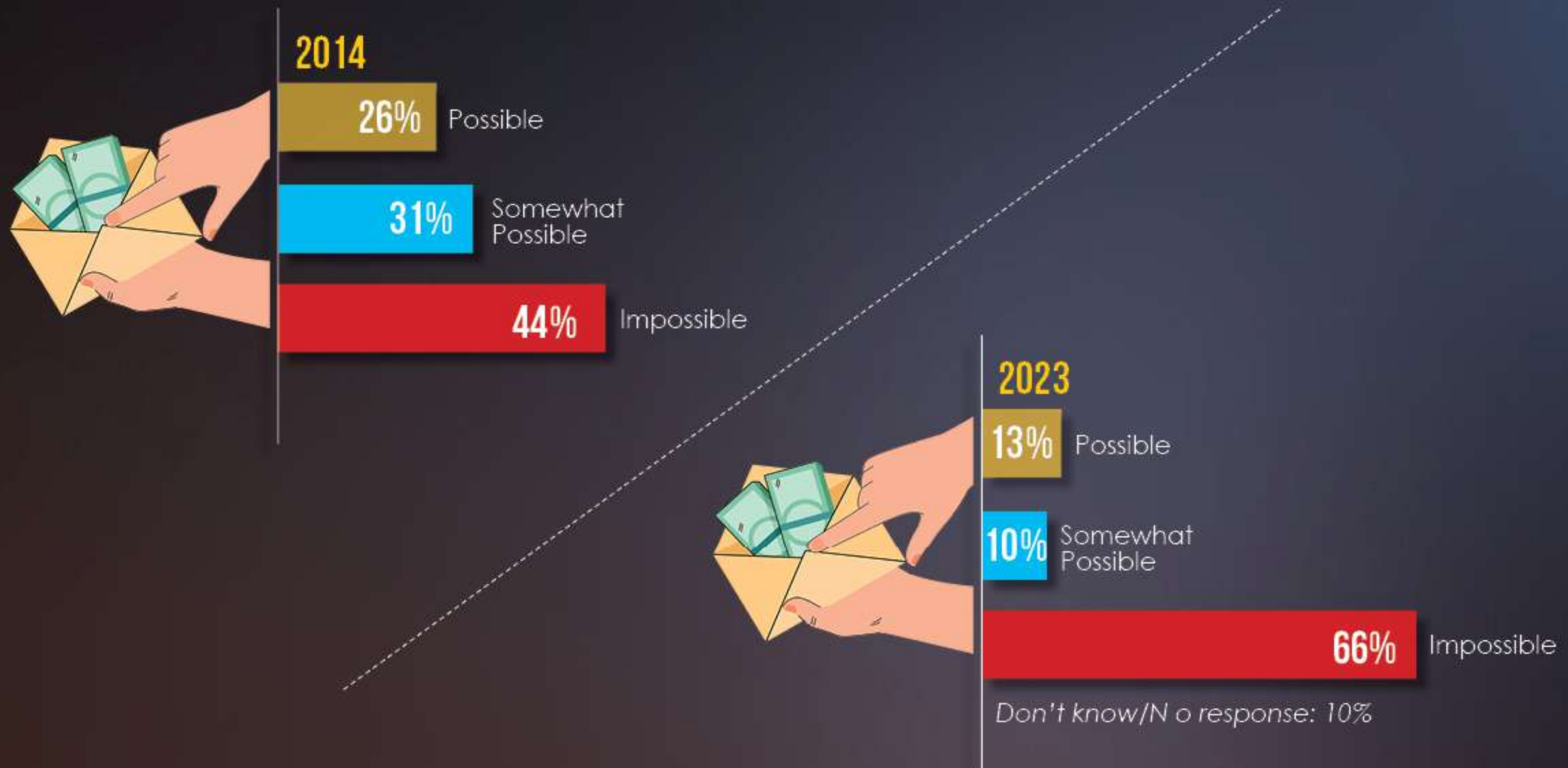

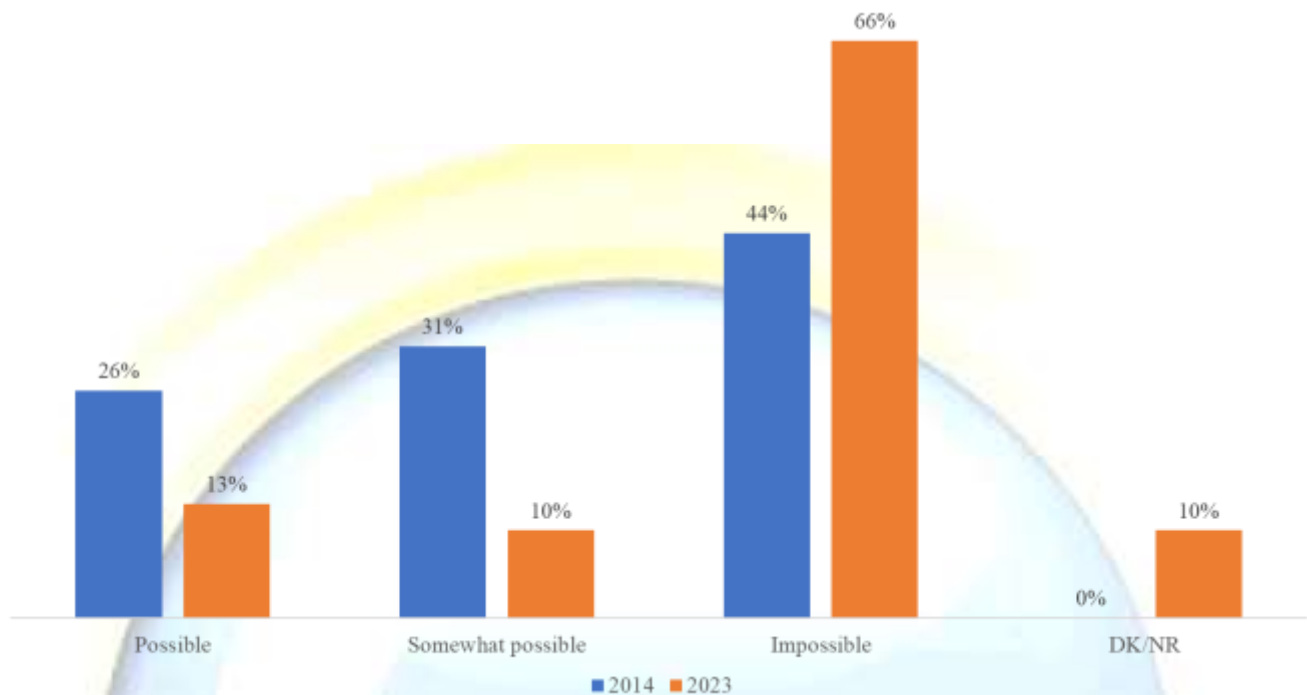
In a Gallup & Gilani Pakistan National Survey conducted in the year 2014, a representative sample of adult men and women from across Pakistan was asked the following question, “Akram is a businessman. For success of his business, he has to work with government departments. Do you think it is possible for him to get his job done without bribes and recommendations?” In response to this question, 26% said possible, 31% said somewhat possible, while 44% said impossible.

Comparative Picture: This question was asked again in 2023 to allow a comparison to be made across the years. In 2023, 13% said working with government departments would be possible without bribes and recommendations, 10% said it was somewhat possible, 66% it was impossible and 10% either did not respond or did not know.

Trend Analysis: The proportion of people who think it is impossible to work successfully with government departments without bribes and recommendations has increased by 22% from 2014 to 2023. While those who believe it is possible or somewhat possible have decreased by 34%.

This press release has been made as part of the Gallup Pakistan History Project which aims to release historical empirical polling data to wider audiences. The objective is to sustain and encourage empirical decision-making in Pakistan.

The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1535 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted during 29 March to 07 April 2023. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI)

Aim and Rationale for Gallup Pakistan History Project
