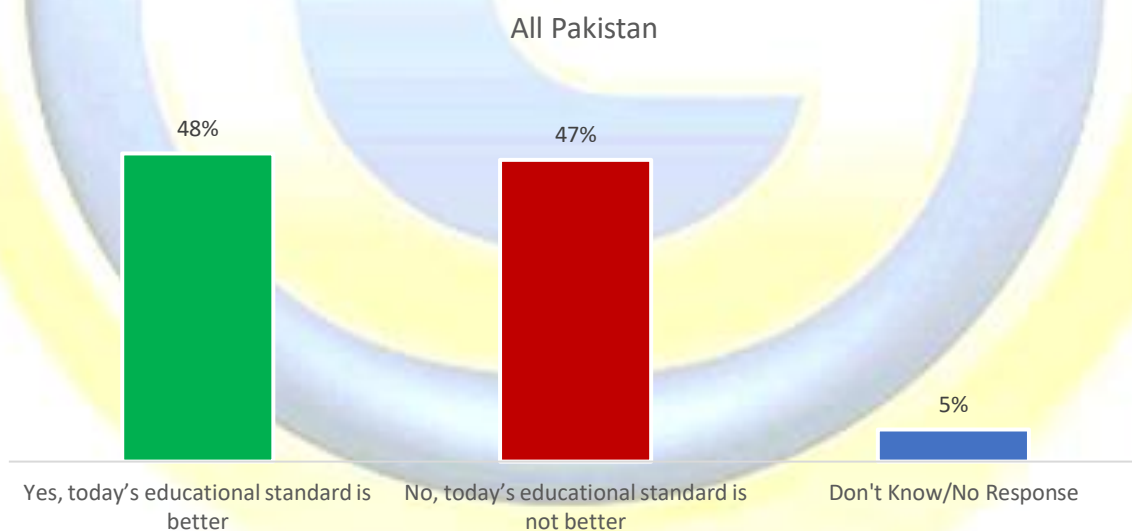
Pakistani adults are relatively evenly split between whether today's educational standard is better (48%) or worse (47%) than when they were of school-going age: Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, Pakistani adults are relatively evenly split between whether today's educational standard is better (48%) or worse (47%) than when they were of school-going age.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the country was asked the question, *"Please tell, while considering today's educational standards, do you think that today's educational standard is much better, somewhat better, somewhat worse, or much worse than the educational standard when you were in school?"* In response, 48% said 'yes, today's educational standard is better', 47% said 'no, today's educational standard is not better', and 5% said that they did not know or gave no response.

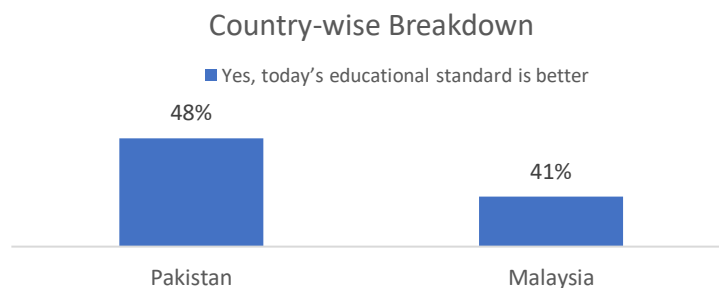

COUNTRY-WISE COMPARISON: Almost half of Pakistani adults (48%) agree that the education standard of today is better than what it was when they were in school, compared to less than half (41%) of Malaysian adults.

Comparing the results by country reveals that 7% more Pakistanis than Malaysians perceive the education standard to have relatively improved.



The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1,303 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted from October 17th to November 7th 2023. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI).

STAT OF THE DAY

Nearly 5% of Pakistani children between 3-5 years have a functional disability, which indicates atypical development related to sight, hearing, difficulties with movement, memory problems, or verbal communication problems.
