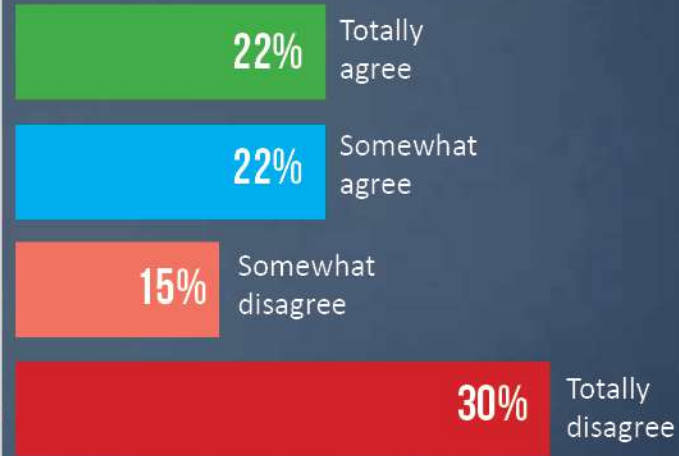

NEARLY HALF (45%) PAKISTANIS AND BRITONS (49%) DON'T WANT TO LIVE TO BE 100 YEARS OLD: GALLUP & GILANI PAKISTAN

Nearly half (45%) Pakistanis and Britons (49%) don't want to live to be 100 years old: Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

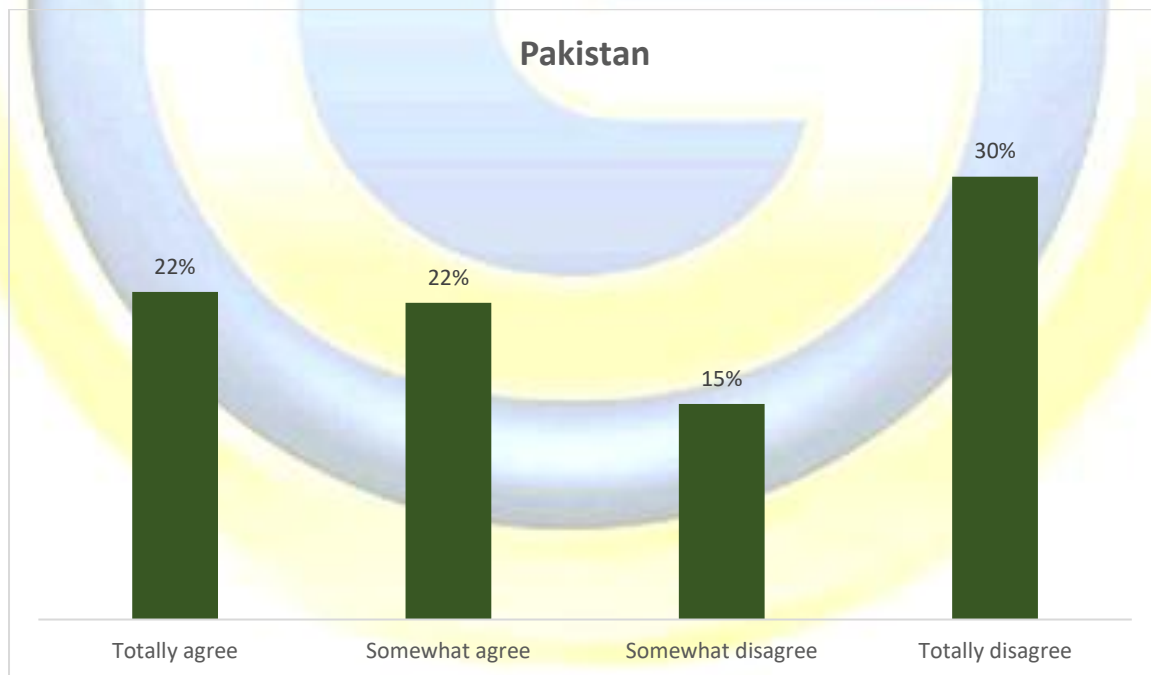

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, nearly half (45%) Pakistanis and British people (49%) don't want to live to be 100 years old

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the country was asked the following question regarding, "To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statement? I want to live to be 100 years old." 22% said that they totally agree, 22% said that they somewhat agree, 15% responded somewhat disagree while 30% responded totally disagree.

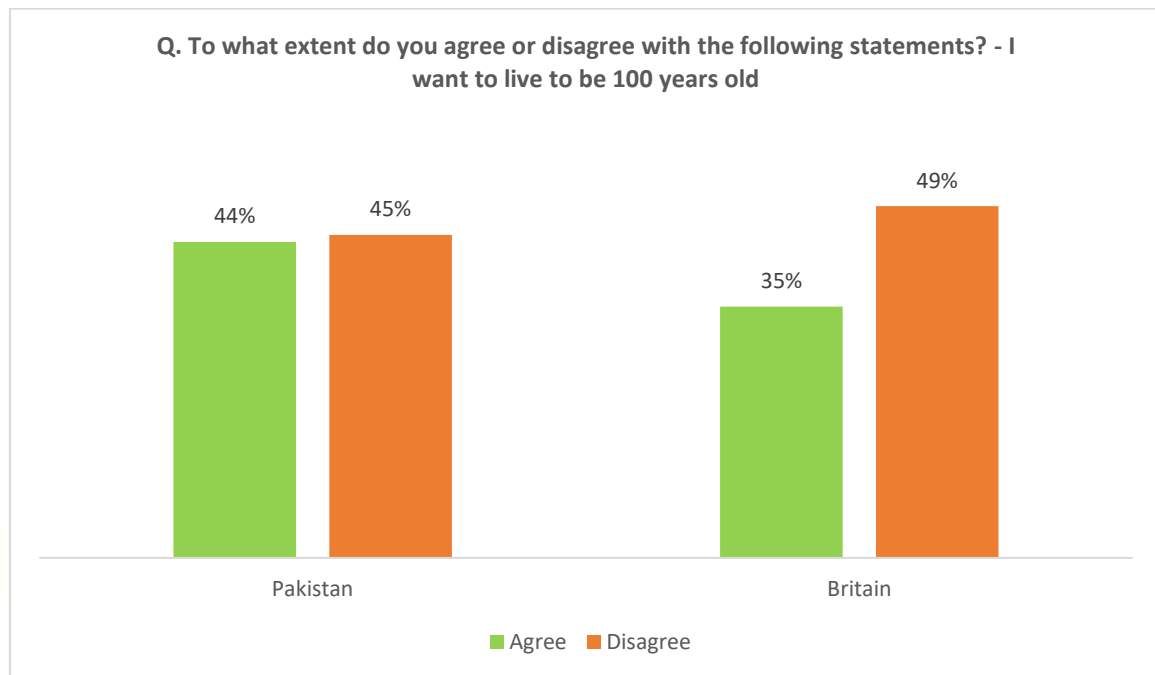
Comparison between Pakistan and Britain: The same question was asked in Britain by [IPSOS](#) (the study can be found [here](#)) where 35% said that they want to live to be 100 years old while 49% disagreed. If we compare the results in both the countries, more people want to live to be 100 years old in Pakistan than in Britain. Whereas there is not much difference in the number of people who disagreed with the statement as 45% from Pakistan and 44% from Britain said that they do not want to live to be 100 years old.

Comparison with Britain: The following question was asked in Britain and in Pakistan: "To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statements? - I want to live to be 100 years old" In response, 44% Pakistanis said that they agree with the statement while 45% said that they disagree. On the other hand, 35% Britons agreed while 49% of them disagreed with the statement.

The study in Pakistan was released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1107 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI) and the data collection was done during 16 Nov – 28 Nov 2022.
