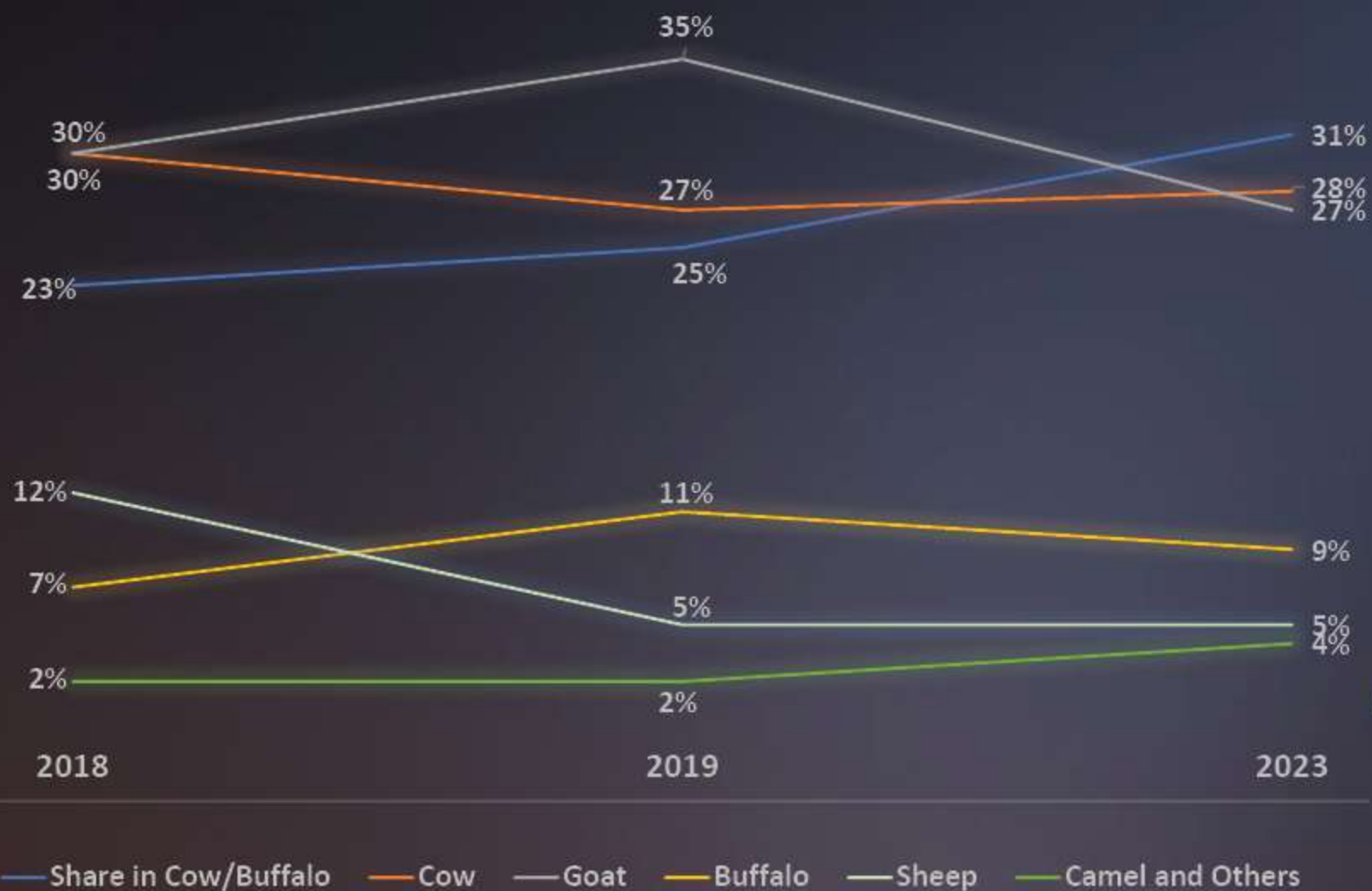


Since 2018, getting a share in cow / buffalo has become more popular on occasion of Eid ul Azha, with 31% of Pakistanis opting to do so in 2023

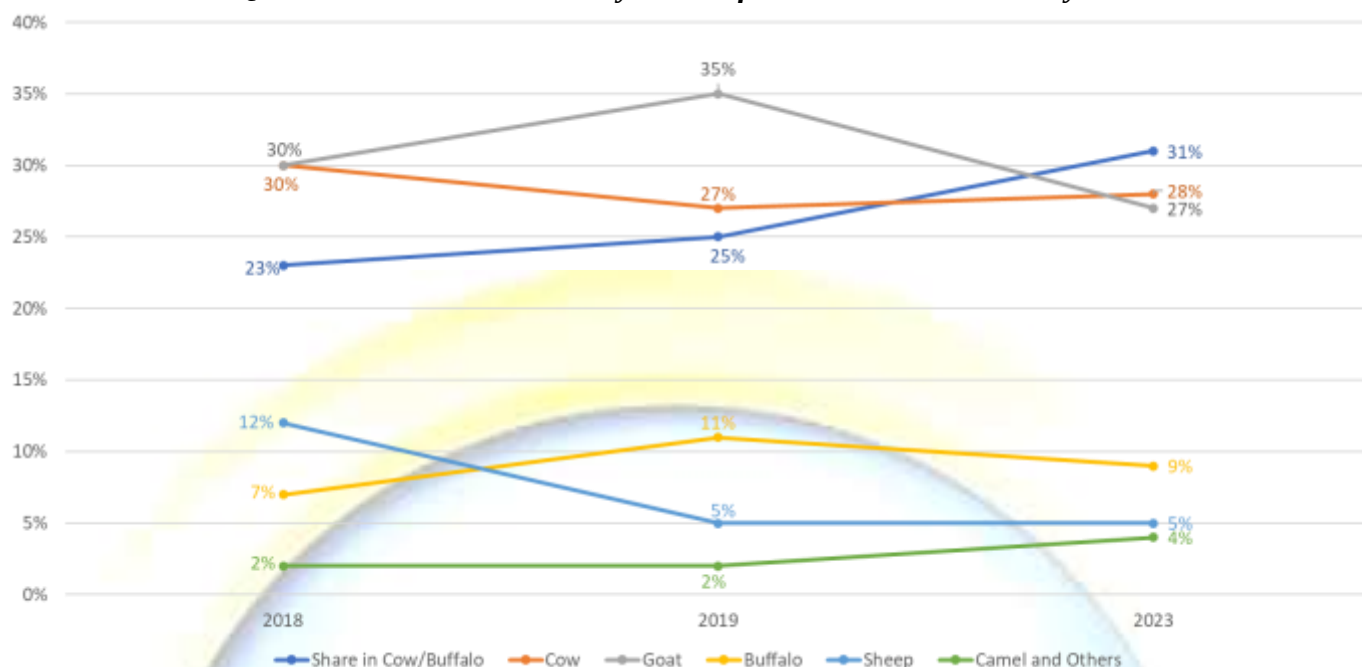
In a Gallup & Gilani Pakistan National Survey conducted in the year 2018, a representative sample of adult men and women from across Pakistan was asked the following question, “*What animal did you sacrifice on Eid-Adha this year?*” In response to this question, 23% Share in a cow/buffalo, 30% said Cow, 30% said Goat, 7% said Buffalo, 12% said Sheep, and 2% said Camel or Others.

Comparative Picture: This question was asked again in 2023 to allow a comparison to be made across the years. In 2023, 31% Share in a cow/buffalo, 28% said Cow, 27% said Goat, 9% said Buffalo, 5% said Sheep, and 4% said Camel or Others.

Trend Analysis: The proportion of people who say that they sacrificed a share in cow/buffalo have increased by 8% from 2018 to 2023, while those sacrificing a cow have decreased by 2%, those sacrificing a goat have decreased by 3%, those sacrificing a buffalo, and camel or other animals have both increased by 2%, while those sacrificing a sheep have decreased by 7%,

This press release has been made as part of the Gallup Pakistan History Project which aims to release historical empirical polling data to wider audiences. The objective is to sustain and encourage empirical decision-making in Pakistan.

The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 929 men and women across urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted during 07 July to 16 July, 2023. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 3\text{-}5$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI).

Aim and Rationale for Gallup Pakistan History Project

Bilal I Gilani, who is Executive Director at Gallup Pakistan, and the Director of Gallup Pakistan History Project explains the aim of the Project as follows: “Gallup Pakistan has been polling in Pakistan since 1979 (over 40 years). During this time, millions of Pakistanis have been surveyed by over a thousand interviewers of Gallup. In 2014, Gallup Pakistan has decided to release historical Public Opinion data and this Press Release is part of Gallup Pakistan’s History Project.
