Gallup Pakistan Analysis of Survey on Israel Palestine Conflict

An overwhelming majority of Pakistanis sympathize with the Palestinians of Gaza in the midst of the ongoing Israel-Palestine Conflict – Survey on Israel Palestine Conflict

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A recent survey conducted by Gallup Pakistan has unveiled the sentiments of the public regarding the ongoing war between Israel and Palestinians of Gaza. The survey, conducted with a diverse and representative sample of the Pakistani population spread across all four provinces as well as Gilgit Baltistan and Azad Jammu & Kashmir, spanning over 100 districts revealed wide support for the Palestinians of Gaza in the midst of the ongoing war

Some key findings are:

- 1. Public's sympathies:** With regards to the ongoing conflict between Israel and Palestine, an almost unanimous (91%) proportion of Pakistanis align their sympathies with the Palestinians of Gaza, while only 2% report sympathizing with Israel.
- 2. Success in the war:** Despite the adverse conditions a majority of Pakistanis (66%) remain hopeful that Palestinians have a greater chance of success in this war between Israel and Palestine.
- 3. Role of the US government:** Nearly 7 out of 10 Pakistanis (67%) are extremely critical of the US government and feel that US has had a negative role in the ongoing Israel-Palestine war.
- 4. Pakistan's policy:** Nearly 3 out of 10 Pakistanis (31%) also do not look favorably upon the policy of their own country regarding the ongoing Israel-Palestine war.
