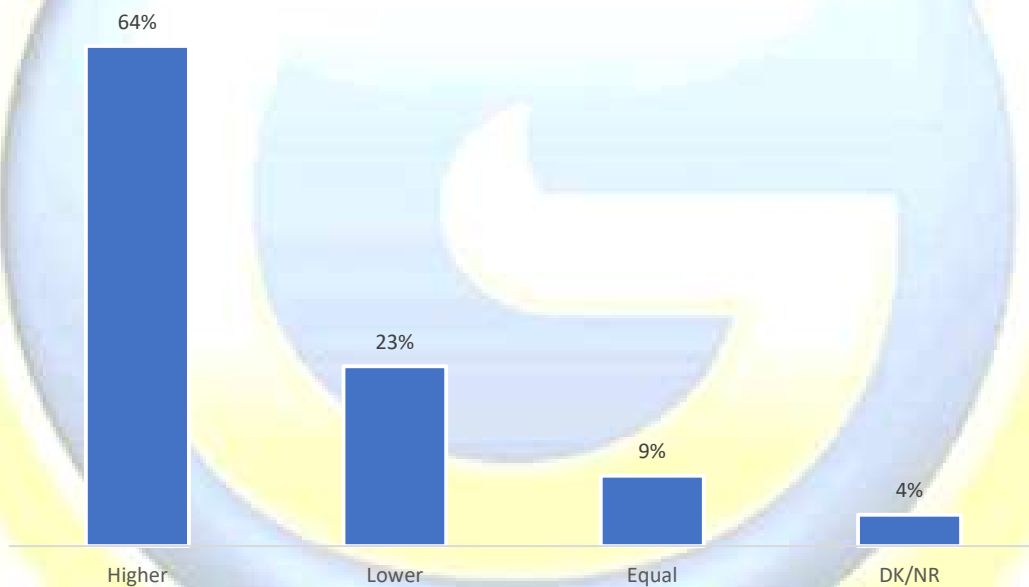
64% Pakistanis believe poverty in Pakistan is higher than in its neighbors: Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

(Islamabad), June 6th, 2023

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 64% Pakistanis believe poverty is higher in Pakistan as compared to its neighboring countries.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the country, was asked the question “Do you think poverty in Pakistan is higher, lower or equal to its neighboring countries?” In response, 64% said higher, 23% said lower, 9% said equal, and 4% did not respond or said that they did not know.

The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1535 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted during 29 March to 07 April 2023. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI)
