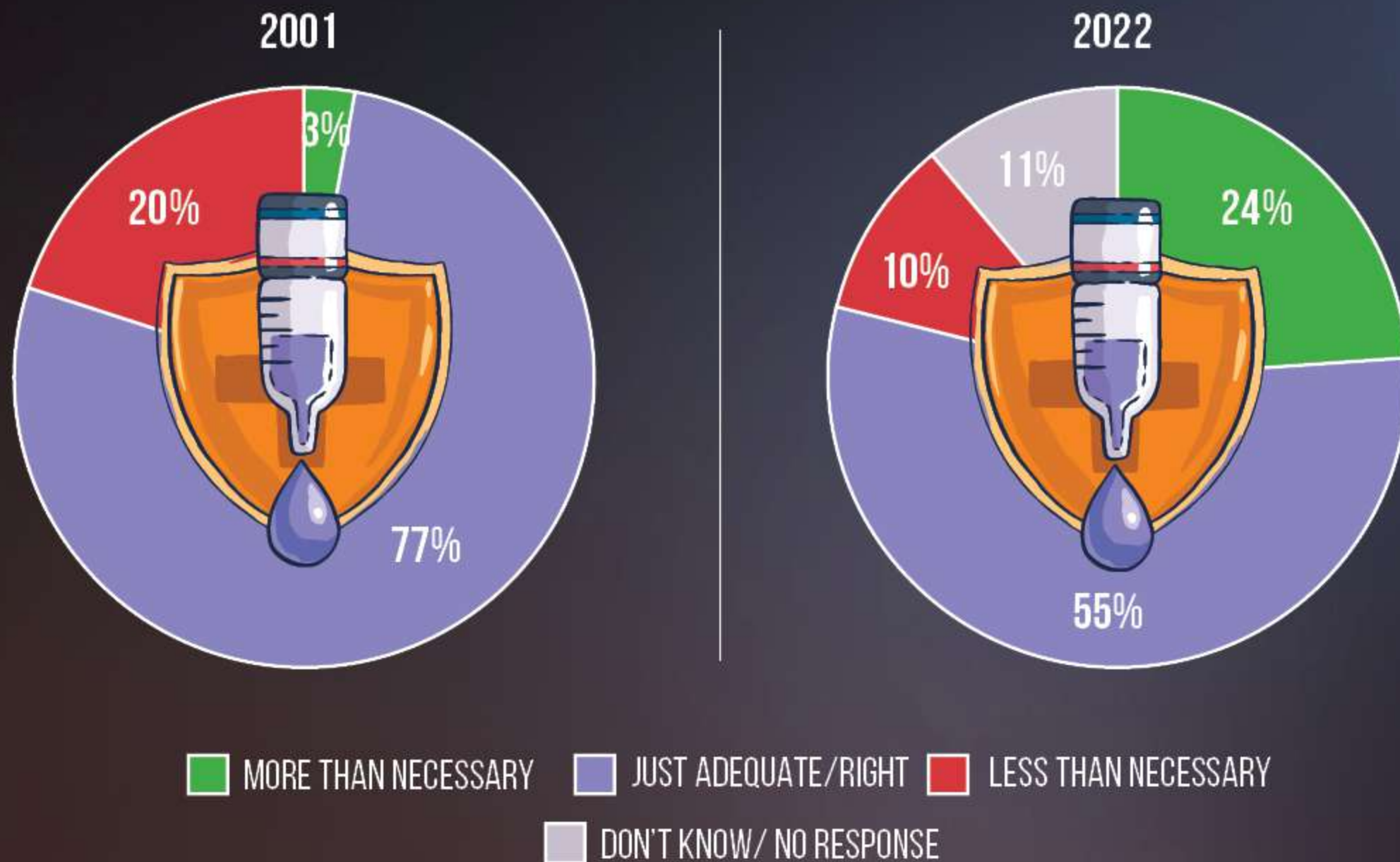

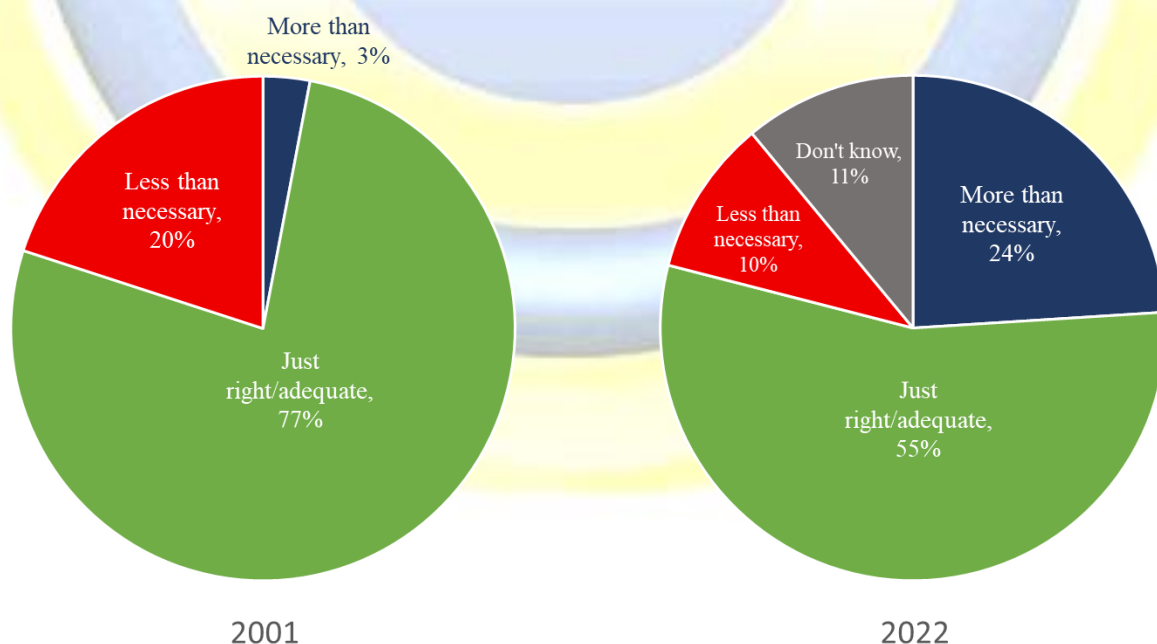
In a Gallup & Gilani Pakistan National Survey conducted in the year 2003, a representative sample of adult men and women from across Pakistan was asked the following question, “Do you think that the efforts of the Government to eradicate Polio are according to the required need?” In response to this question, 3% said more than necessary, 77% said adequate while 20% responded less than necessary.

Comparative Picture: This question was asked again in 2022 to allow a comparison to be made across the years. In 2022, 24% people said the government was doing more than necessary to eradicate polio, 55% said it was taking adequate measures while 10% said it was doing less than necessary.

Trend Analysis: From 2003 to 2022, there has been a 21% increase in the proportion of people who believe that the government is doing more than necessary to eradicate polio.

This press release has been made as part of the Gallup Pakistan History Project which aims to release historical empirical polling data to wider audiences. The objective is to sustain and encourage empirical decision-making in Pakistan.
