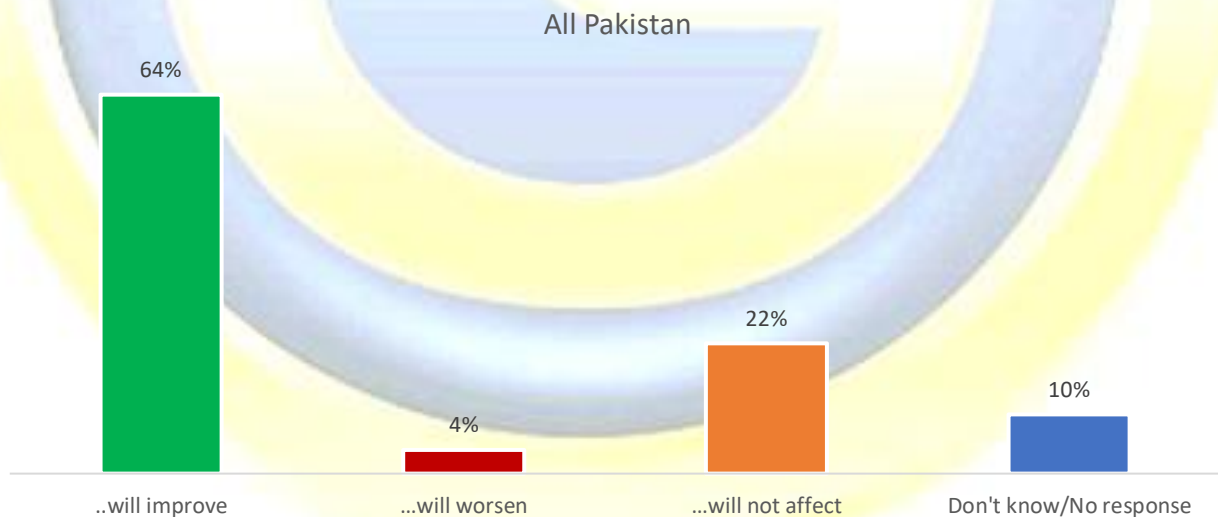
64% of respondents believe Pakistan's peace and order situation will improve as a result of the departure of Afghan refugees: Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

(Islamabad), 8th December, 2023

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 64% of respondents believe Pakistan's peace and order situation will improve as a result of the departure of Afghan refugees.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the country was asked the question, "Some people think that Afghan refugees leaving Pakistan will improve the peace and order situation in Pakistan, while some people think that Afghan refugees leaving Pakistan will have a bad effect on the peace and order situation in Pakistan, while some others say that it will have no effect on the peace and order situation of Pakistan. What is your opinion about this?" 64% said 'the departure of Afghan refugees will improve the peace and order situation in Pakistan', 4% said 'the departure of Afghan refugees will worsen the peace and order situation in Pakistan', 22% said 'the departure of Afghan refugees will not affect the peace and order situation in Pakistan', and 10% said that they did not know or gave no response.

The study in Pakistan was carried out by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 752 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted during 1st November to 4th November 2023. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 3-5$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI).
