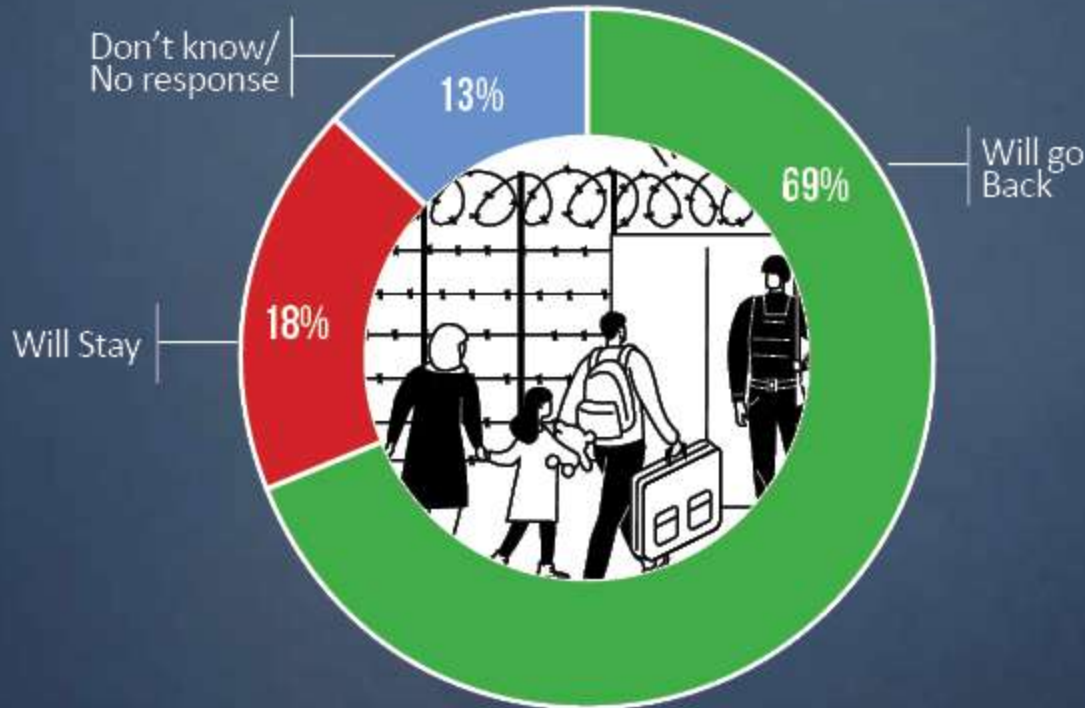

69% of respondents think that Afghans will go back to their homeland while 18% think they will stay: Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

(Islamabad), 29th November, 2023

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 69% of respondents think that Afghans will go back to their homeland while 18% think they will stay.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the country was asked the question, “As you know the government ordered the illegally residing Afghans to leave the country. Do you think that most of the Afghan refugees will return to their homeland, or do you think they will stay in Pakistan?” 69% said ‘will go back’, 18% said ‘will stay’, and 13% said that they did not know or gave no response.

The study in Pakistan was carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 752 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted during 1st November to 4th November 2023. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 3-5$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI).
