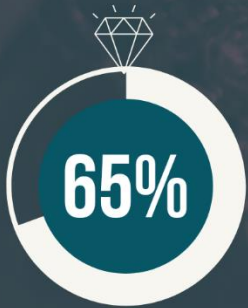
Executive Summary

Gallup Pakistan Report on Marriage July 2023

“Consanguine marriages still prevalent but form an inverse relation with household income in Pakistan”



3 out of 4 Pakistanis aged 18 and above are married



Nearly twice as many individuals (65%) are married within their families than those married outside the family (34%).



59% Pakistanis report meeting their spouse before marriage, moreover, 32% migrated to different cities/districts after marriage



While parents have a high decision power (86%) when it comes to family marriages, 79% Pakistanis willingly agreed to marriages within family.



Between 90-94% Pakistanis report being quite satisfied with their spouse across a variety of criteria.



DETAILED FINDINGS OF THE SURVEY ARE BELOW

1. Perceptions about marriage

- a. Over **3 out of 4** adult Pakistanis report they are married, while only **23%** are unmarried.
- b. **Consanguine marriages** (i.e., marriages in the family) continue to be a prevalent practice. **65%** Pakistanis married within their families, while only **34%** married outside them. An inverse relation can be observed against household income, where marriages within families decrease as household income increases.
- c. Amongst consanguine marriages, **74%** were **with first cousins**. This was highest in the province of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa at **85%**, and lowest in Balochistan at **28%**.
- d. Parents have significant influence in the decision to marry within the family, as **86%** of consanguineous marriages were reportedly arranged by the parents' decision, while **12%** were by the individual's own decision.
- e. Regardless of family marriages being the parents' decision, **85%** males and **73%** females willingly agreed to the marriage.
- f. While **59%** of married persons had met their spouse before marriage, **40%** had not. No stark contrast was observed across the urban-rural divide, however, only **25%** of married Pakistanis from Balochistan had met their spouse before marriage; lowest across all provinces.
- g. **32%** Pakistanis migrated after marriage, while **67%** still reside in the same city/district as before. Migration after marriage was higher amongst females at **39%** compared to **25%** in males.

2. Married life and opinion about spouse.

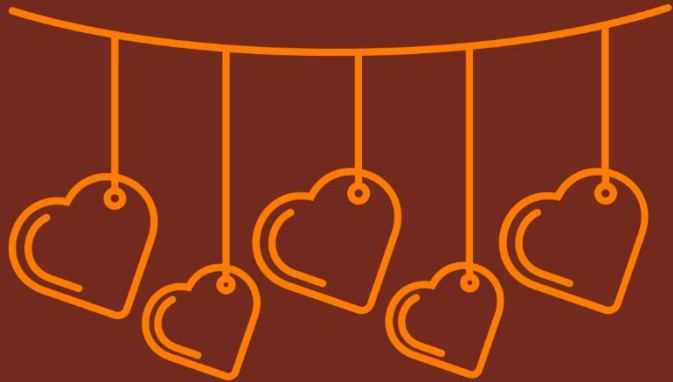
- a. When it came to helping out with chores and work, **92%** of married individuals were satisfied with their spouse. However, dissatisfaction rose alongside household income.
- b. **93%** of married Pakistanis felt satisfied with their spouse's treatment of them with dignity and respect.



- c. Regarding help in financial matters, **90%** of Pakistanis felt satisfied with their spouse. The proportion of dissatisfied individuals was higher in KPK and Balochistan at **18%** and **14%** respectively.
- d. **94%** of married Pakistanis felt satisfied with their understanding of their spouse and vice versa.
- e. When it came to upholding their spouse's responsibilities **94%** Pakistanis felt satisfied, while only **6%** felt dissatisfied. Dissatisfaction regarding this matter was higher in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Balochistan at **11%** and **7%** respectively.

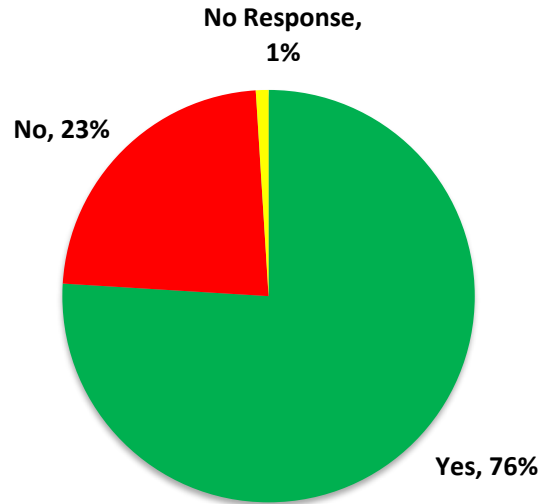

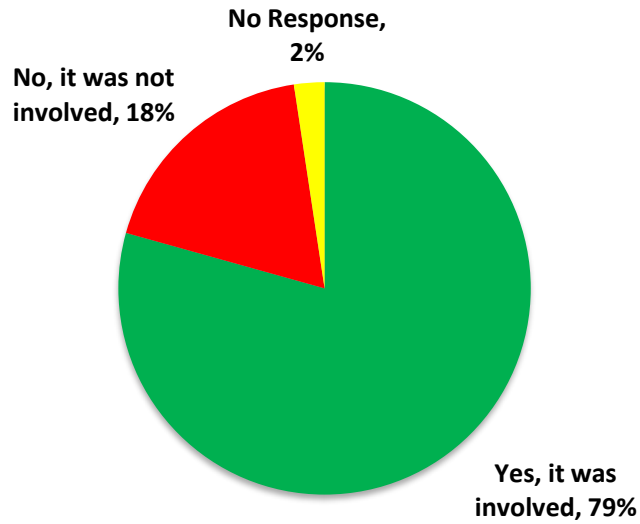

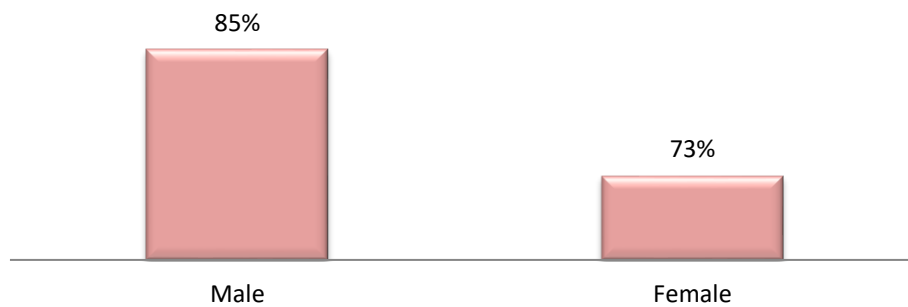
Question: Was your own choice involved in the decision to marry within the family?*

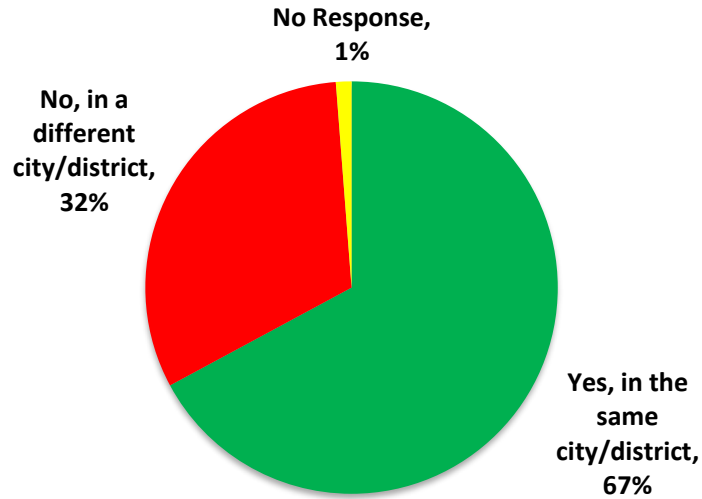

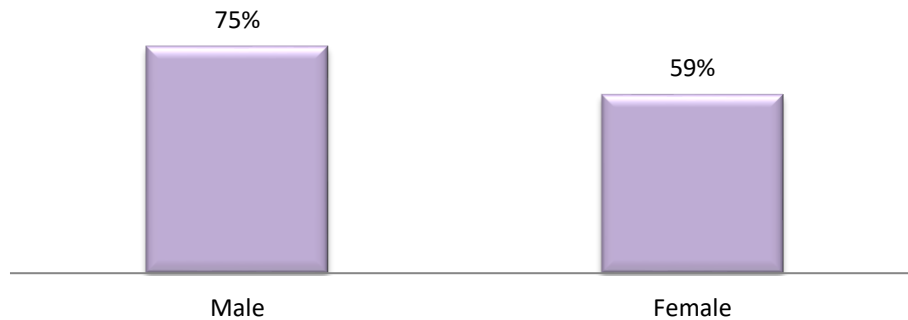

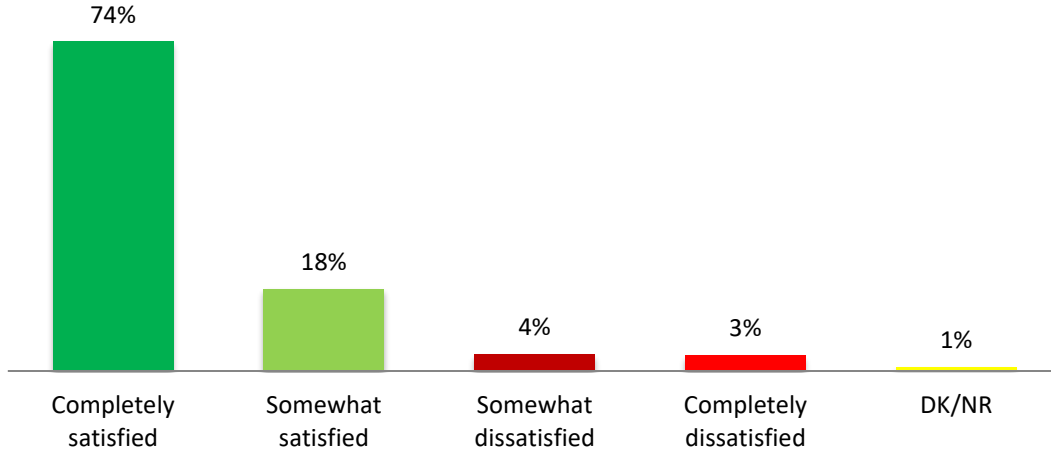

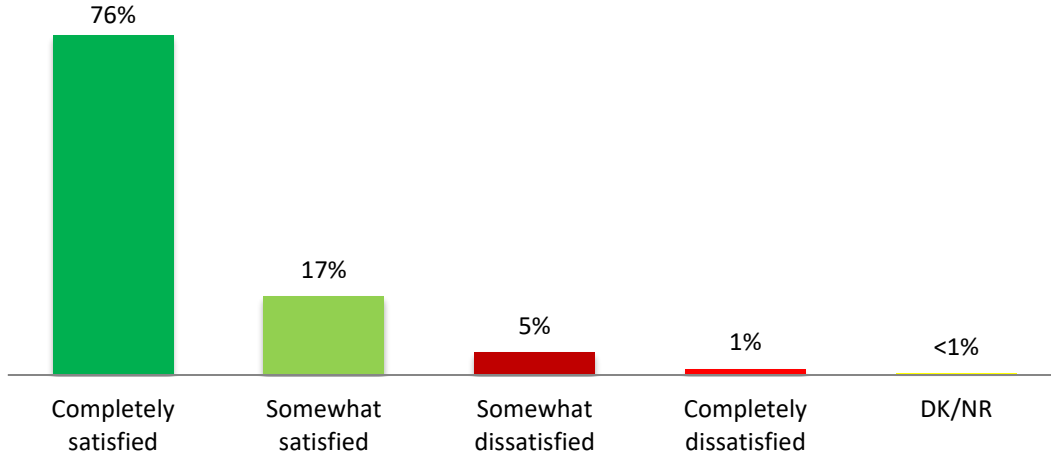

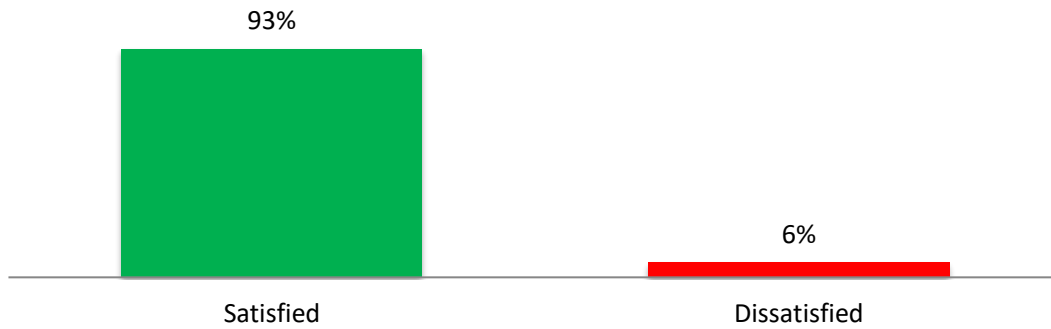

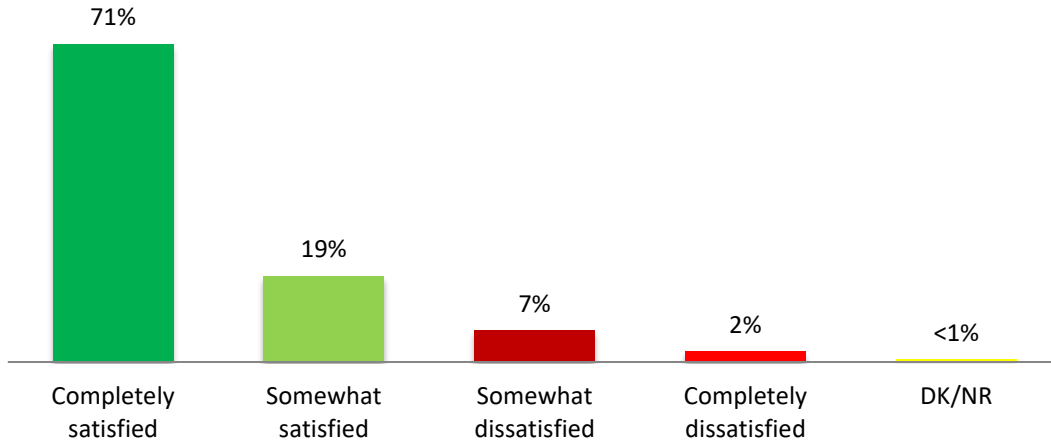

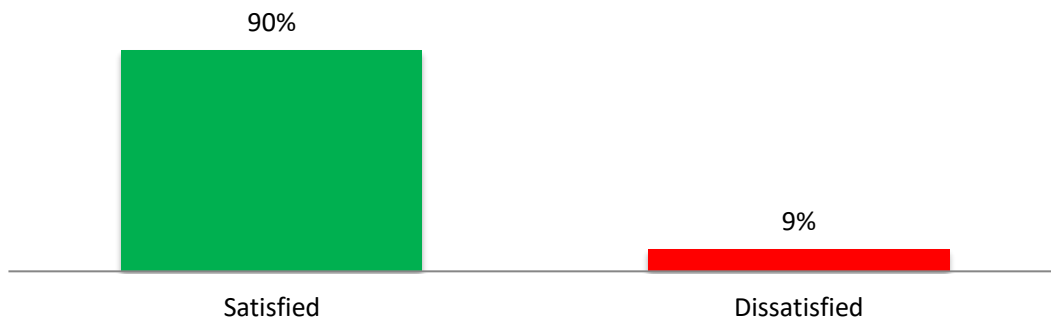

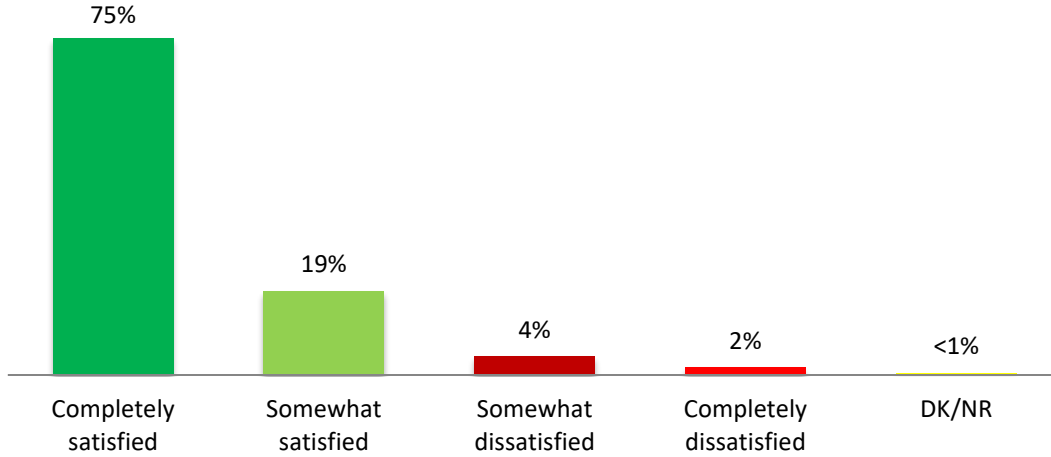

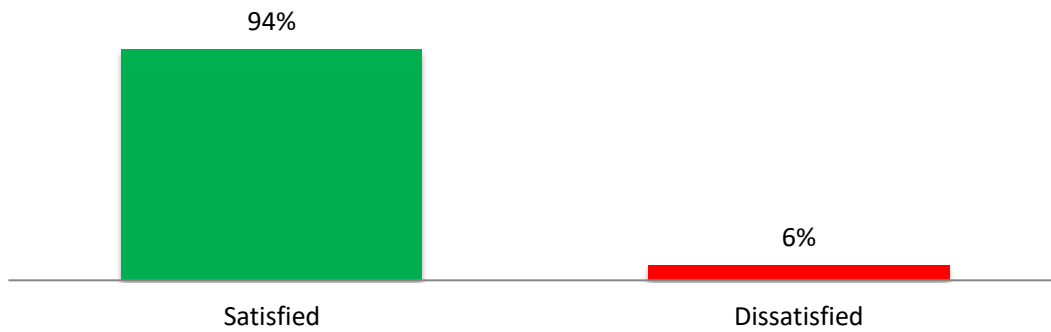

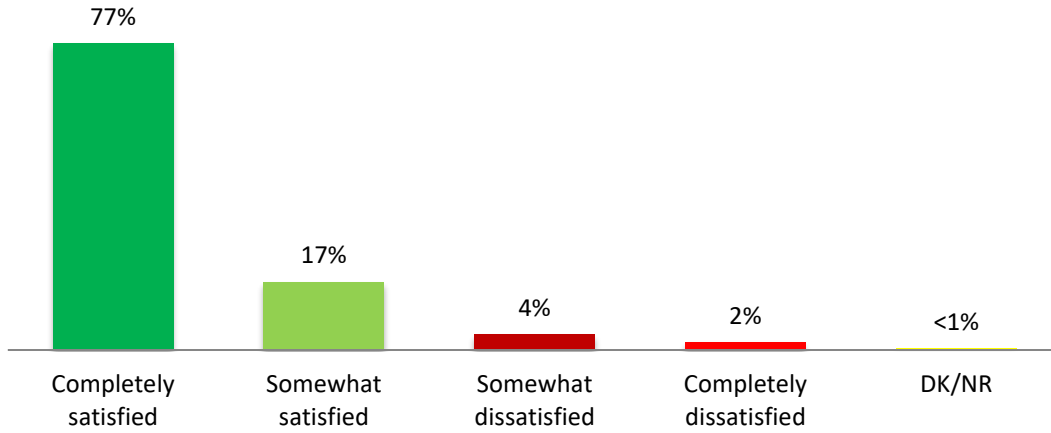

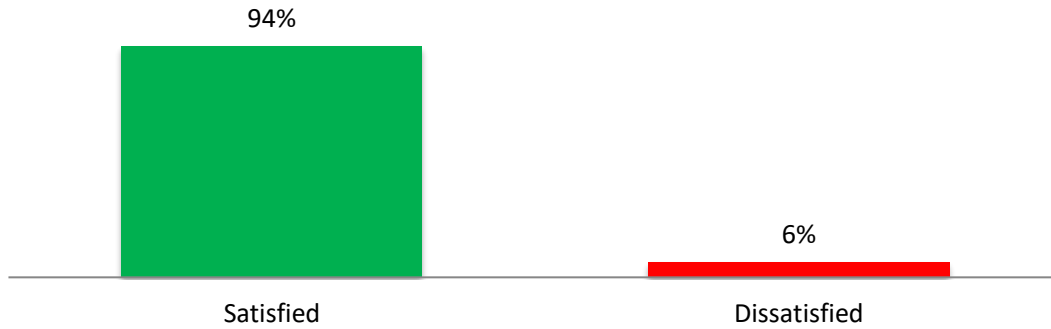

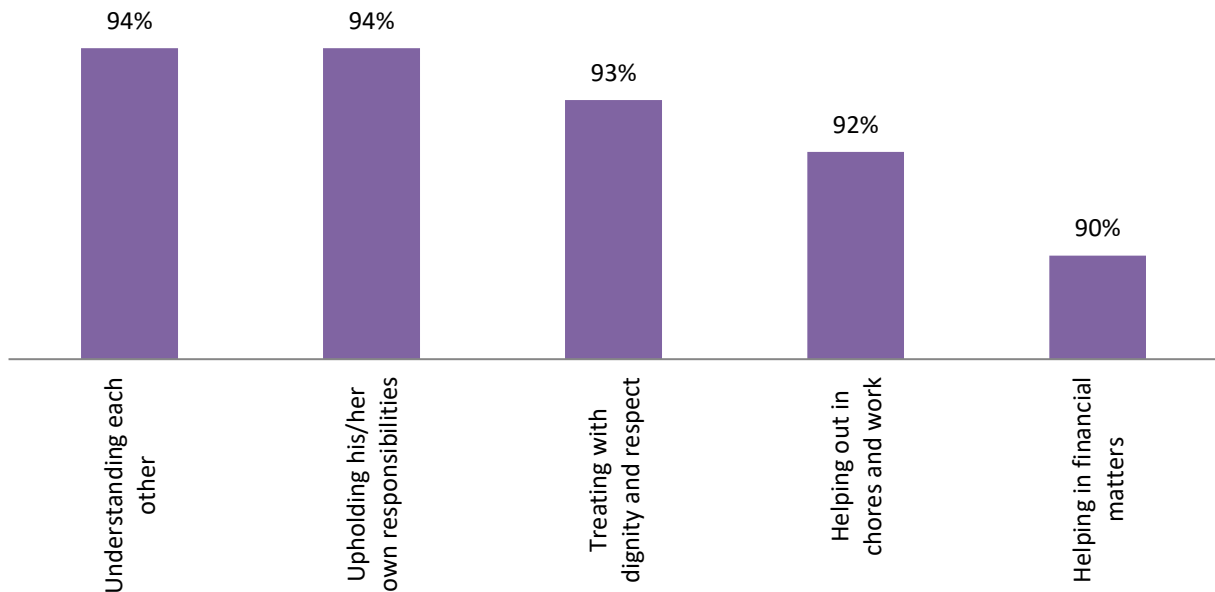

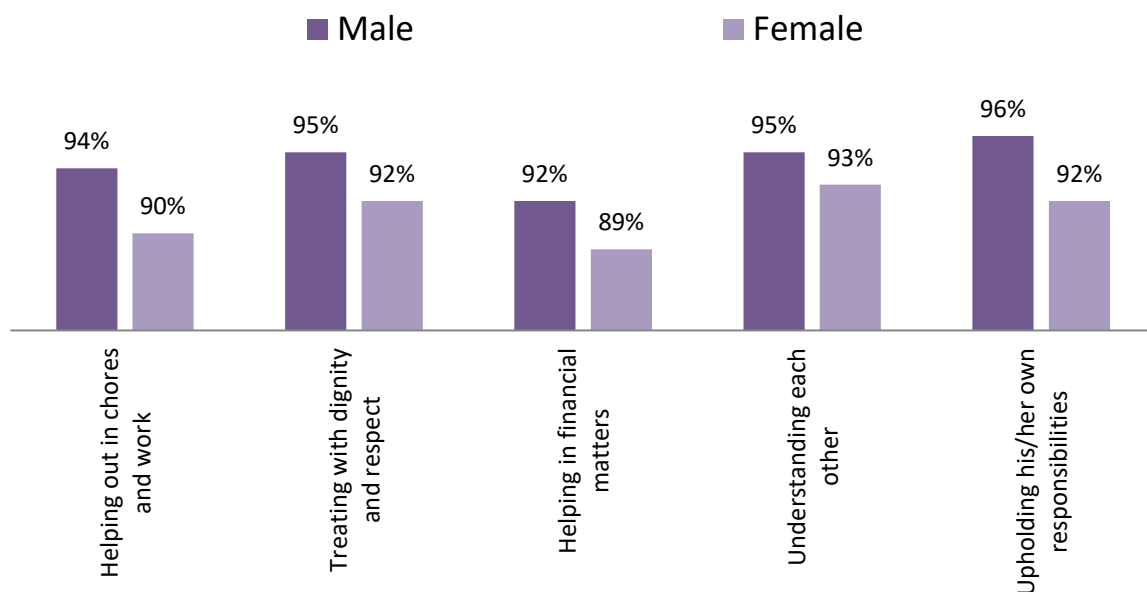
SATISFACTORY OPINION ABOUT THEIR SPOUSE

A- Sample Profile

The survey was conducted with more than 929 men and women statistically selected from all four provinces comprising of a cross section of age, and socio-economic classes as given below:

B- Sample Selection Procedure & Application for CATI

Gallup Pakistan's usual approach of fieldwork is conducting face-to-face interviews in households using geographical sampling. The sampling is done using the census as the frame. Due to coronavirus lockdown, as well as health and safety concerns, we have halted all face-to-face interviews, therefore CATI methodology has been employed.

This methodology uses Random Digit Dialling approach where all mobile phone numbers in Pakistan (130 million active sims) are the universe.

Mobile Phone Surveys

As stated previously, random digit dialling (RDD) will be used to sample participants for mobile phone interviews. According to the Pakistan Telecommunication Authority the market share of the 4 telecom providers in Pakistan (in terms of active working numbers) are: PMCL Jazz (37.8%), Telenor (27.1%), CMPAK Zong (22.0%), and PTML Ufone (13.1%). Market share will be used to allocate the sample across providers. For example, 37.8% of numbers will be randomly from PMCL Ufone. Such an allocation is feasible to make because each of the 4 telecom providers has been assigned a pre-set exchange number followed by an 8-digit mobile number. It is not possible to further stratify the phone numbers by province. Such stratification would also have little meaning because someone could purchase a phone in one province and use it in another.

A 5% response rate among phone numbers contacted for a mobile phone interview is anticipated. This means that for 5 successful interviews, we generated 100 numbers to contact. To reach the target sample size for mobile phone interviews, approximately 50,000 phone numbers were generated.

Phone numbers will be randomly assigned to interviewers at the decentralized call. Interviewers will ask the province of the participant to facilitate sample allocation across provinces. Data will be monitored by study investigators to ensure the planned allocation of participants across provinces is met. Once a province has reached its target sample size, no further interviews will be conducted with people from the province.

Exclusion in sample: According to PSLM (a government survey), 90% of households in Pakistan claim someone in their household owns a mobile phone. This means that 10% households are excluded from the sample.

Mobile phone survey procedures and methods

Interviewers will begin by calling a randomly generated number. Each number will be called until the phone is answered or up to three times. Data will be collected using Survey CTO.

C- Fieldwork Procedure

- **Briefing/Training of interviewers:**

The Questionnaire Designed for the survey is briefed to the interviewers at Regional Centers across the Centre. The interviewers are instructed on measures such as:

1. Following Sampling/Quota Instructions Properly
2. Ethical Code of Conduct towards interviewers
3. Following skipping Instructions and other interview instructions on the Questionnaire
4. Maintaining Neutrality in asking Question

- **Mock Calls:**

After the briefing is completed all the field workers do the mock calls under the direct supervision of an executive or a fieldwork supervisor. This ensures that the field workers properly understand the instructions and they can handle various interviewing problems during the interview (*in the field*). After completion of mock calls, a debriefing session is arranged in which the problems faced by the interviewers during the mock interviews are discussed and solutions are suggested.

- **Initial Checking:**

After the training, the interviewers go into the field for actual interviewing. The first ten filled in questionnaires of every interviewer are thoroughly checked by their supervisor to ensure that the interviewer is performing well. In case the work of an interviewer is not acceptable he/she is disengaged from the survey.

- **Field Editor or Intake Edit:**

In normal routine at least 30-40 interviews of each interviewer are visually checked by the supervisor before passing them to Data Coding/Entry department. The problems or missing information identified during field edit are explained to the relevant interviewer and he/she is instructed to rectify them either through telephone and/or revisit the respondent for clarification and re-asking the missing questions.

- **Supervision & Back Checking:**

It is essential that the interviewers are properly supervised on the job and the work done by them is back checked. At least 20% back checking is done on work completed by each interviewer to ensure authenticity of data.

- **Data Coding/Editing:**

About 20% work of each coder is rechecked and verified by the concerned DC Supervisor/In-charge.

D- Data Entry and Verification

GP's Quality Manual contains a detailed checklist on the handling control, entry and other steps involved in the management of data.

Once all the responses are received from the mobile phone surveys, they are checked, and the responses of open-ended questions are coded with the help of a code list. A coding scheme/book/guide is prepared on the basis of these questionnaires.

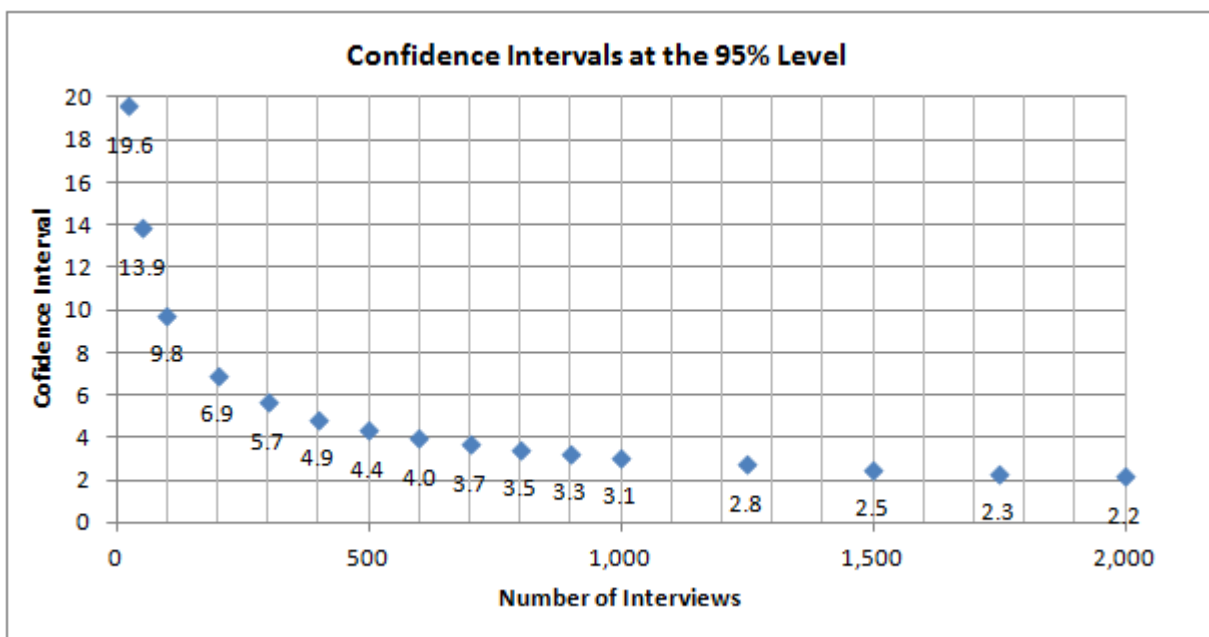
After the coding of open-ended responses, data is entered into computers. GP uses the SPSS data entry program that has flexibility to implement validity checks and skipping rules etc. The SPSS data entry software also has flexibility to verify the entered data by using the double punch options. Gallup normally double punches for 20% of its entered data.

After completion of data entries and double punch, all data is cleaned by using a data-cleaning program written in SPSS which is customized for every project according to the survey/questionnaire needs. Data is thoroughly checked for an omission, displacements and other error resulting in inconsistencies with the coding scheme.

Note on Sample Size

The sample size used in this survey is quite adequate even in comparison to international standards. Gallup US Daily poll is 500 and the Gallup Poll Social Series is 1000, both having track record of reliable predictability for USA (a country nearly 100 million larger in population of Pakistan). According to Five Thirty-Eight, one of the most credible sources on polling in the US: "Surveying 2,000 voters substantially reduces error compared with surveying 400 of them, but surveying 10,000 voters will produce only marginal improvements in accuracy compared with the 2,000- person survey".

Obviously, choosing a higher confidence interval will give greater accuracy to the survey results, however, as the chart below shows, at a certain point the benefits of conducting more surveys begins to tail off:



25 interviews has a confidence interval of 19.6 and 100 interviews has a confidence interval of 9.8, whilst it falls to 4.4 at 500 interviews and 3.1 at 1000 interviews. However, a further 1000 interviews only lowers the confidence interval by 0.9 to 2.2. A confidence interval of 1 (not shown on the graph) would require a massive 9604 interviews.

Is a larger sample always better than a smaller sample?

Larger samples are generally more precise, but sometimes not. The important rule in sampling is not how many poll respondents are selected but, instead, how they are selected. A reliable sample selects poll respondents randomly or in a manner which insures that everyone in the area being surveyed has a known chance of being selected.

How do you interpret Error Margins?

How do you interpret a margin of error? Suppose you know that 51% of people sampled say that they plan to vote for Mr X in the upcoming election. Now, projecting these results to the whole voting population, you would have to add and subtract the margin of error and give a range of possible results in order to have sufficient confidence that you're bridging the gap between your sample and the population. Supposing a margin of error of plus or minus 3 percentage points, you would be pretty confident that between 48% ($= 51\% - 3\%$) and 54% ($= 51\% + 3\%$) of the population will vote for Mr X in the election, based on the sample results. In this case, Mr X may get slightly more or slightly less than the majority of votes and could either win or lose the election. This has become a familiar situation in recent years when the media want to report results on Election Night, but based on early exit polling results, the election is "too close to call."

What Error Margins do not mean

The margin of error measures accuracy; it does not measure the amount of bias that may be present. Results that look numerically scientific and precise don't mean anything if they were collected in a biased way

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
