

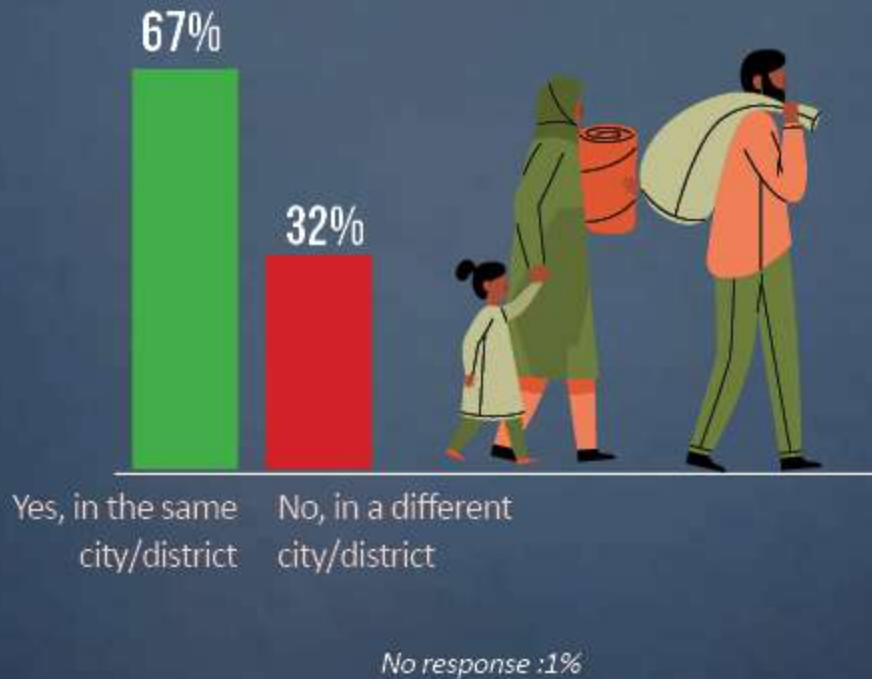

32% married Pakistanis reported to have migrated after marriage, while 67% still resided in the same city/district as before: Gallup & Gilani Pakistan.

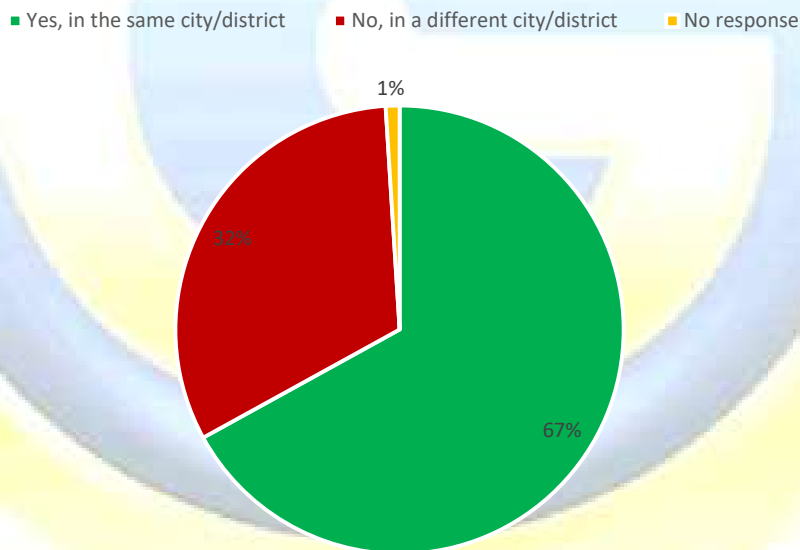

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 32% married Pakistanis reported to have migrated after marriage, while 67% still resided in the same city/district as before.

A nationally representative sample of married adult men and women from across the country, was asked the question “Please tell me, do you still reside in the same city/district where you resided at the time of your marriage?” In response, 67% said yes, in the same city/district, 32% said no, in a different city/district, and 1% gave no response.

The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 929 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted during 07 July to 16 July 2023. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI).
