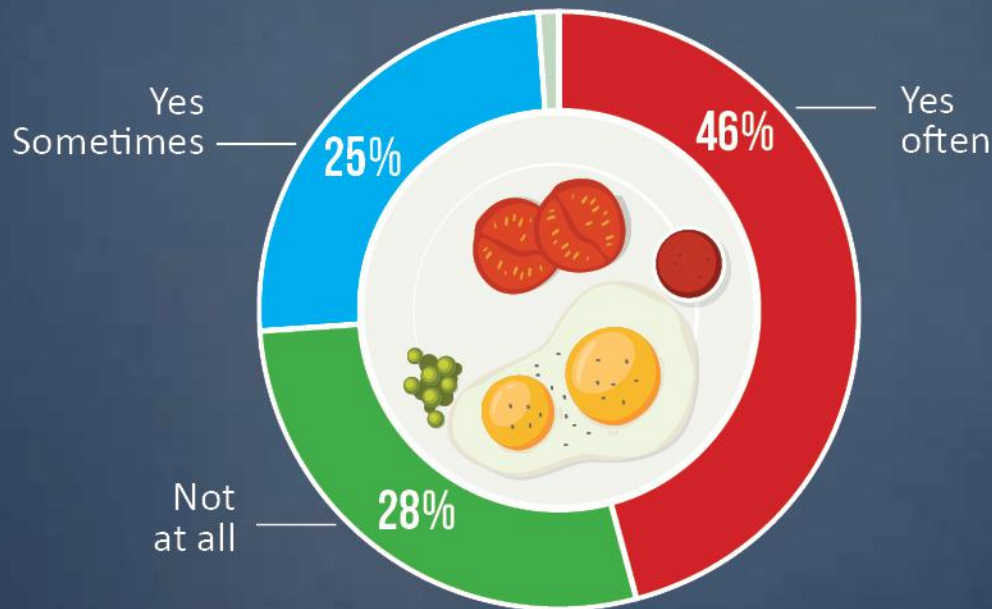

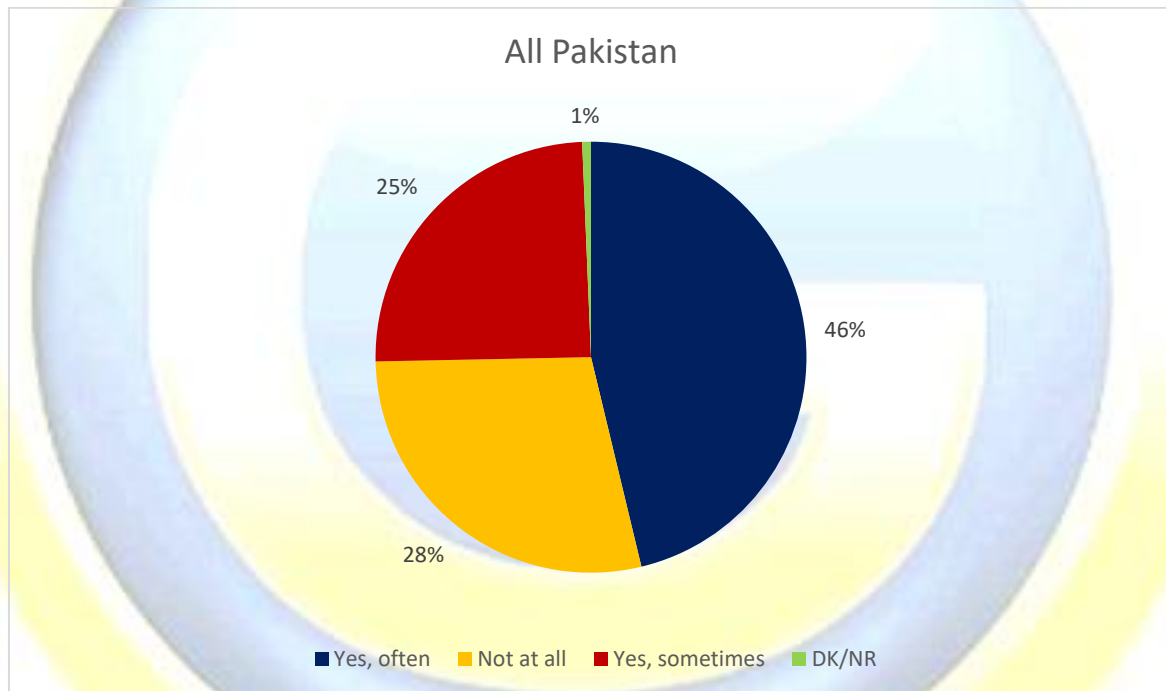
Food Insecurity: 71% Pakistanis report that they or someone in their family suffered from food shortages: Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

(Islamabad), May 12th, 2023

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 71% Pakistanis report that they or someone in their family suffered from food shortages.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the country, was asked the question “Have you or someone in your family suffered from food shortages?” In response, 46% said yes, often, 28% said not at all, 25% said yes, sometimes and 1% did not respond or said they did not know.

Question: “Have you or someone in your family suffered from food shortages?”

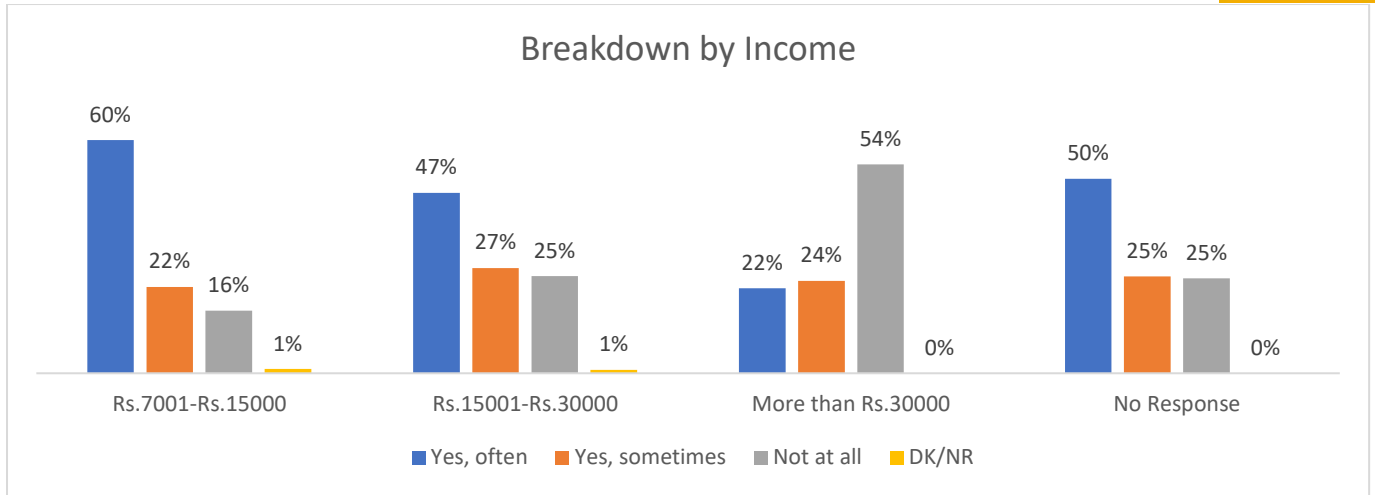

Breakdown by Income:

The highest proportion of people who said that they often had to face food shortages belongs to the lower earning incoming groups. 60% of those who earn up to 15,000 Rs per month said that they or their family often faces food shortages. The proportion of people who reported facing a food shortage often decreases with the increase in income as 47% of those who earn Rs.15001-30,000 while 22% from amongst those who earn more than Rs.30,000 reported the same.

The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1135 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, during 14 to 22 March, 2023. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI)
