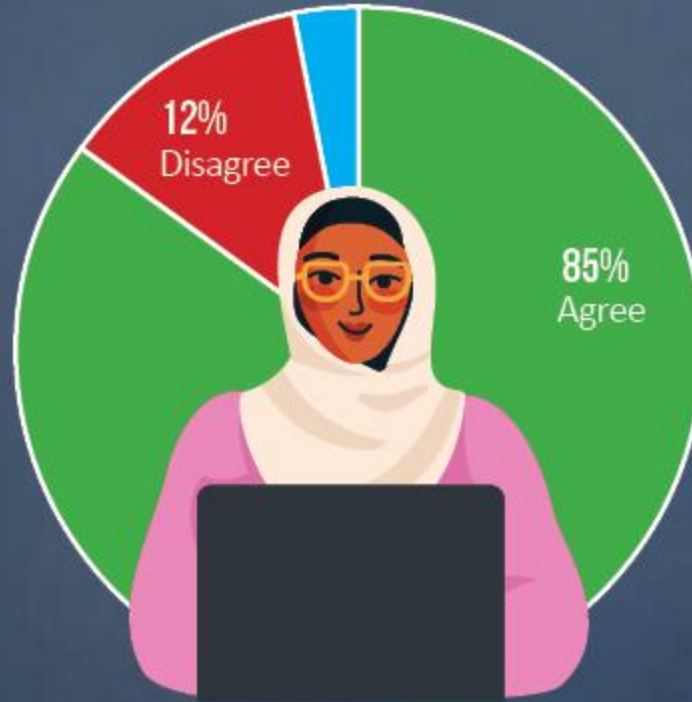

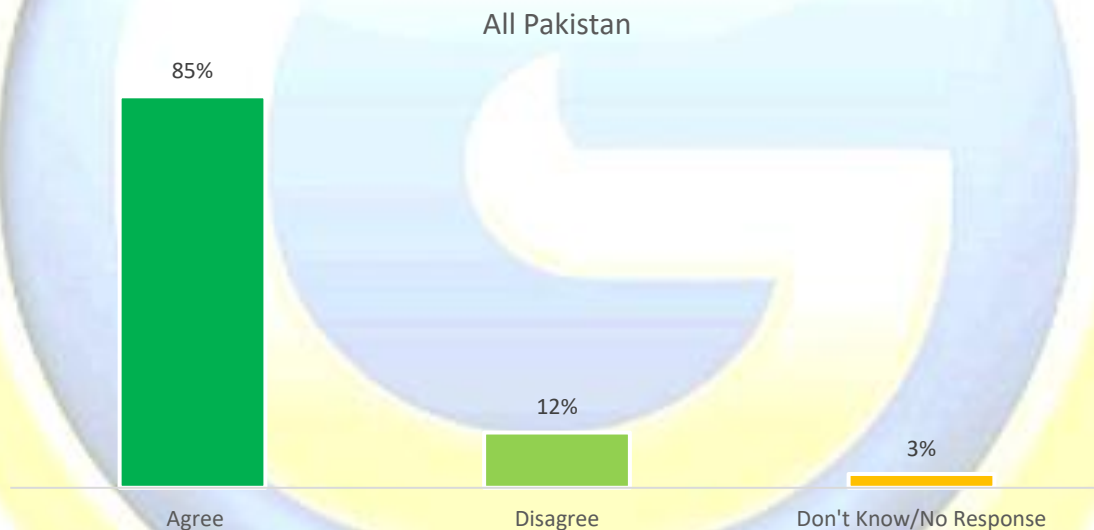
Majority (85%) of Pakistanis agree that given the current circumstances, all women are going to have to work in the future, while 12% disagree: Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, majority (85%) of Pakistanis agree that given the current circumstances, all women are going to have to work in the future, while 12% disagree.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the country was asked the question, “Please tell whether you agree or disagree with the idea that, given the current/ongoing circumstances, all women are going to have to work in the future?” In response, 85% said ‘agree’, 12% said ‘disagree’, and 3% said that they did not know or gave no response.

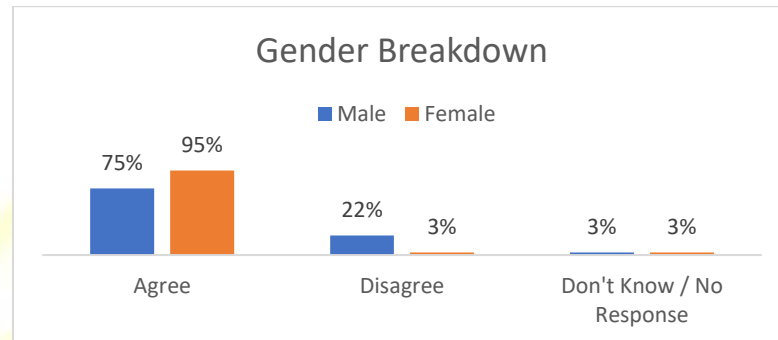
Question: Please tell whether you agree or disagree with the idea that, given the current/ongoing circumstances, all women are going to have to work in the future?

GENDER BREAKDOWN: Almost all women (95%) agree with the idea that, given the current/ongoing circumstances, all women are going to have to work in the future

Breaking down the results by gender reveal that 20% more females than males responded in the affirmative to this question.



The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1,303 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted from October 17th to November 7th 2023. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI).
