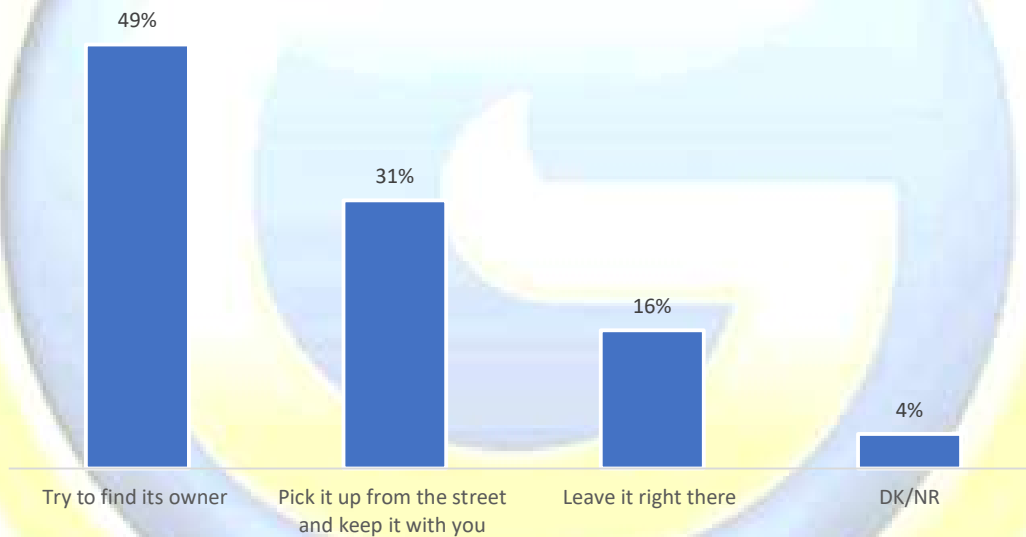
If a 100 Rupee note was found on the street and no one was around, 49% Pakistanis would try to find its owner: Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, if a 100 Rupee note was found on the street and no one was around, 49% Pakistanis would try to find its owner.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the country, was asked the question “*Suppose you find a 100 rupee note on the street and there's no one around. In that situation, what would you do?*” In response, 16% said leave it right there, 49% said try to find its owner, 31% said pick it up from the street and keep it with you, and 4% said that they do not know or gave no response.

The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 853 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted during 24 August to 28 August 2023. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI).
