38% Pakistanis believe women have less job opportunities than men in Pakistan: Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

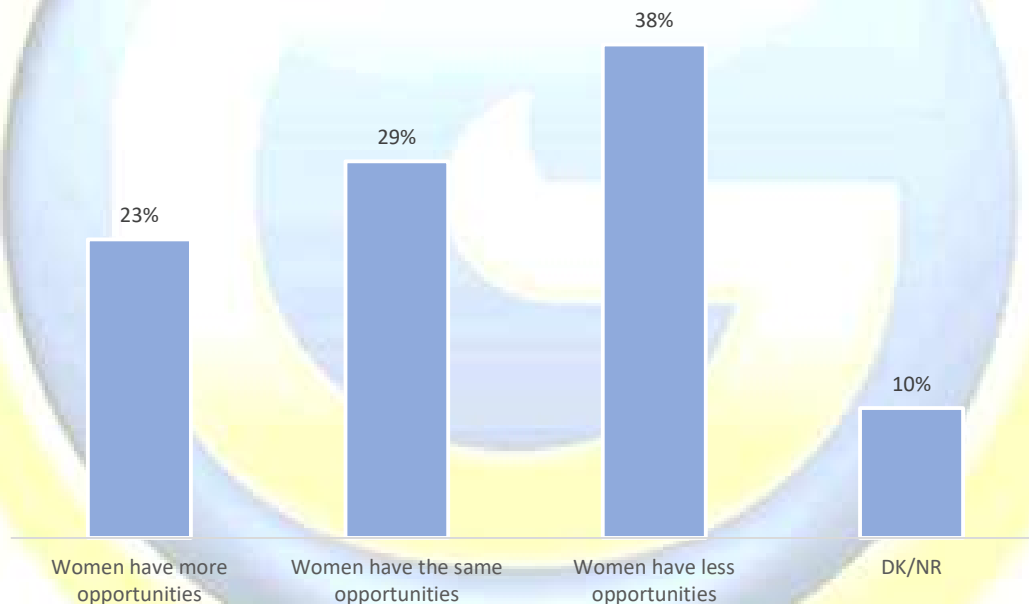

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 38% Pakistanis believe women have less job opportunities than men in Pakistan.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the country, was asked the question “*In your Country, do you think women have the same opportunities, more opportunities or less opportunities than men in job opportunities and career?*”

In response, 23% said women have more opportunities, 29% said women have the same opportunities, 38% said women have less opportunities, and 10% said they do not know or gave no response.

The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 2091 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted during 16 November to 29 November 2022. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI)
