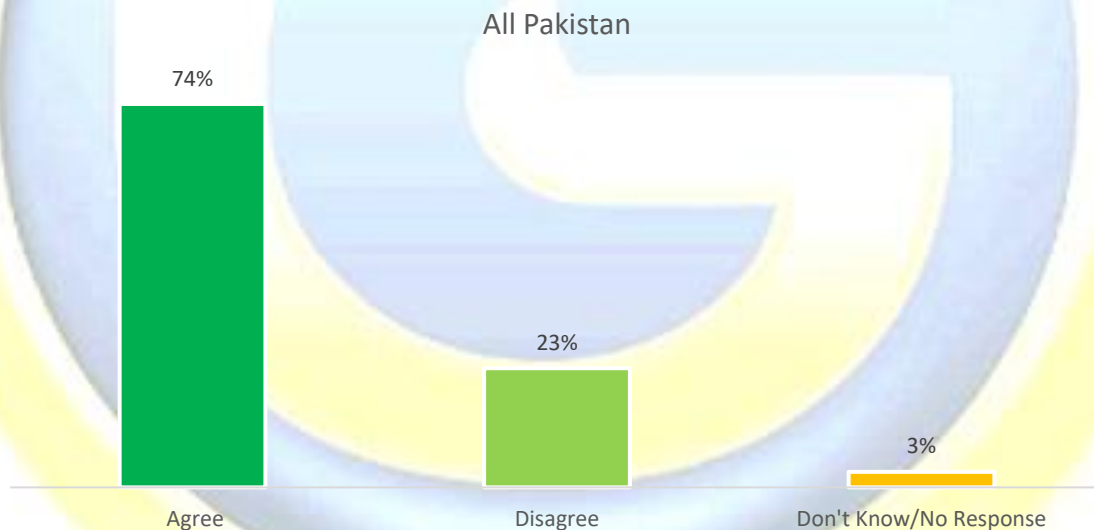
Nearly three quarters (74%) of Pakistanis think that the environment for working women is less supportive as compared to working men, while 27% think that it is not less supportive: Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

(Islamabad) 13th, December 2023

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, a significant majority (81%) of women in Pakistan think that the environment for working women is less supportive as compared to working men, while 29% of men in Pakistan think that it is not less supportive.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the country was asked the question, “Do you think the environment for working women, compared to working men, is less supportive?” In response, 74% said ‘yes’, 23% said ‘no’, and 3% said that they did not know or gave no response.

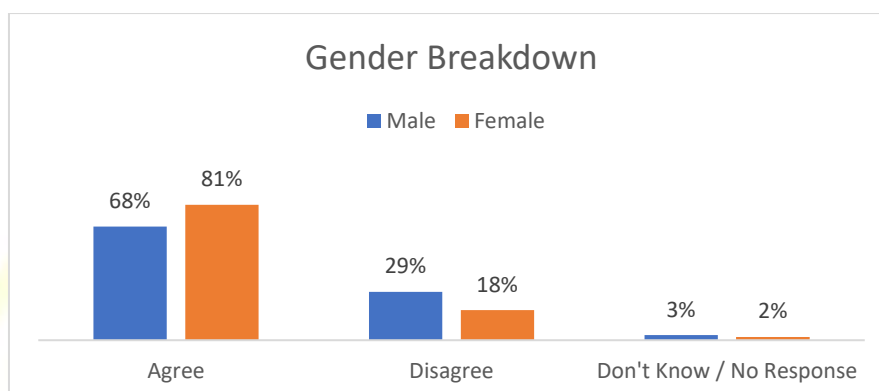
Question: Do you think the environment for working women, compared to working men, is less supportive?

GENDER BREAKDOWN: 81% of the women agreed with the statement while only 18% disagreed.

There is a 13% difference in the number of women who agreed with the statement as compared to men.



The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1,303 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted from October 17th to November 7th 2023. The error margin is estimated to be approximately ± 2 -3 percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI).
