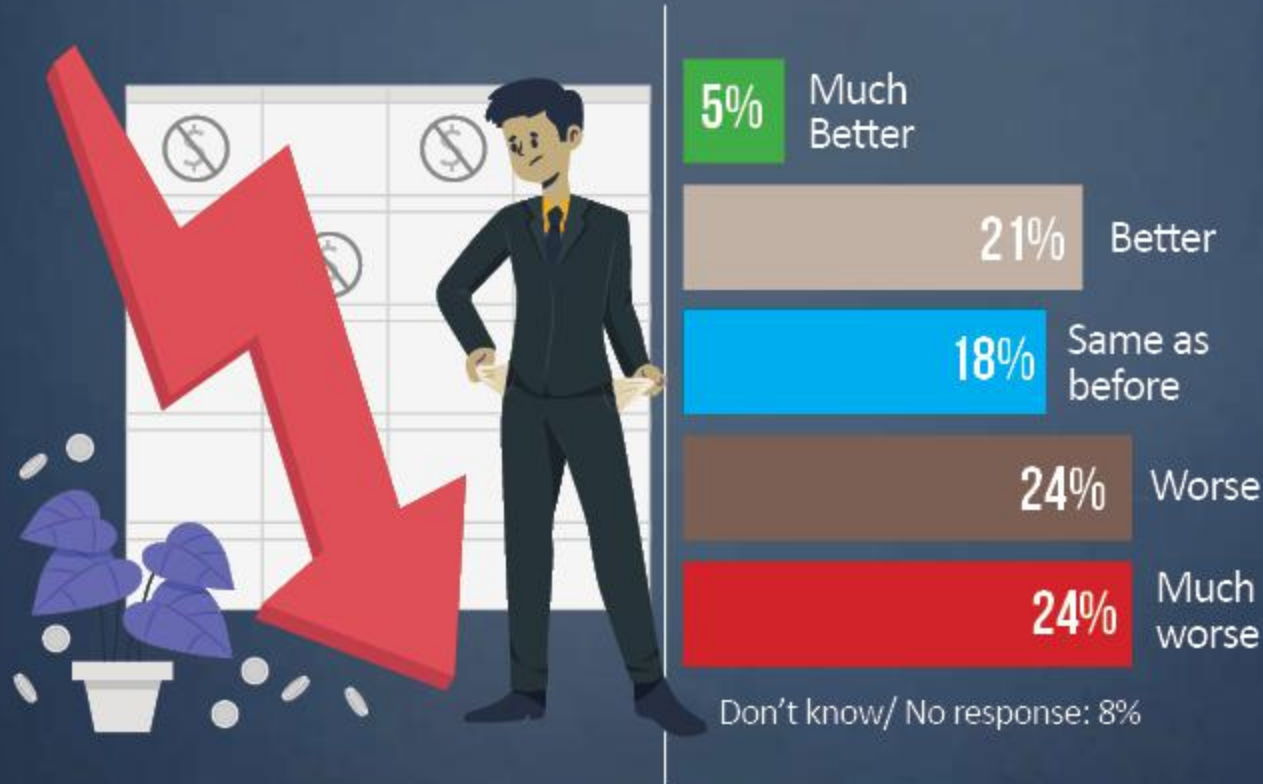

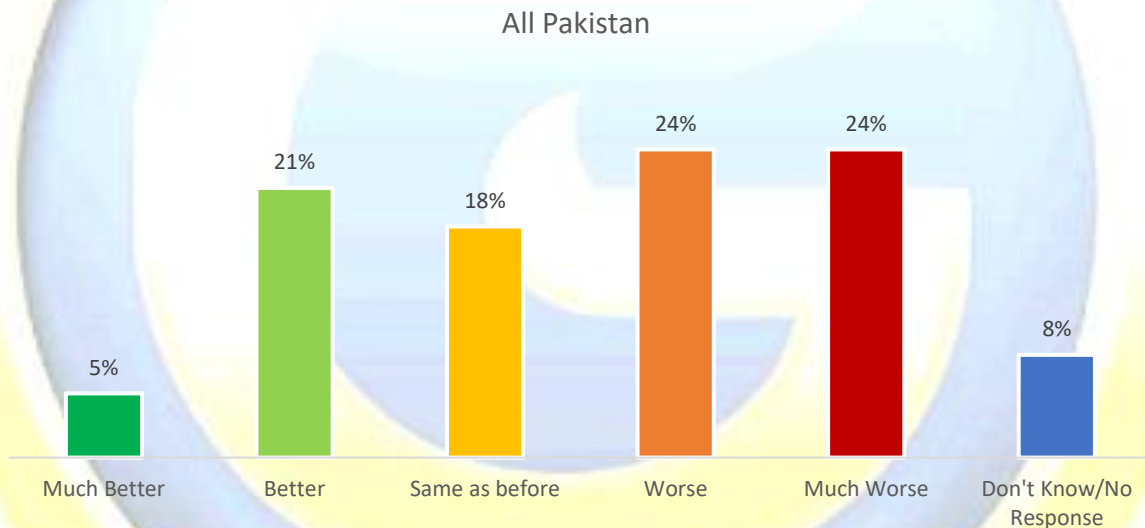
48% Pakistanis feel that next 6 months would be bad or very bad for Pakistani Economy: Gallup & Gilani Pakistan and Dun & Bradstreet Pakistan

(Islamabad), 26th October 2023

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan and Dun & Bradstreet Pakistan, 48% Pakistanis feel that next 6 months would be bad or very bad for Pakistani Economy.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the country was asked the question, “In your opinion, compared to today, how is the economic situation of the country going to be in the next six months?” In response, 5% said ‘much better’, 21% said ‘better’, 18% said ‘same as before’, 24% said ‘worse’, 24% said ‘much worse’, and 8% said that they did not know or gave no response.

The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Dun & Bradstreet Pakistan and carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1,179 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted during July 2023. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI).
