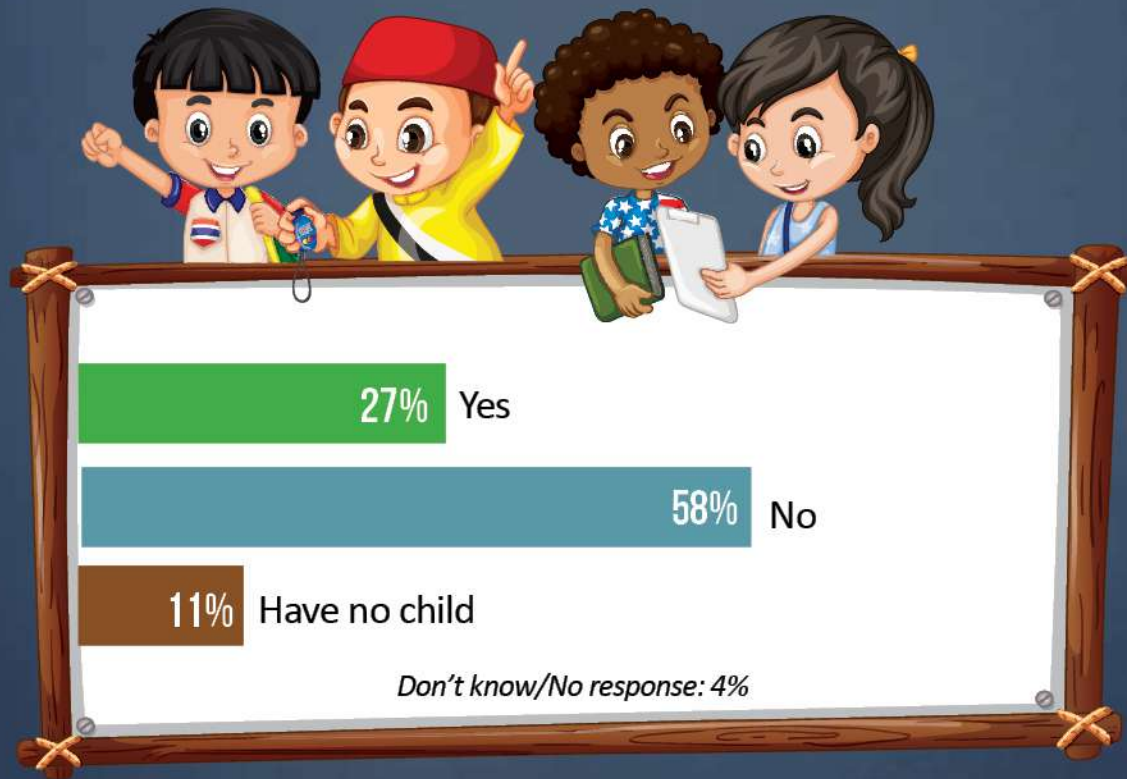

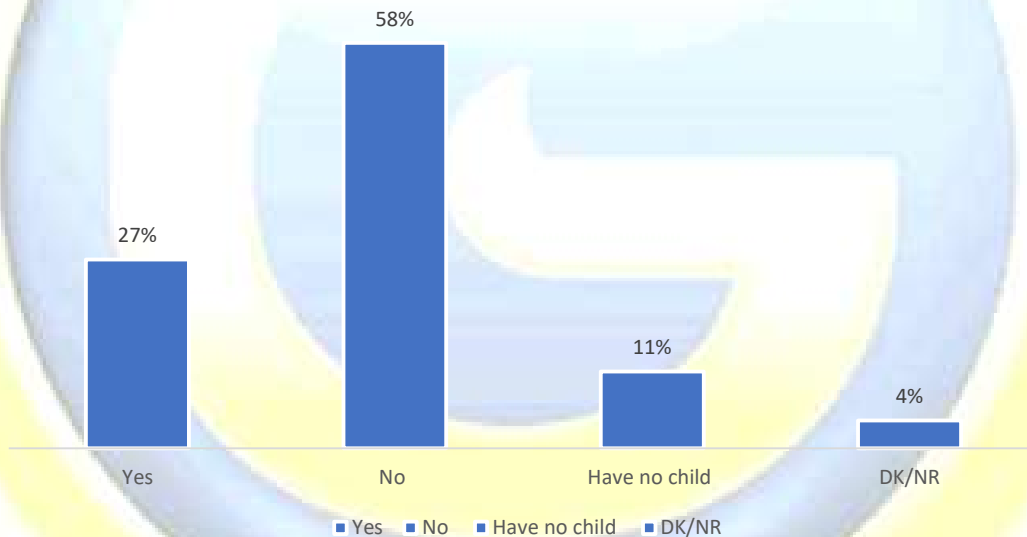
### 58% Pakistani parents unfazed by exhaustion from children in the holidays: Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

*(Islamabad), September 5<sup>th</sup>, 2023*

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 58% Pakistani parents unfazed by exhaustion from children in the holidays.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the country, was asked the question “Some people say that parents get tired of their children during the holidays. Do you feel the same?” In response, 27% said yes, 58% said no, 11% said have no child and 4% said they do not know or gave no response.

The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 929 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted during 07 July to 16 July 2023. The error margin is estimated to be approximately  $\pm 2-3$  percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI).

## **STAT OF THE DAY**

**Distance to school has long been a **barrier** to accessing education in Pakistan, particularly for girls in rural areas. Following the flooding, **16 percent** of households report that their commutes remain disrupted.**
