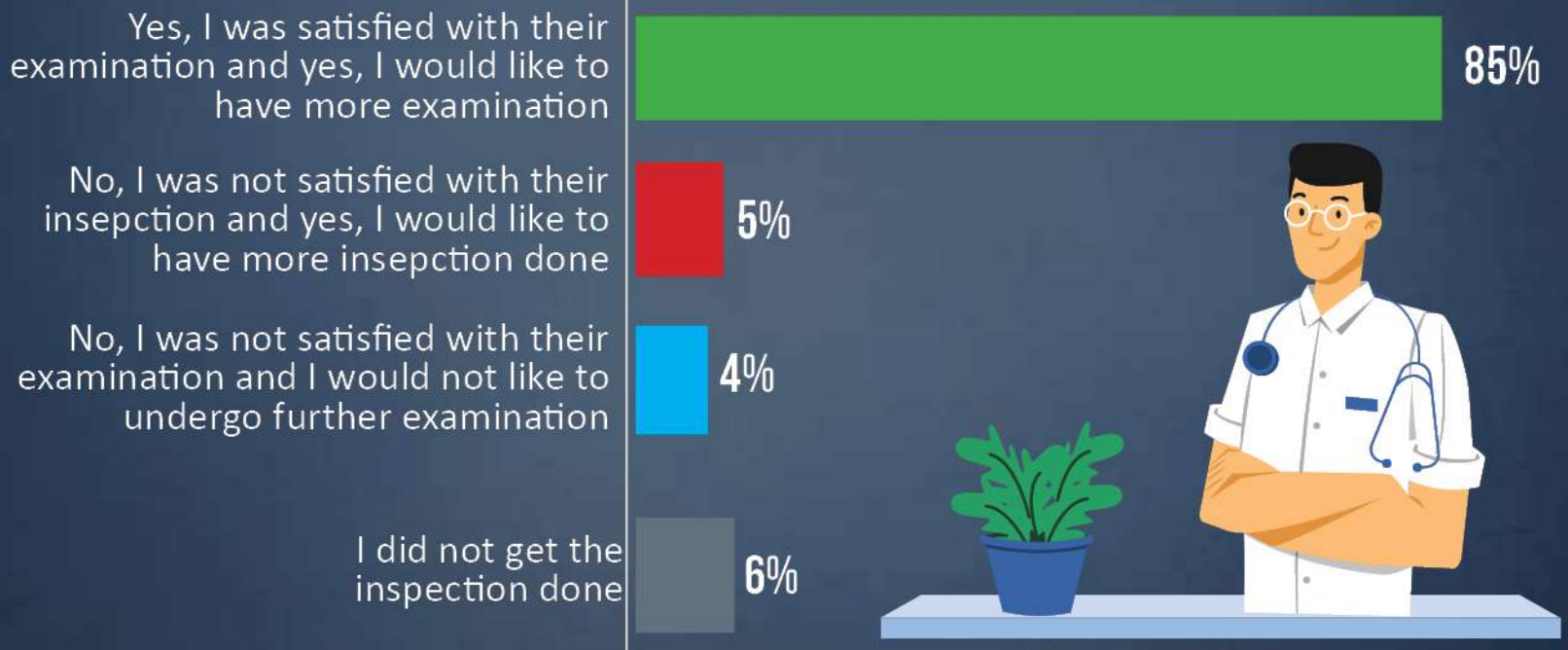

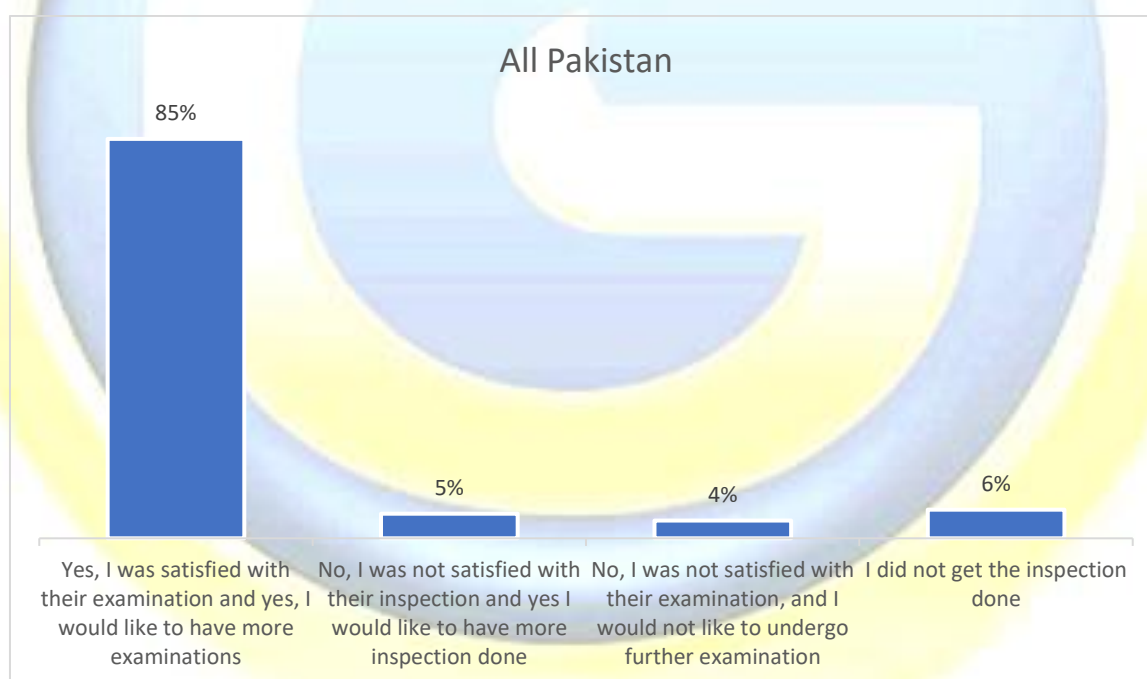

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, a huge majority (85%) of Pakistanis say that they were satisfied with their examination upon their latest visit to the doctor and would like to have more examinations in the future.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the country, was asked the following as a follow up question, *“Please tell us how satisfied you were with your doctor's examination when you last visited them. And would you like to have them examine you further?”* 85% replied that they were satisfied and would like to have more examinations, 5% said they were not satisfied and would like to have more inspections done, 4% said they were not satisfied and would not like to undergo further examination while 6% said that they did not get any examination done.

Question: “Please tell us how satisfied you were with your doctor's examination when you last visited them. And would you like to have them examine you further?”

The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 747 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI)
