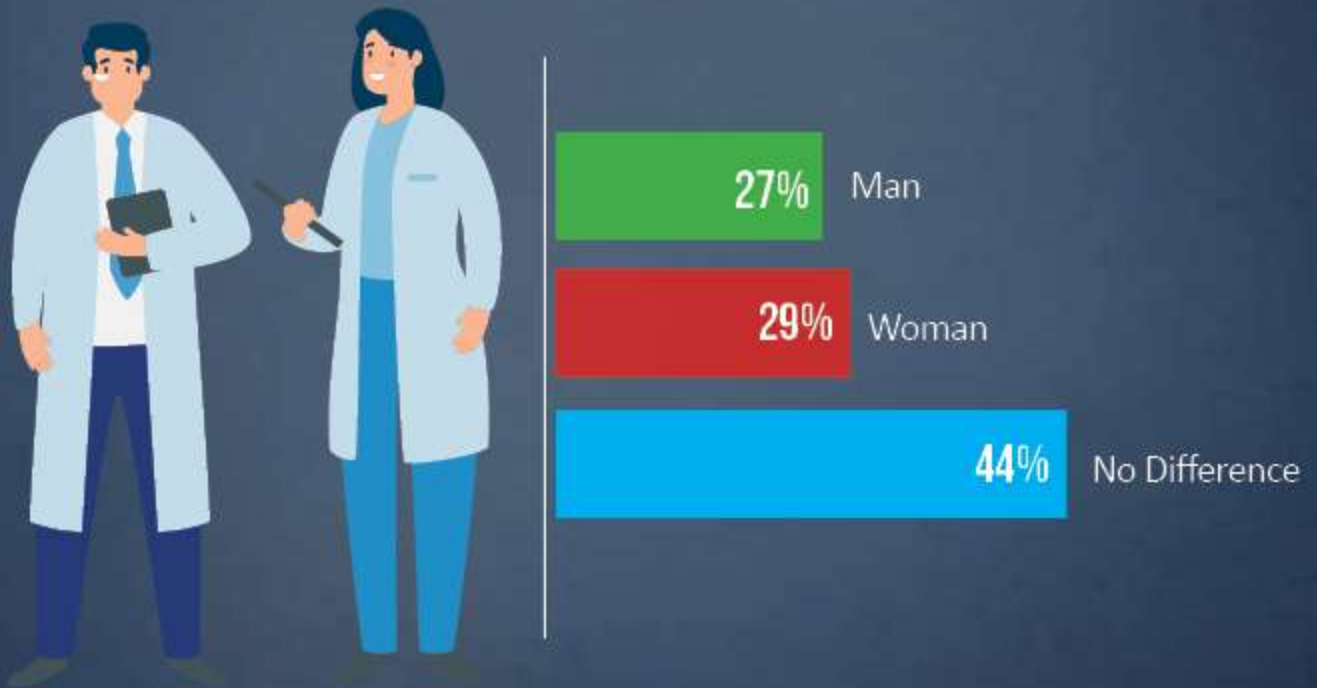

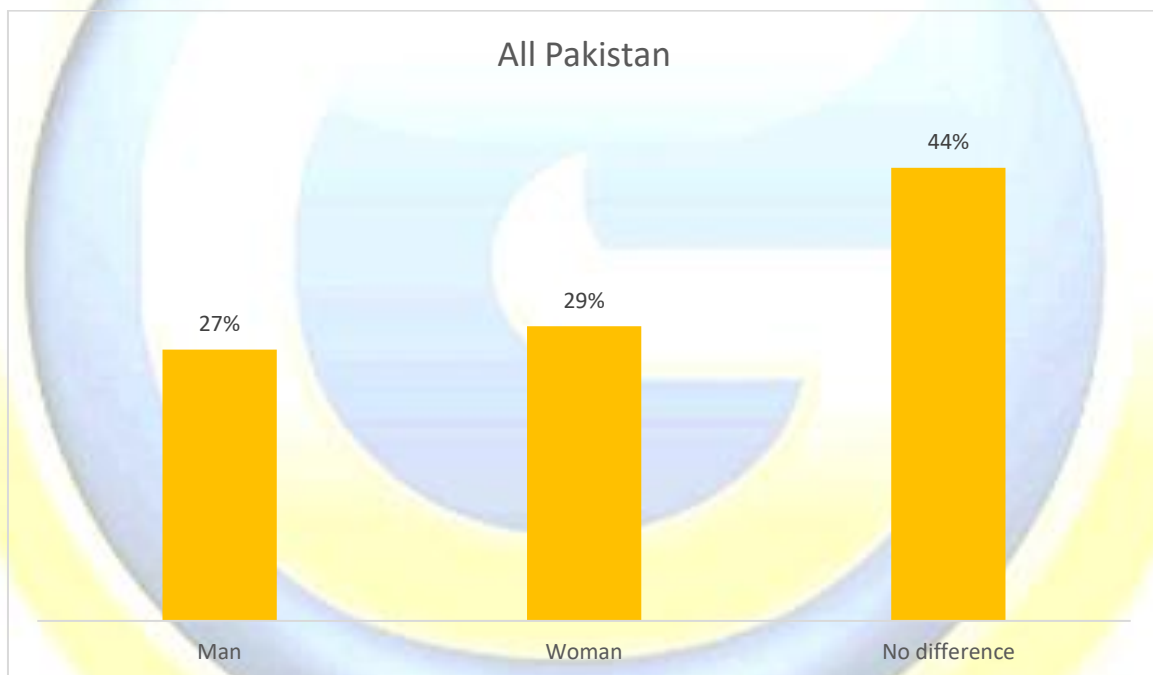
2 in 5 (44%) Pakistanis are indifferent to the gender of the doctor they would prefer to go to: Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

(Islamabad), February 01st, 2023

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 2 in 5 Pakistanis are indifferent to the gender of the doctor they would prefer to go to.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the country was asked the following question regarding, “God forbid, if you ever had to go to a doctor, would you prefer that your doctor was a man or a woman?” In response, 27% said man, 29% said they would prefer a woman, while 44% said that it made no difference if the doctor is a man or a woman.

The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 747 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country. The error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 2 -3 percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI)
