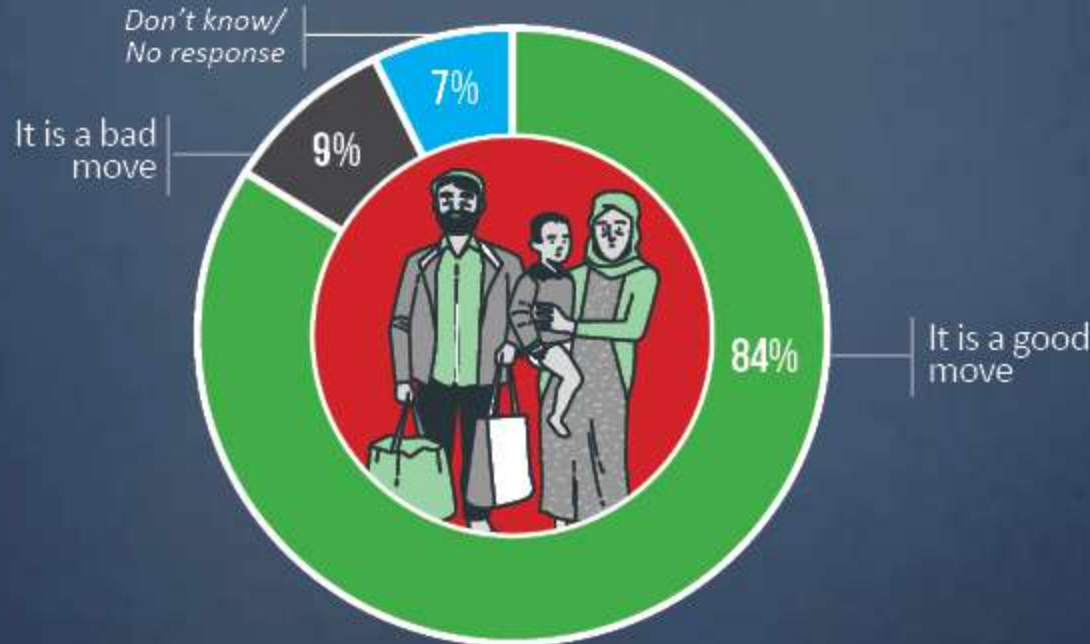

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 84% of those who were aware of the policy considered the expulsion of illegally residing Afghan refugees to be a good move by the government.

Out of a nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the country, those who were aware of the government's recent policy of expelling illegal Afghan refugees were asked the question, "Some people think that ordering the illegally residing Afghans to leave the country is a good move, on part of the government. While some people have a negative opinion of this. According to them, this is not a good move at all. What is your opinion about this decision by the government?" 84% said 'it is a good move', 9% said 'it is a bad move', and 7% said that they did not know or gave no response.

Question: "Some people think that ordering the illegally residing Afghans to leave the country is a good move, on part of the government. While some people have a negative opinion of this. According to them, this is not a good move at all. What is your opinion about this decision by the government?"

The study in Pakistan was carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 752 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted during 1st November to 4th November 2023. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 3-5$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI).
