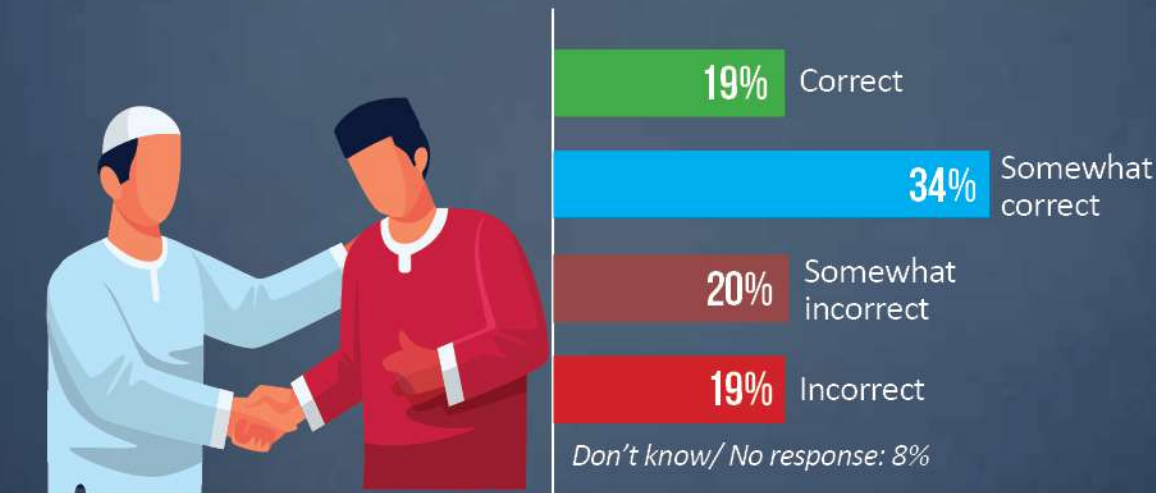

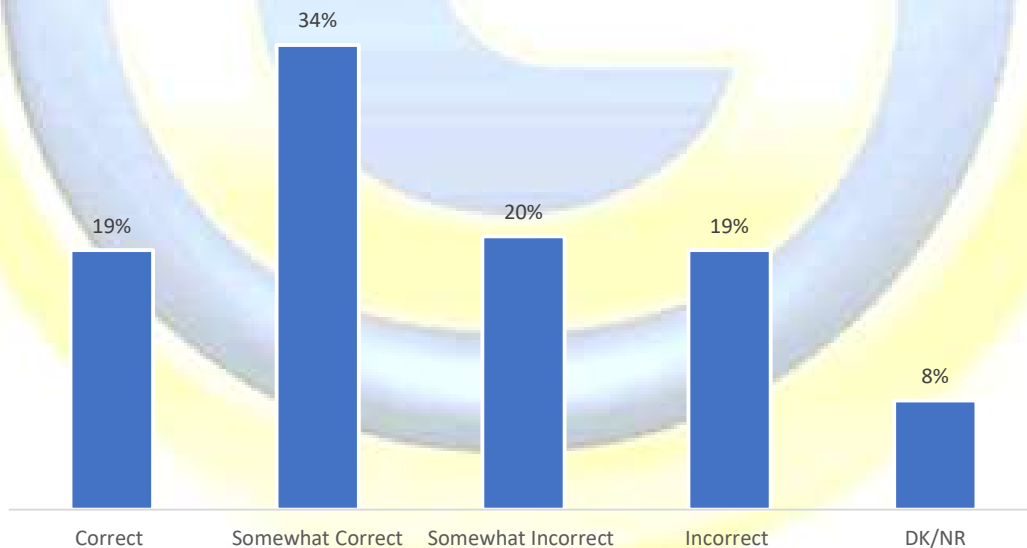

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, almost 1 in 4 Pakistanis find fault with practice of giving money to organizations for qurbani instead of doing qurbani on their own.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the country, was asked the question “To what extent is the following practice regarding sacrifice (Qurbani) traditions correct or incorrect? - Giving money to an organization instead of sacrificing at home?” In response, 19% said correct, 34% said somewhat correct, 20% said somewhat incorrect, 19% said incorrect, and 8% said that they don’t know or gave no response.

The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 929 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted during 07 July to 16 July 2023. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI).
