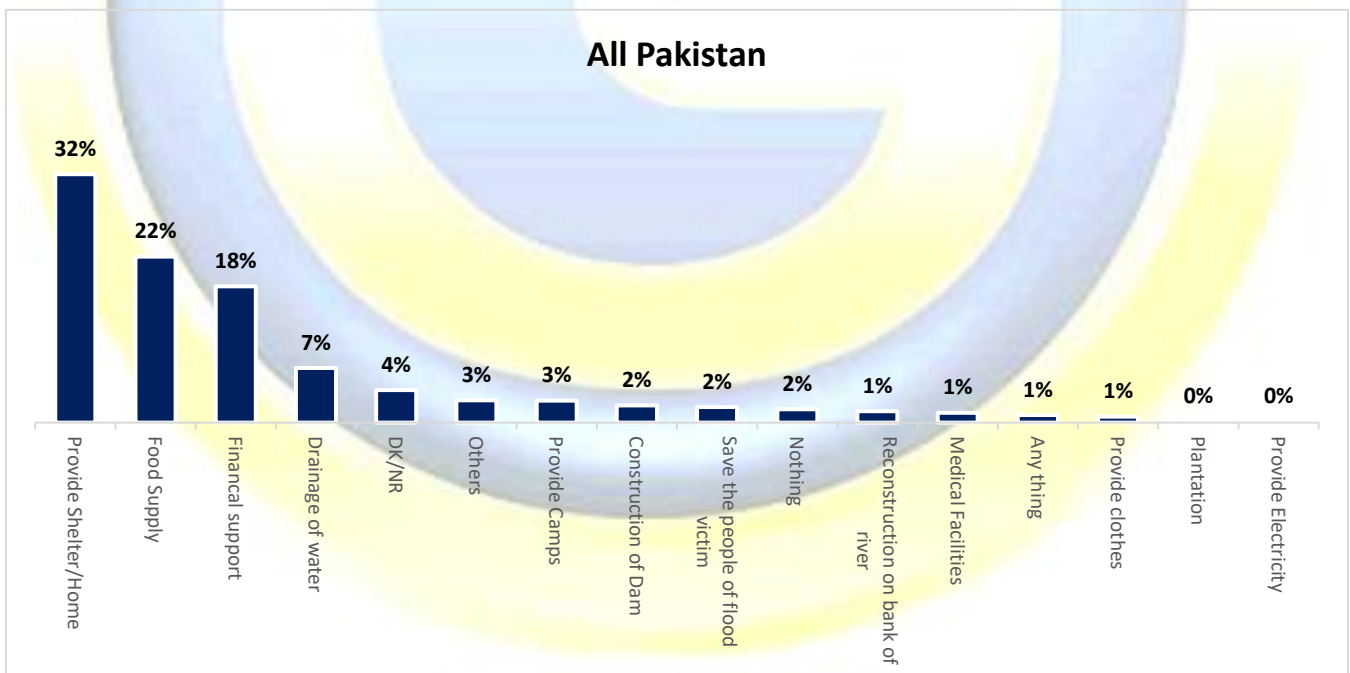

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, Shelter (32%), food (22%), and financial aid (18%) should be the top three priority areas for government to help the flood victims.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the country was asked the following question regarding, “What do you think is the first thing that the government should do to help the flood victims?” In response, 32% responded provide shelter/home, 22% said that the government should provide the flood victims with food supply, 18% said that financial support should be priority, 7% said drainage of water needs to be the priority, 3% responded the provision of camps, 2% said construction of dam, save the people and nothing respectively, while 1% each responded reconstruction of river banks, medical facilities, anything, provide clothes of river banks, medical facilities, anything, provide clothes

The study was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of more than 991 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, from September 01, 2022 – September 16, 2022. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 3-5$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic and Face to Face surveys
