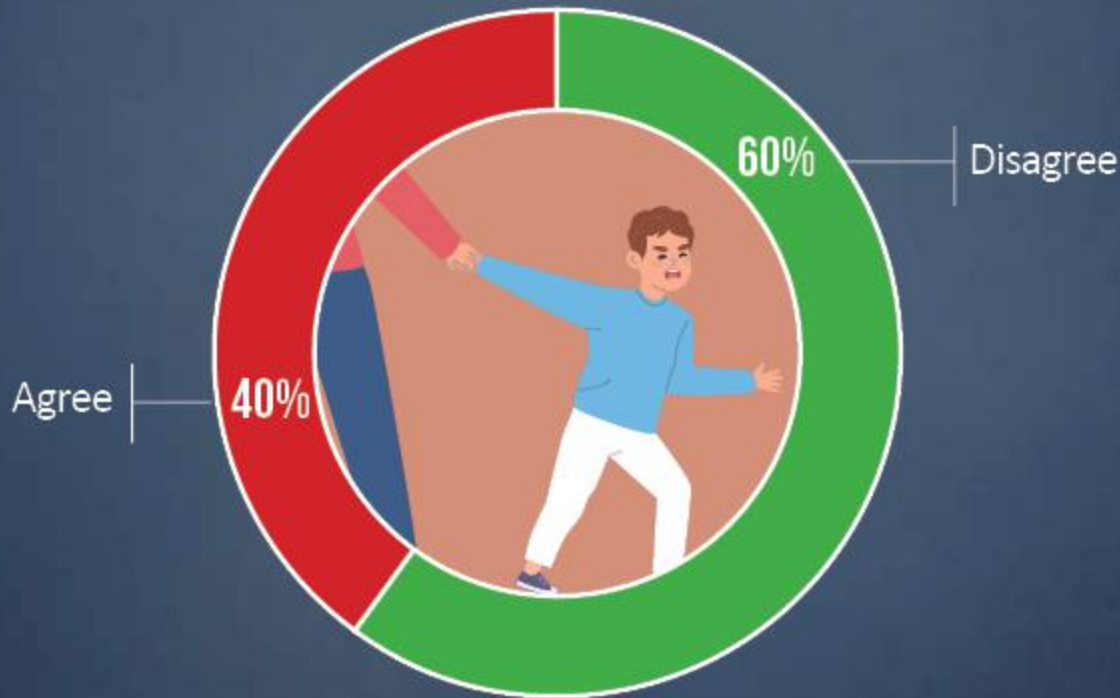

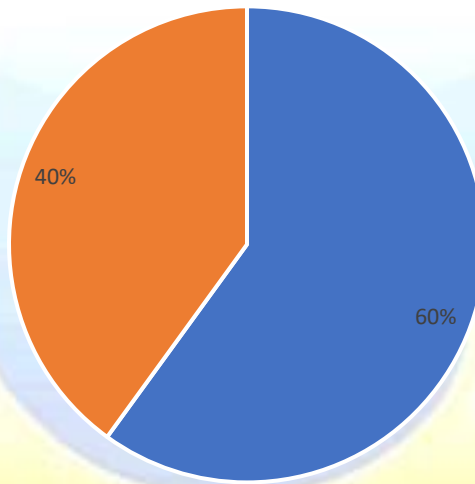
Majority Pakistanis oppose hitting children as a disciplinary measure, even in the case of misbehavior: Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

(Islamabad), October 16th, 2023

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, majority Pakistanis oppose hitting children as a disciplinary measure, even in the case of misbehavior.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the country, was asked the question “Please tell me to what extent you agree or disagree with the following statements? - If children misbehave or are disrespectful, it's okay to hit them?” In response, 60% said they disagree with the statement, and 40% said they agree with the statement.

The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gilani Research Foundation and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 853 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted during 24 August to 28 August 2023. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI).
