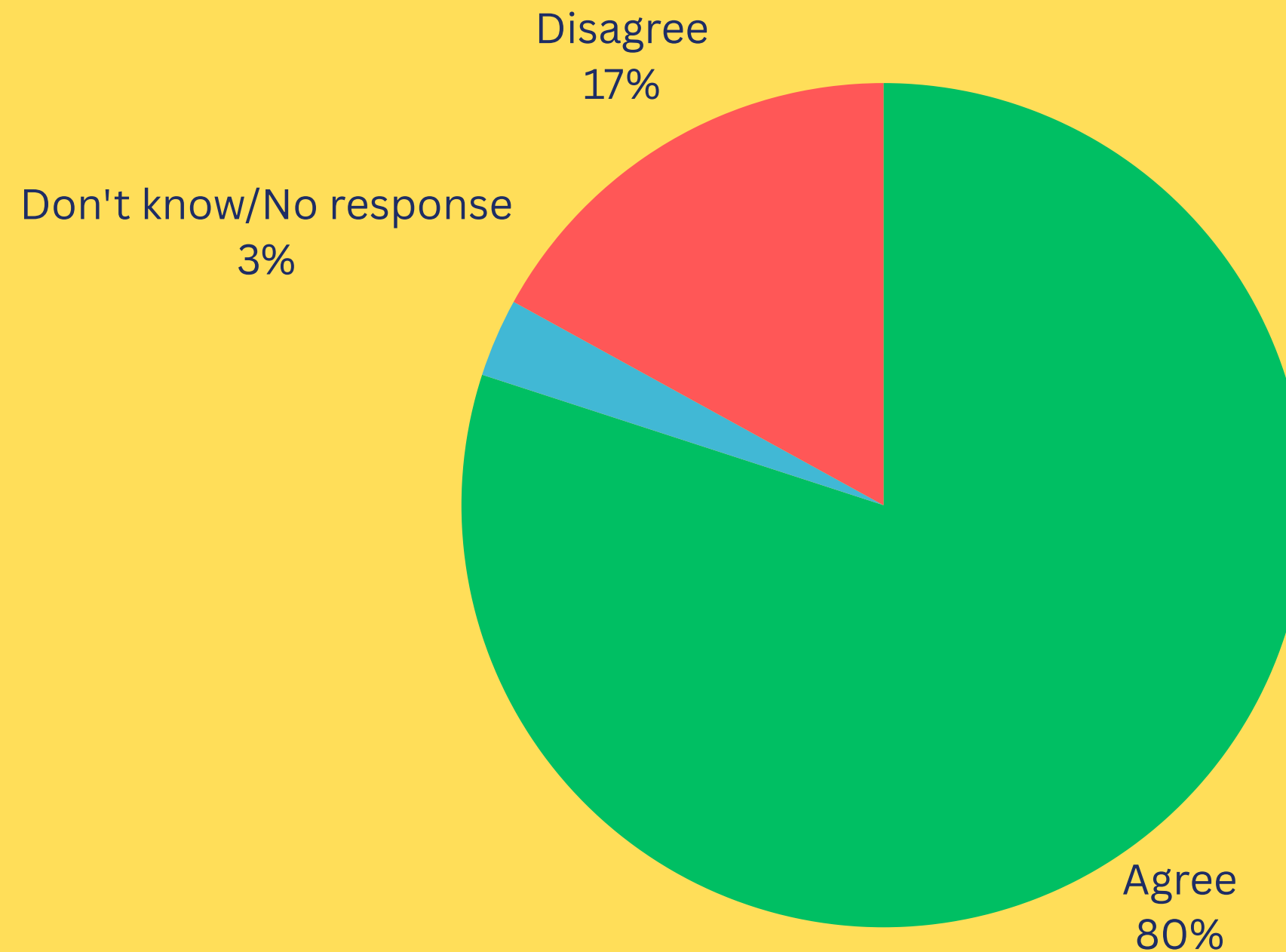

Question: Some people think that all political parties should set aside their differences after the elections and should work together. Do you agree or disagree with this opinion?





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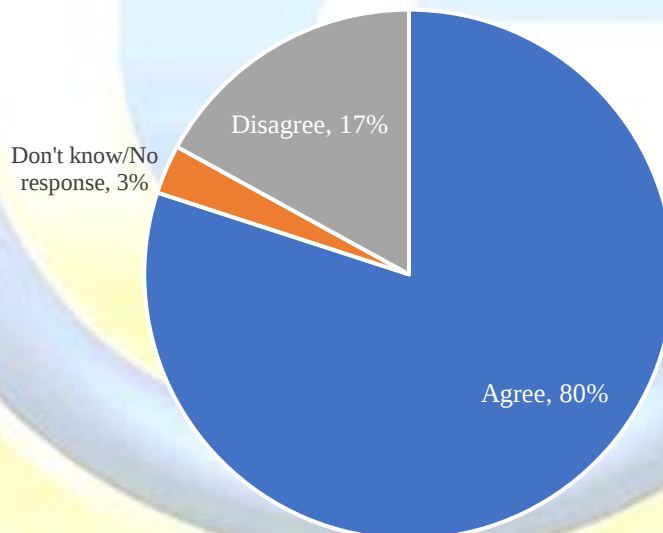

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, 8 out of 10 Pakistani voters (80%) on the election day agreed that political parties should set aside their differences after the elections and work together.

A statistically selected sample of male and female voters from across the country was asked the question, “Some people think that all political parties should set aside their differences after the elections and should work together. Do you agree or disagree with this opinion?” In response 80% Agreed, 17% Disagreed, and 3% said that they did not know or gave no response.

This survey in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a statistically selected sample of 1,500 male and female voters in urban and rural polling stations of all four provinces of the country. Face-to-face interviews were conducted by a team of more than 100 men and women on election day (8th February) 2024. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level.
