were at home while 31% responded that they had relocated to a camp.

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 237 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, from September 01, 2022 – September 16, 2022. The error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 3 -5 percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic and Face to Face surveys
