 - VI. Islamabad: close contest between PTI independents (33%) and PML-N (32%) for vote share.

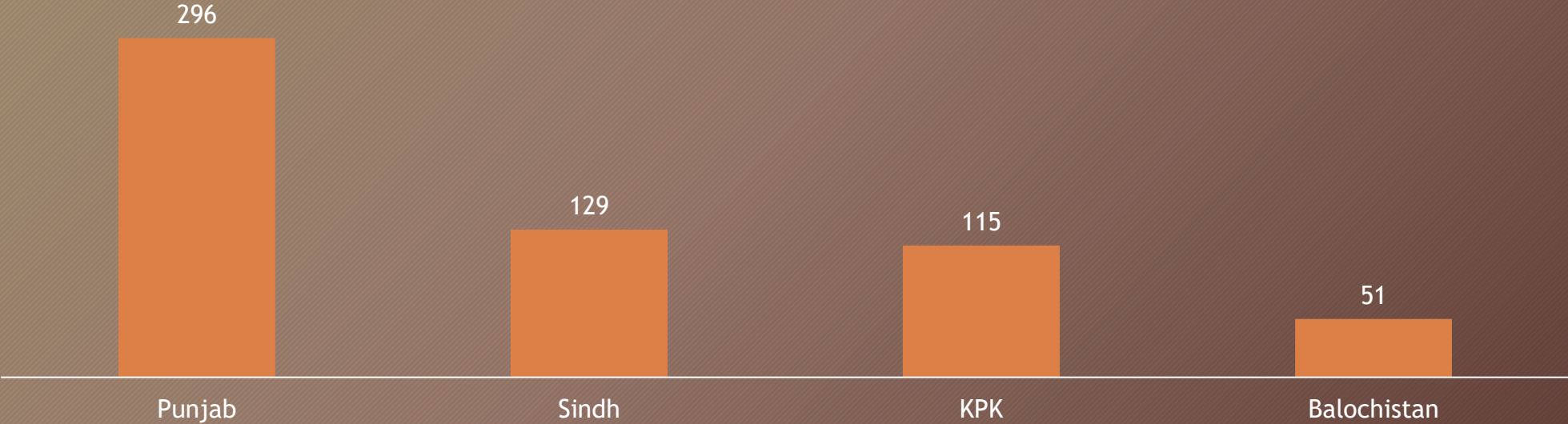

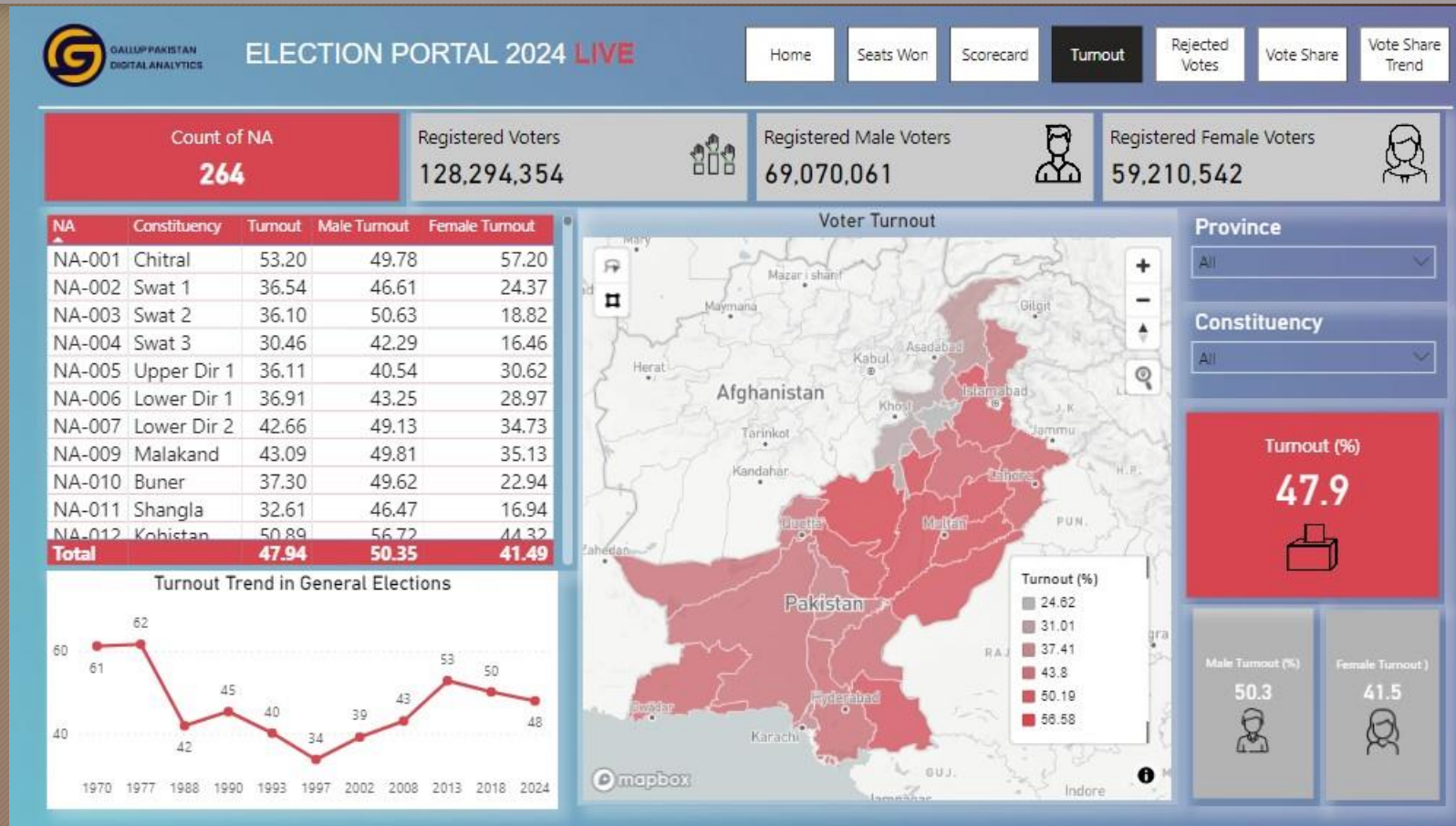

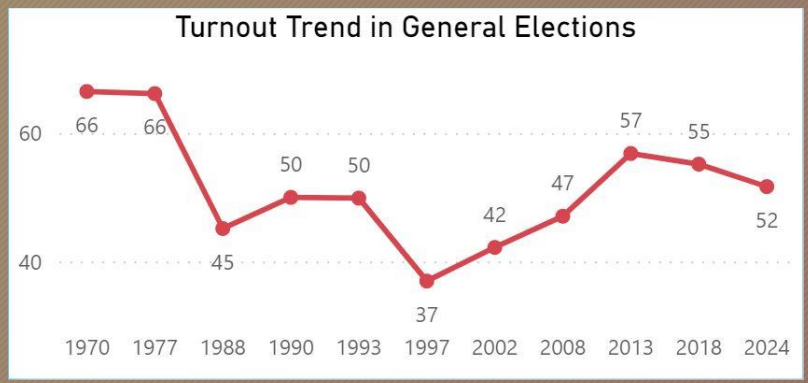

GE Turnout 2024 (preliminary numbers) 47.9% voter turnout in Pakistan's 12th General Election

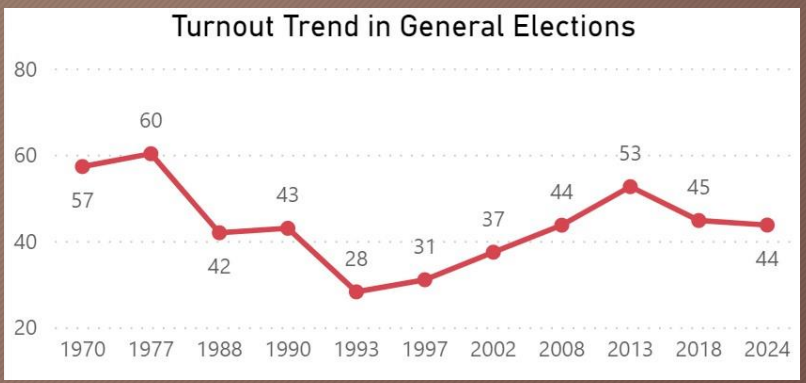

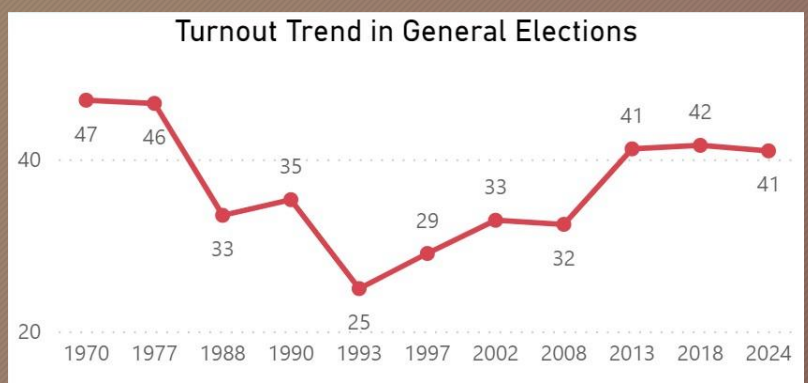

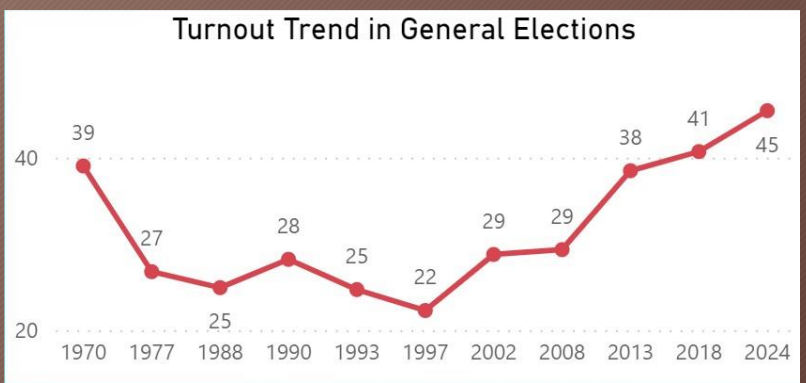

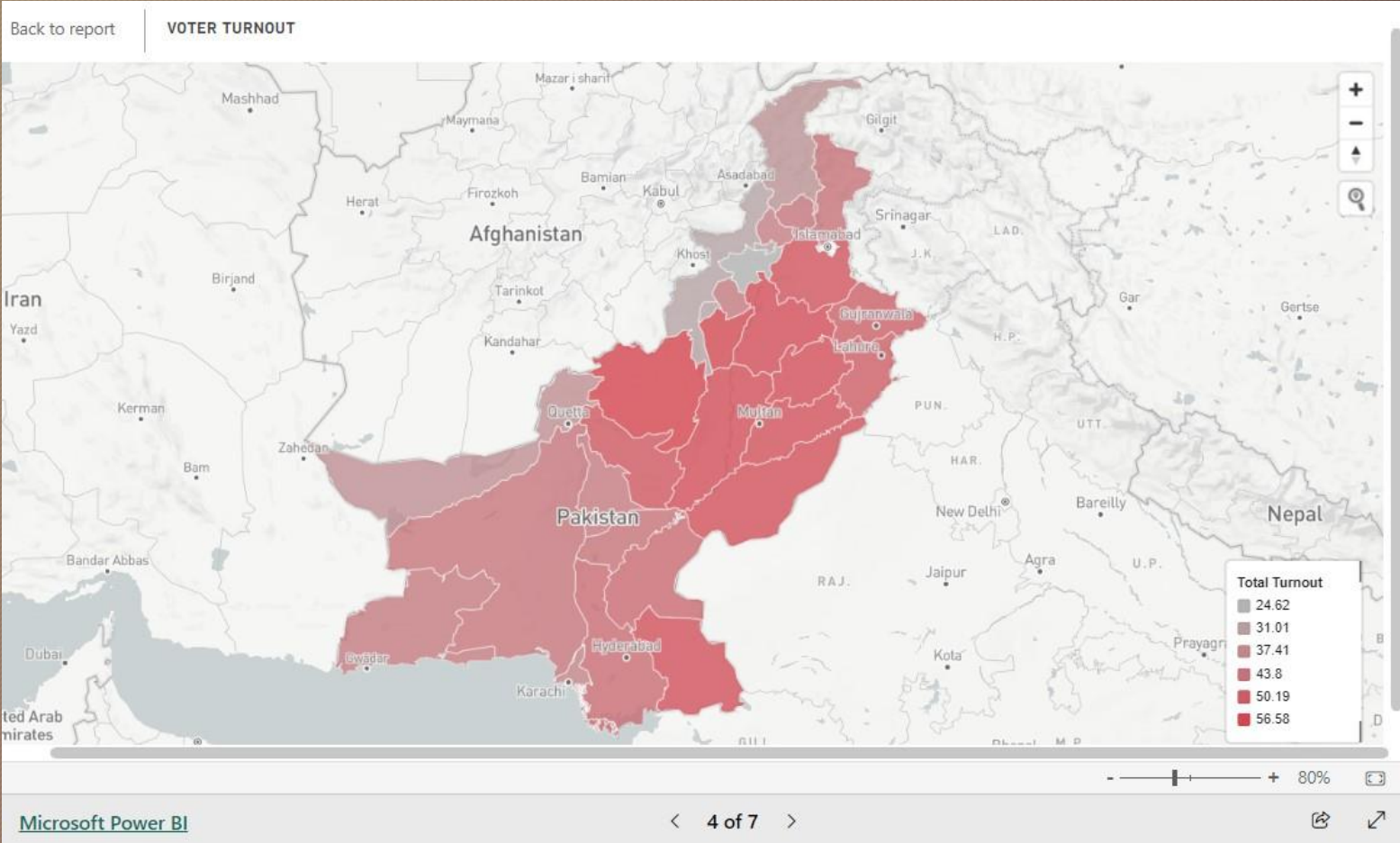

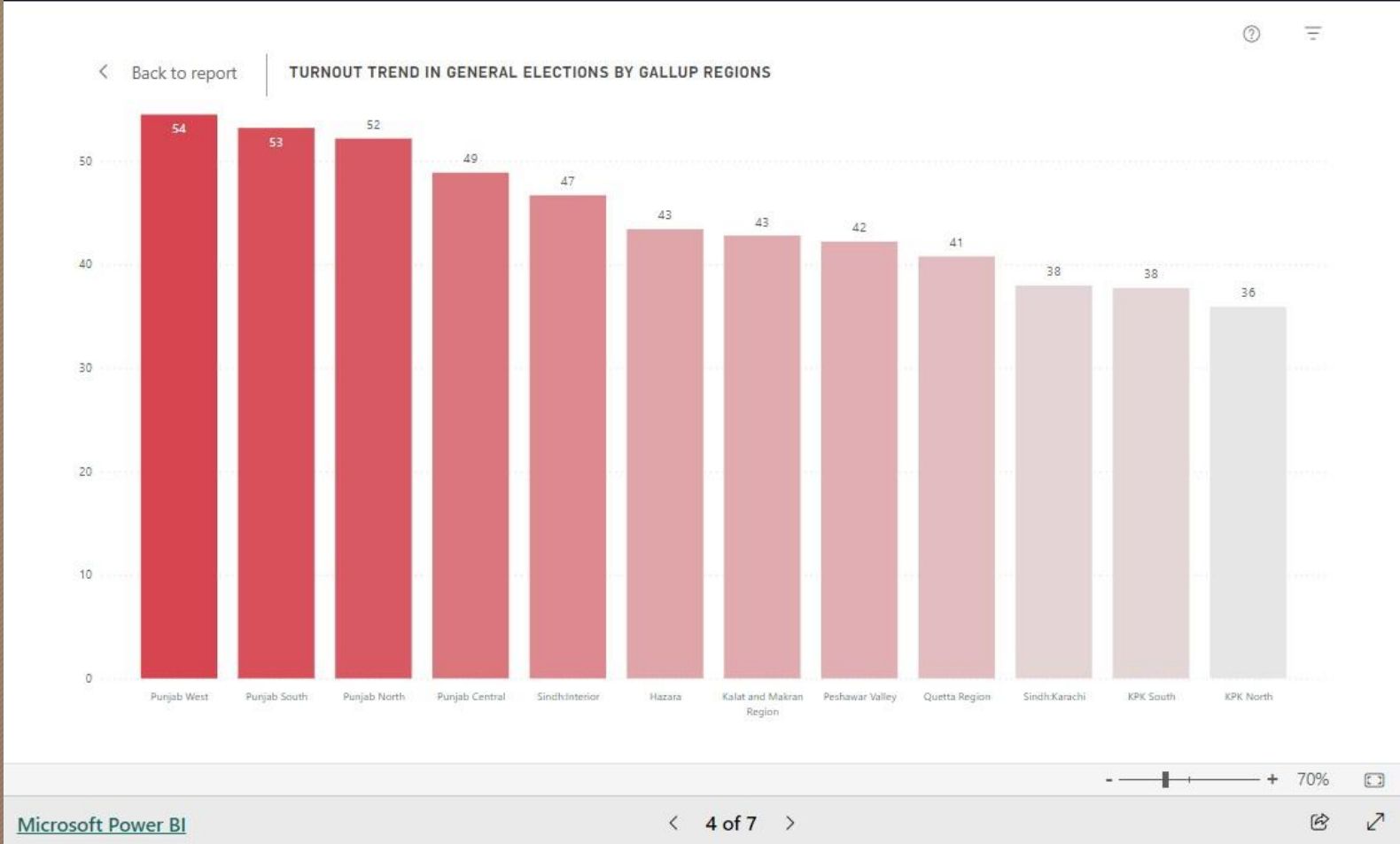

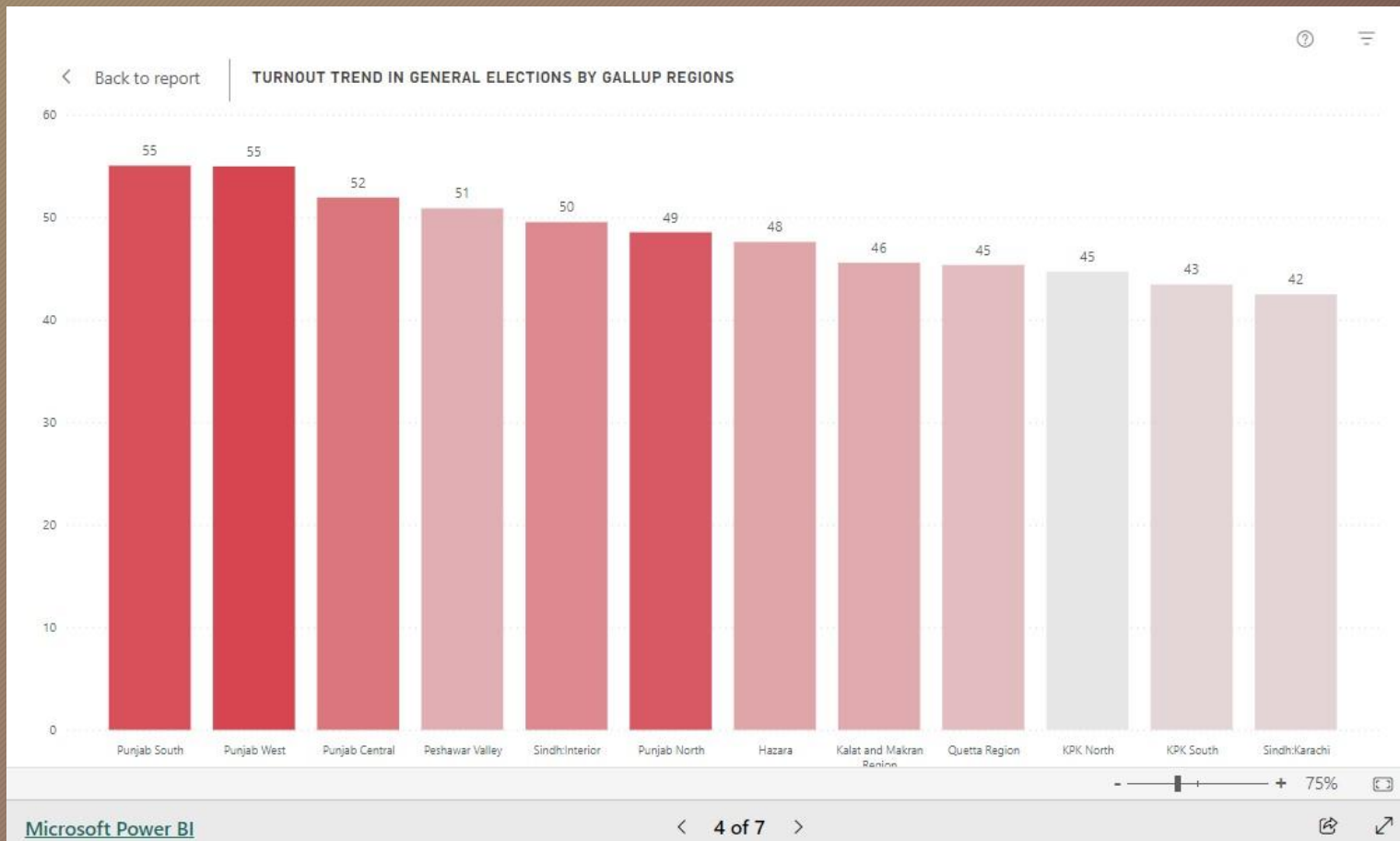

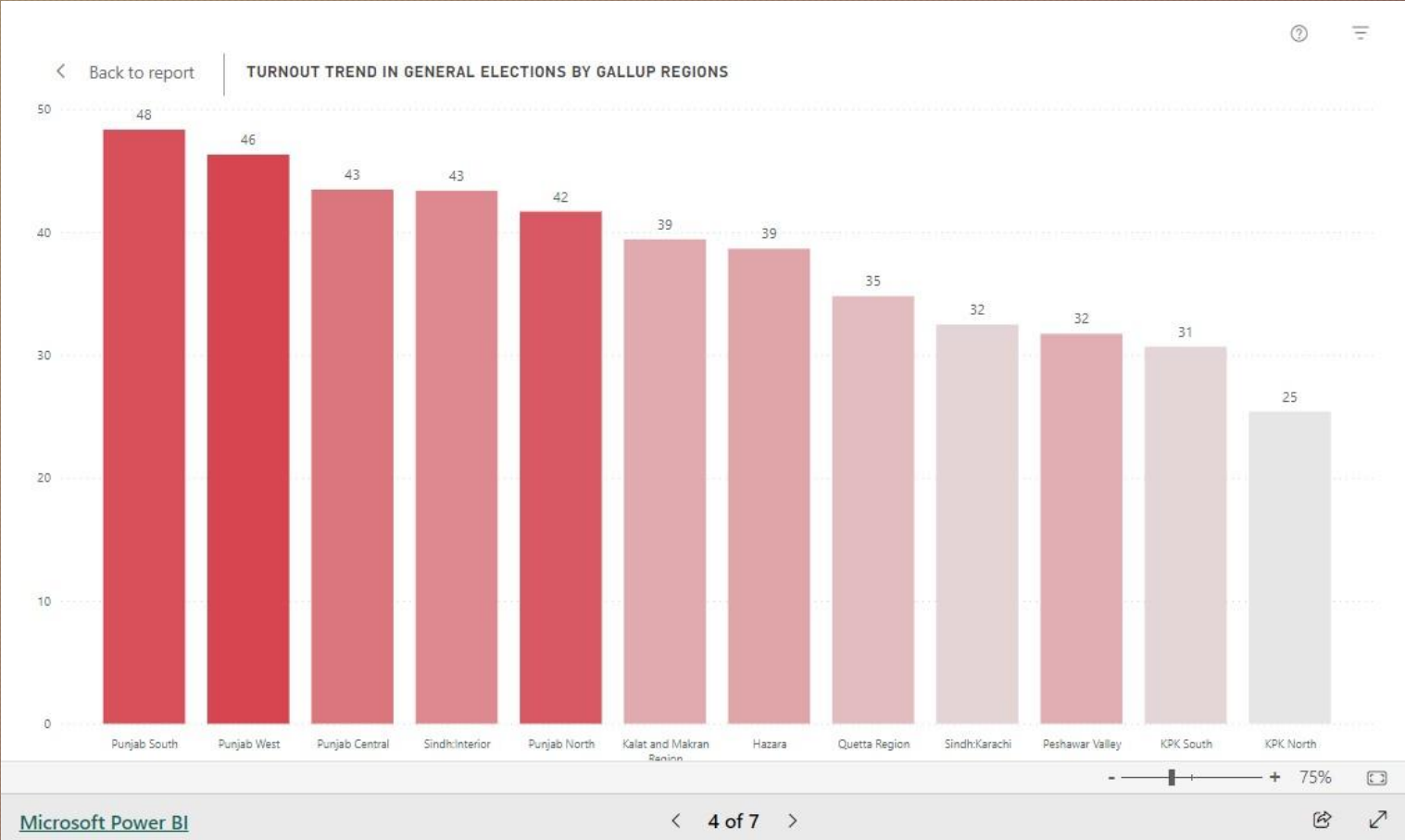

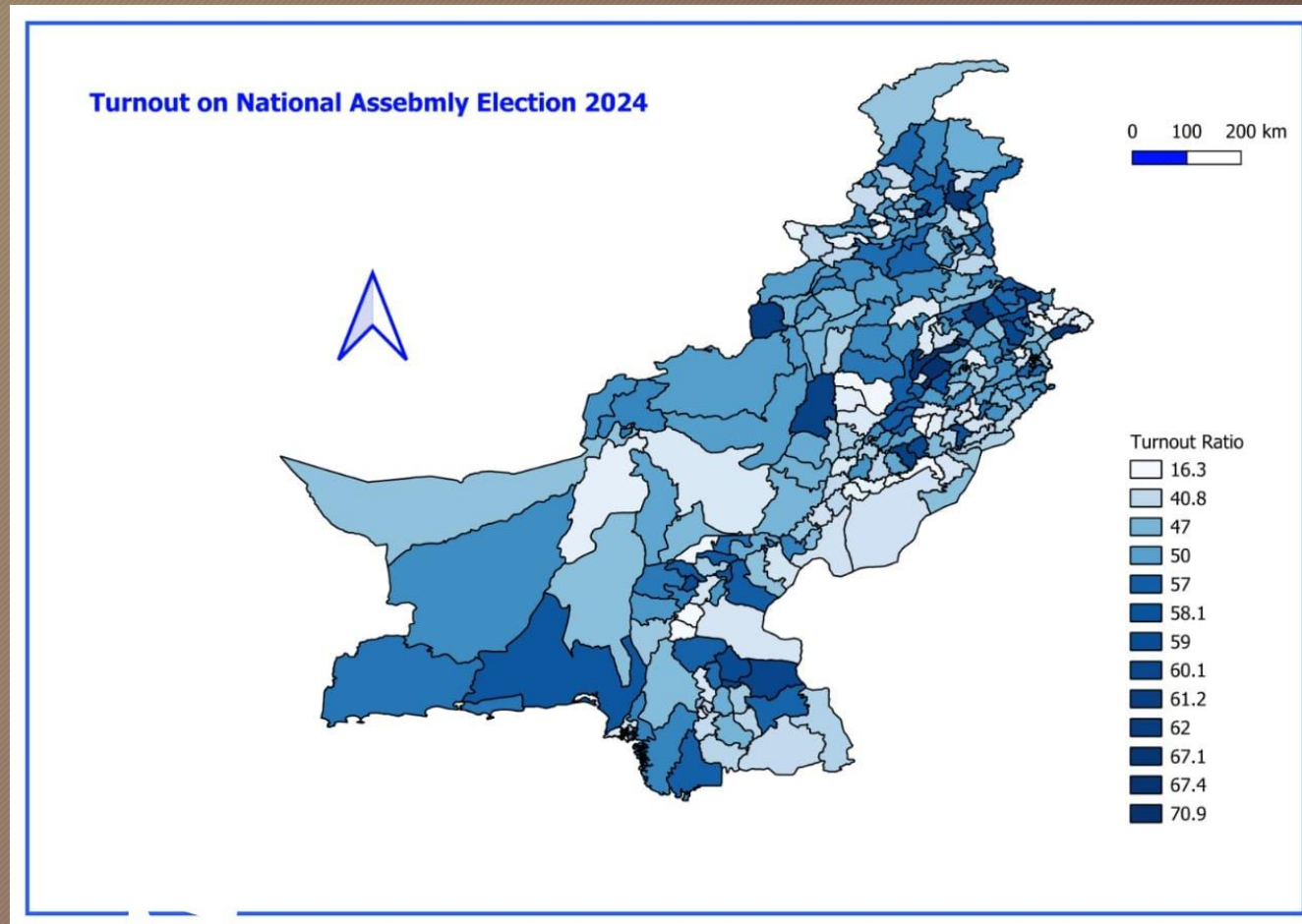

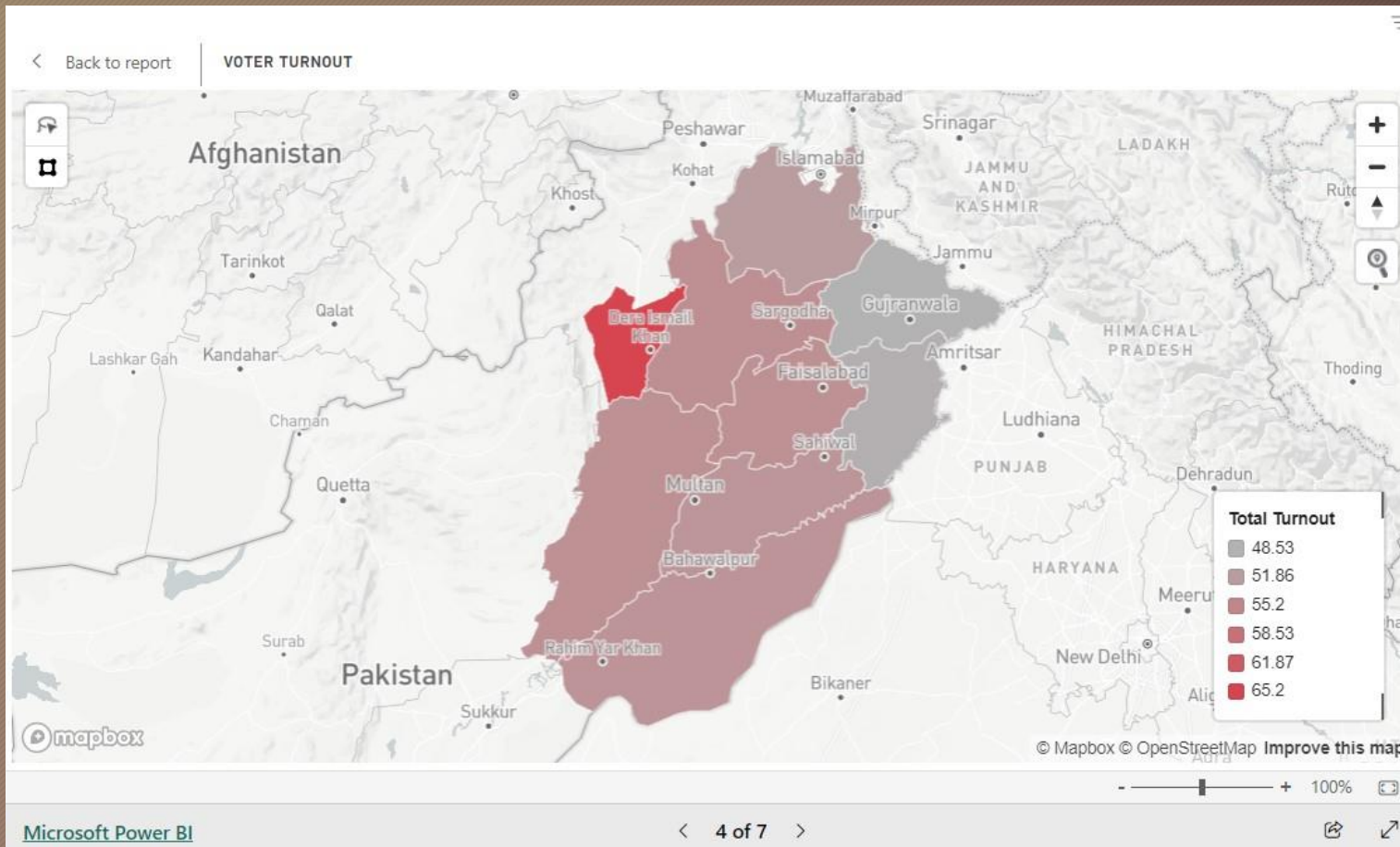

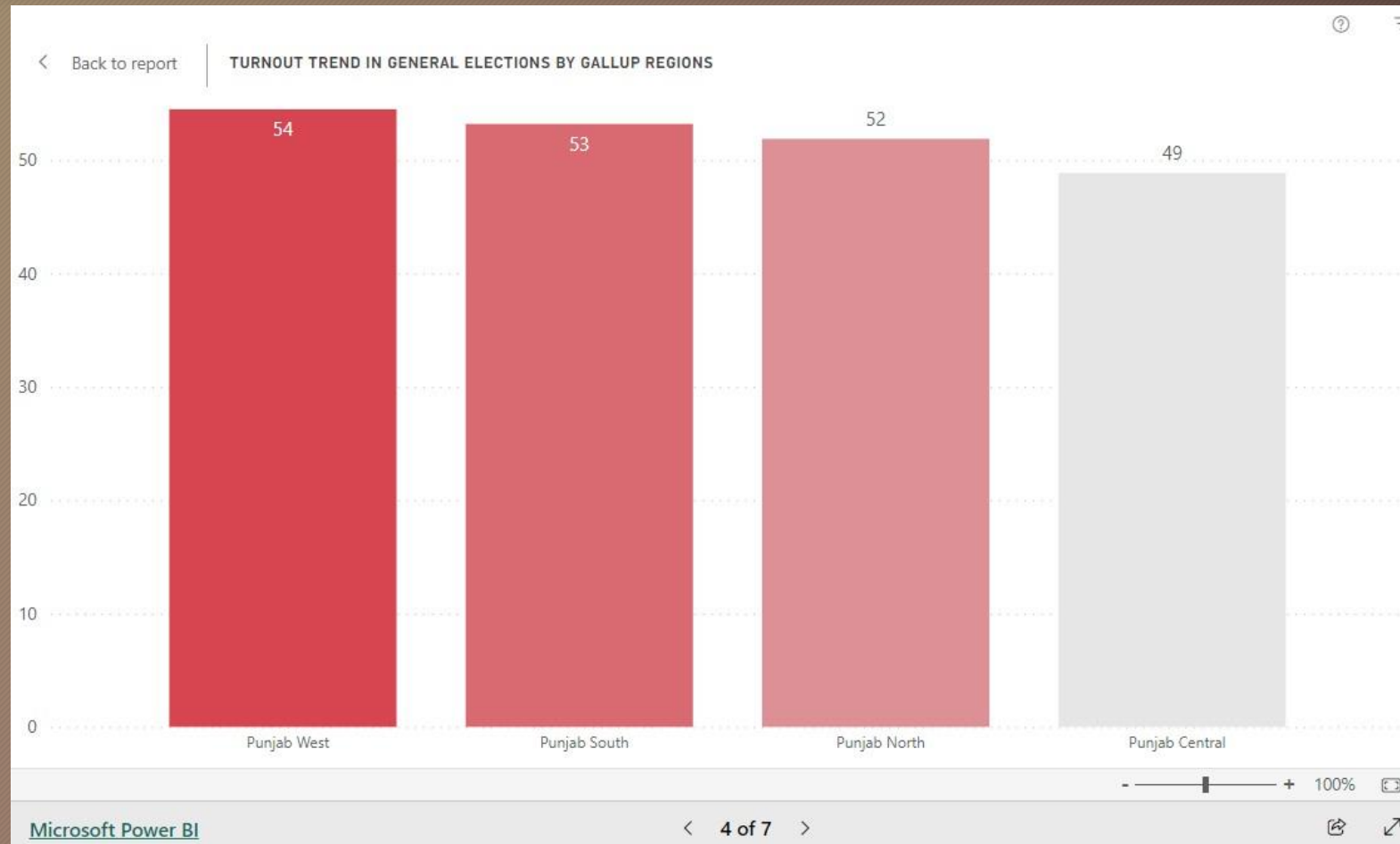

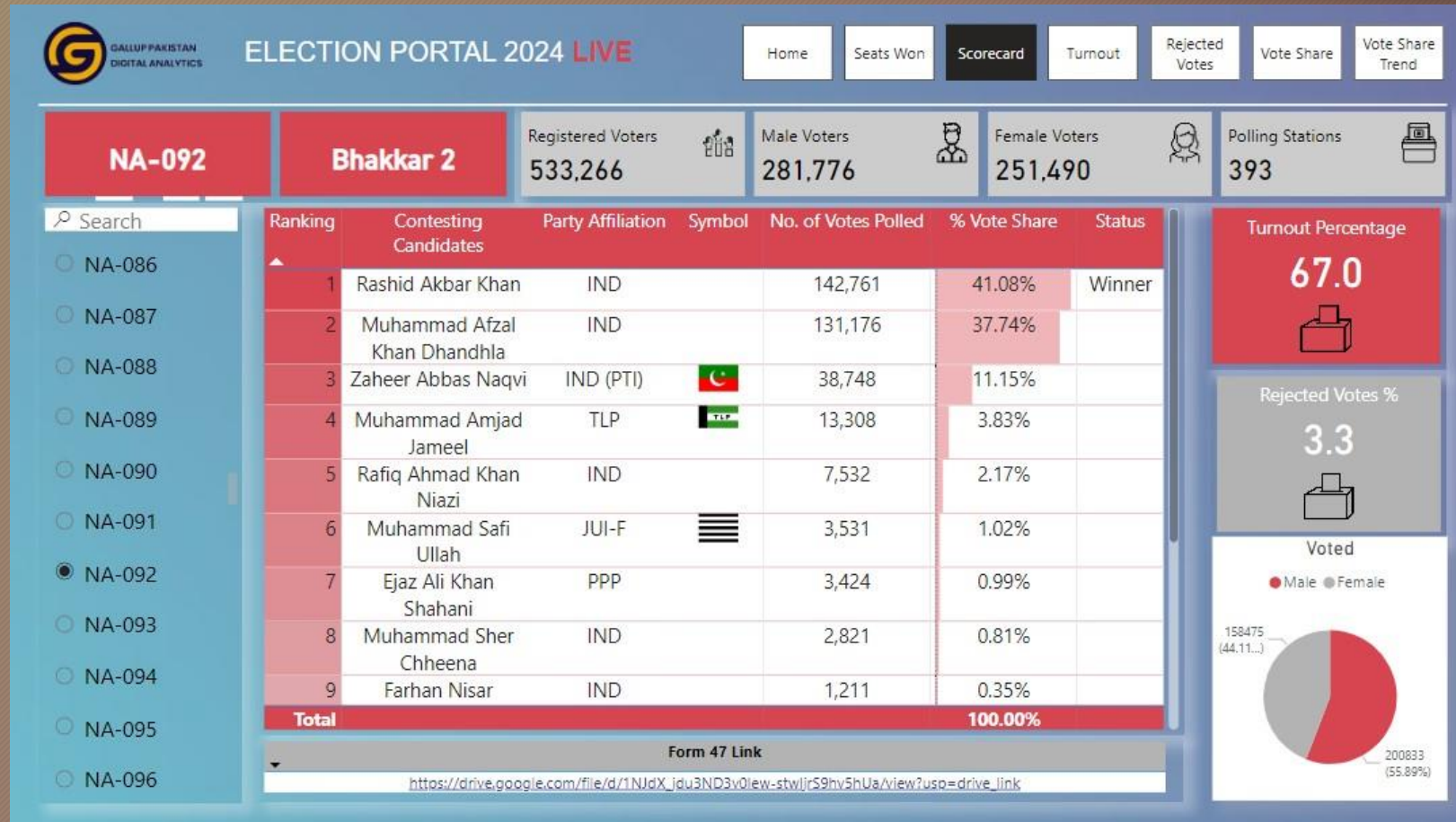

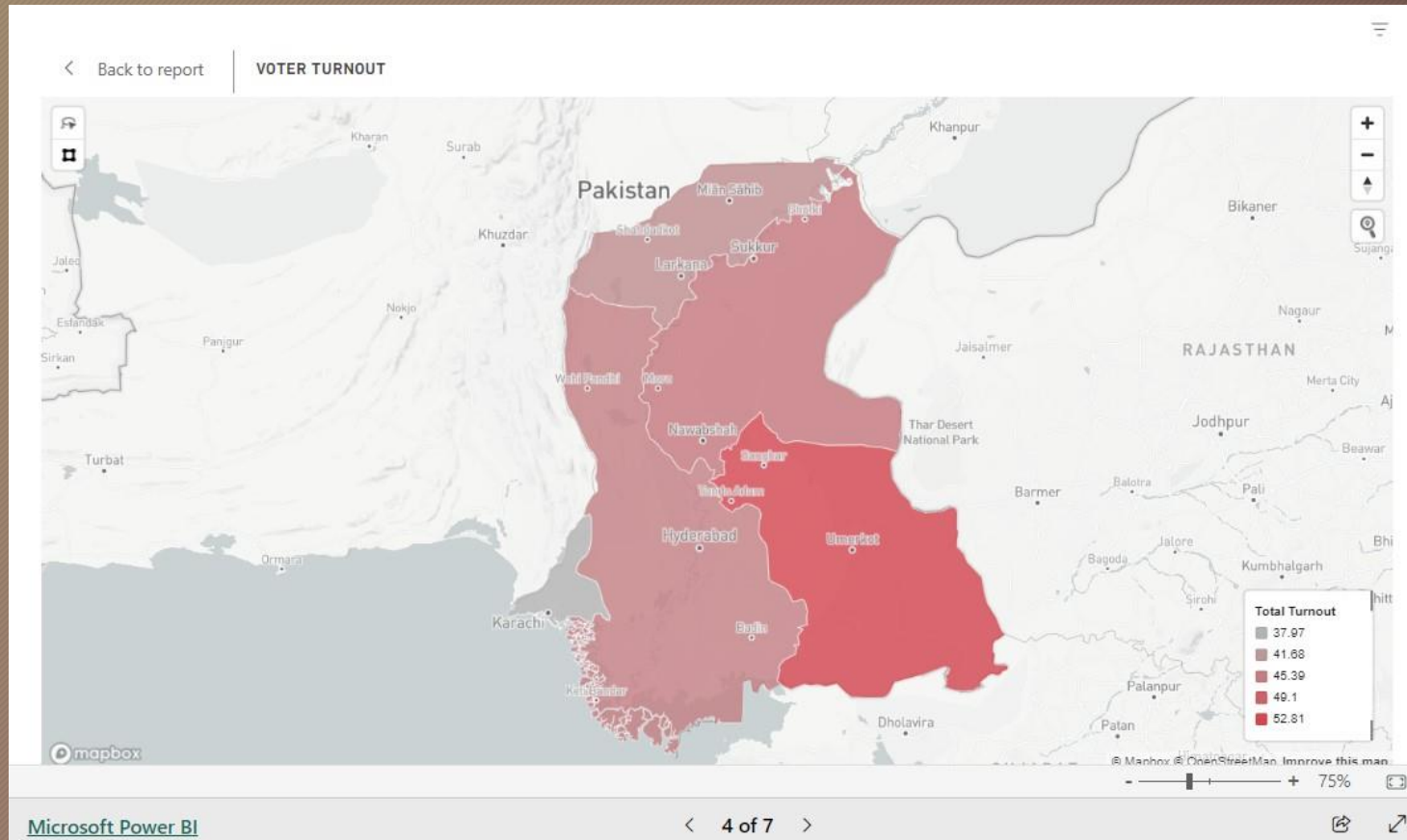

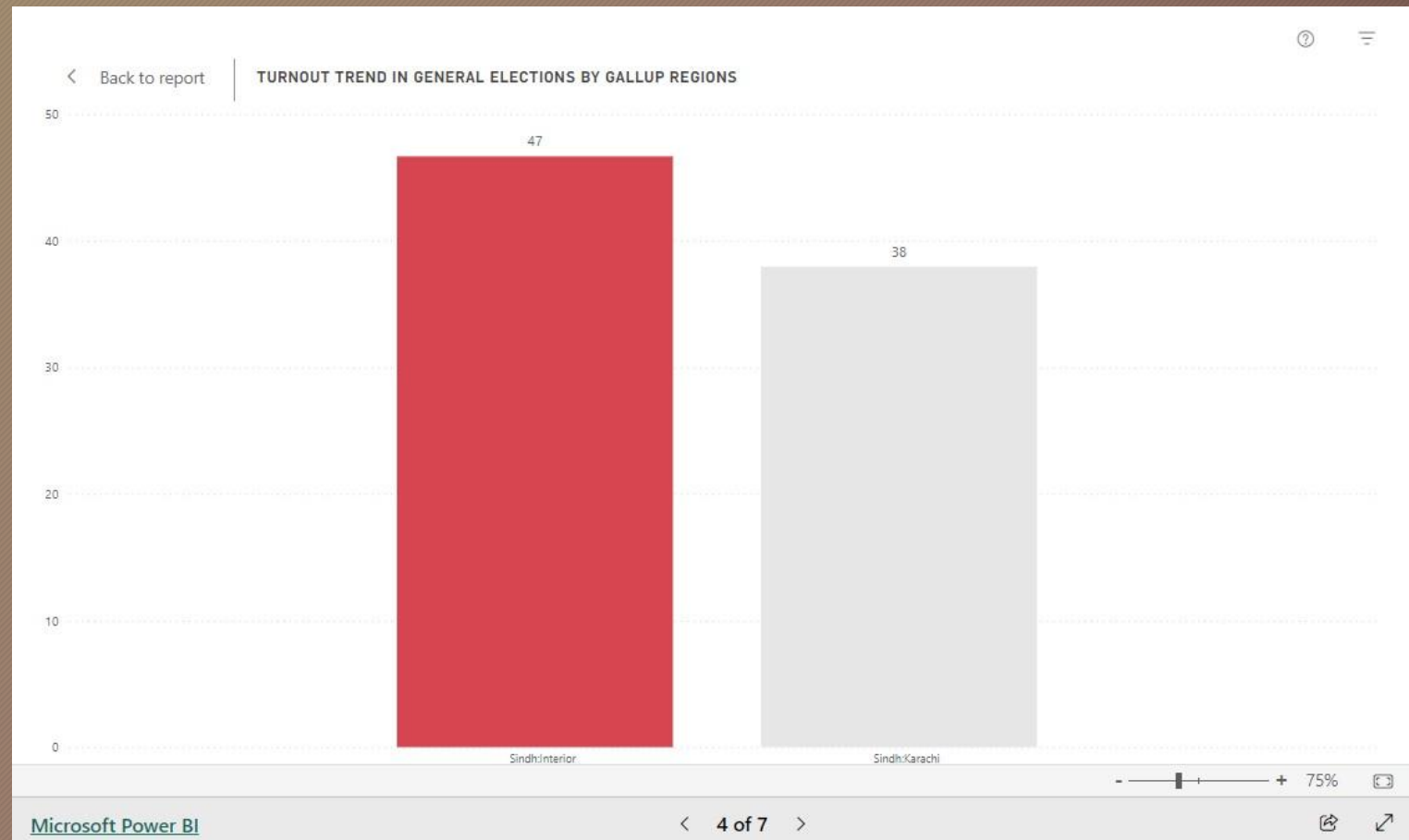

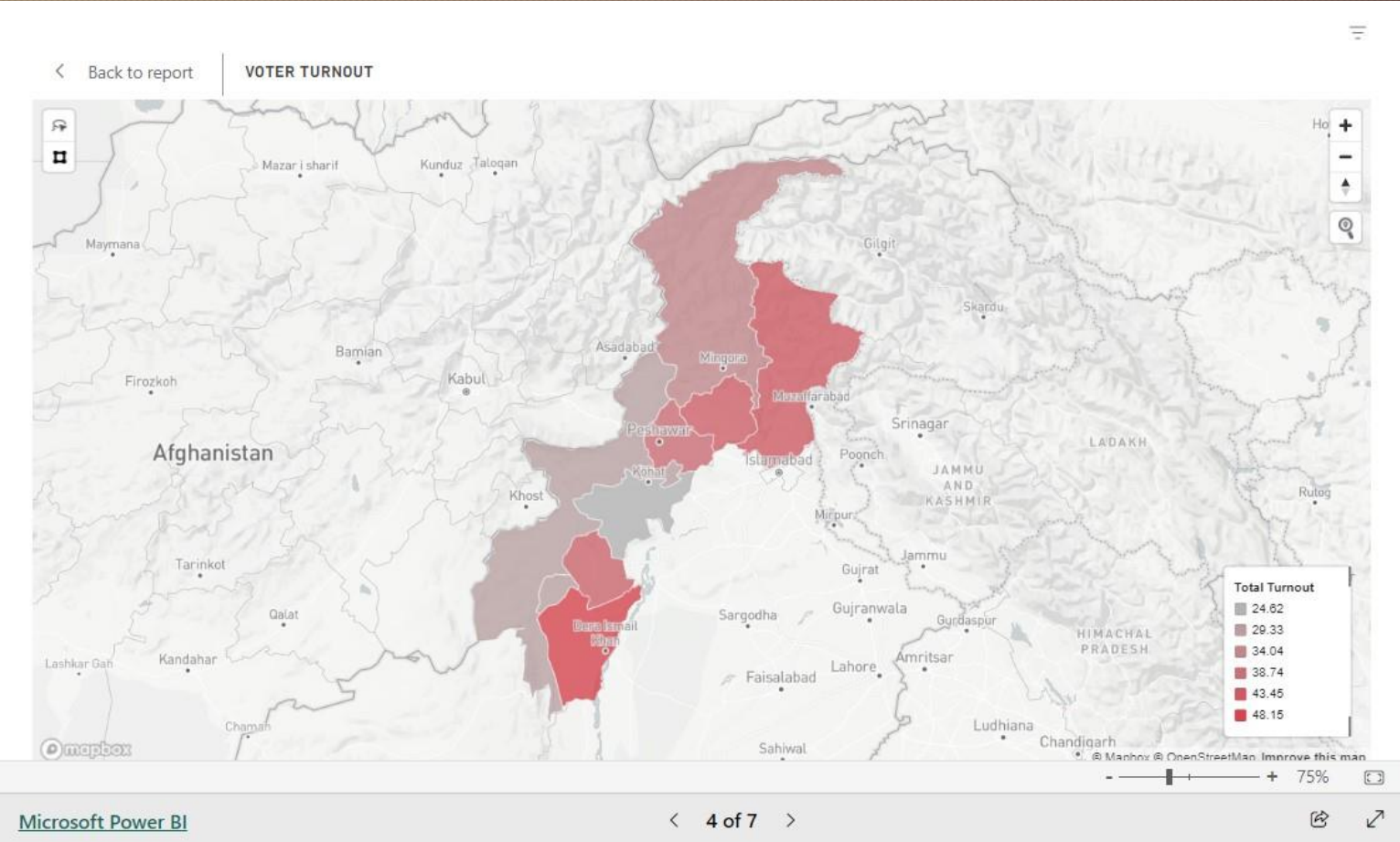

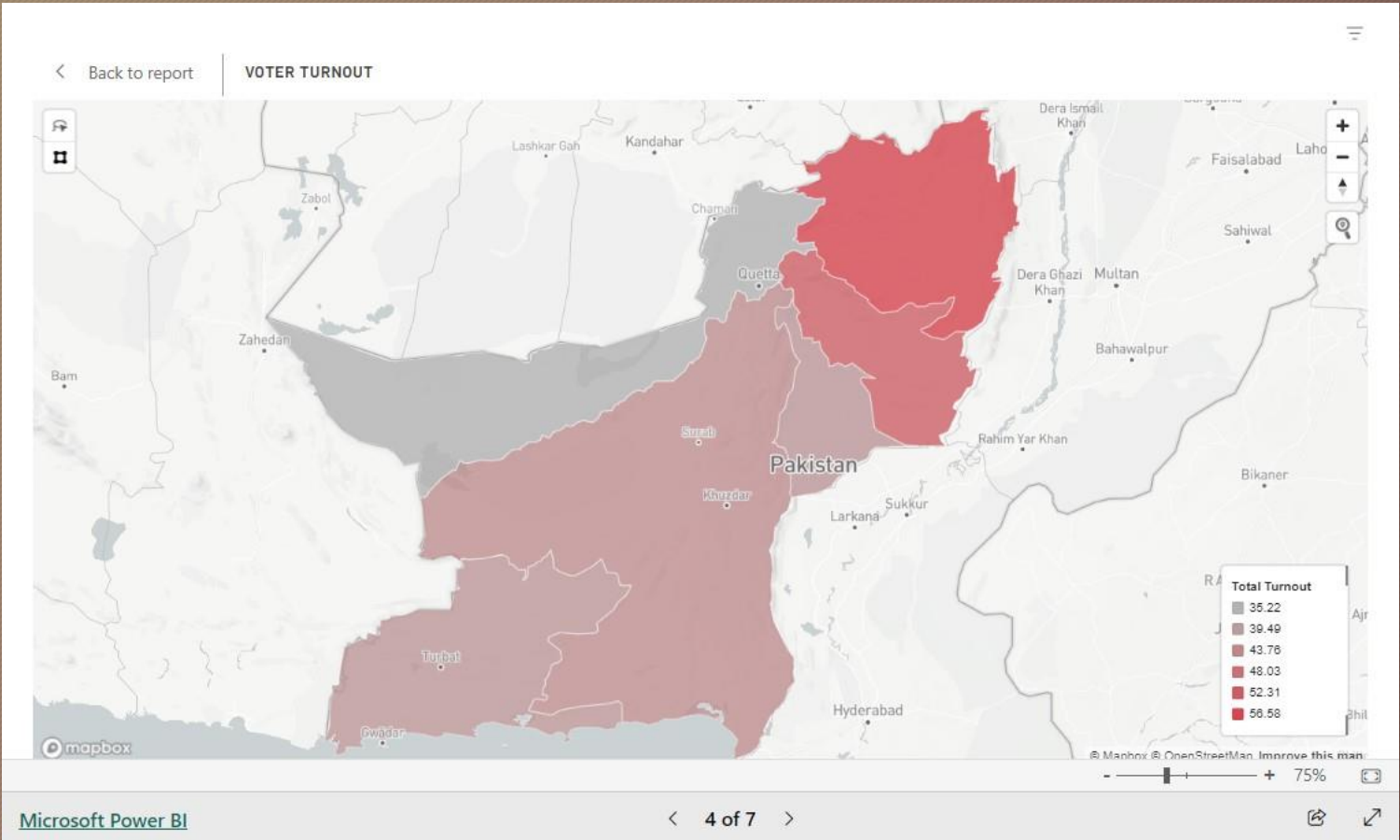

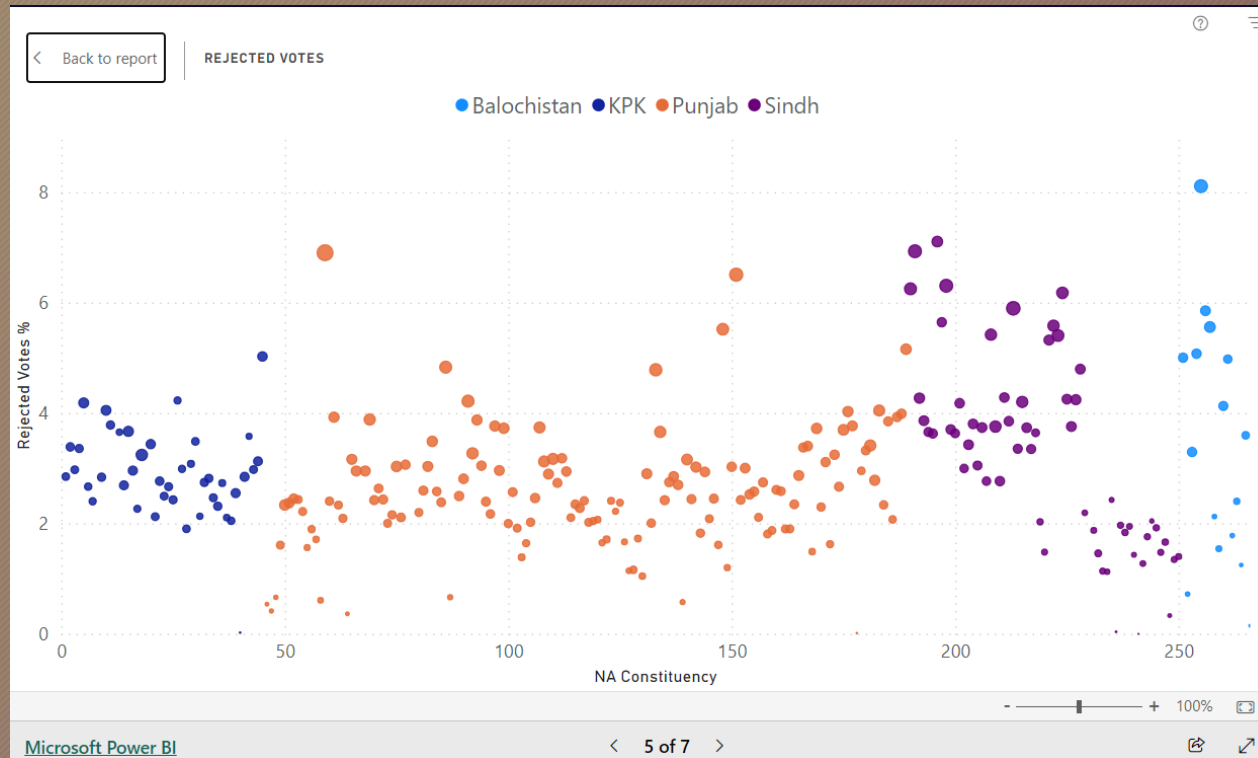

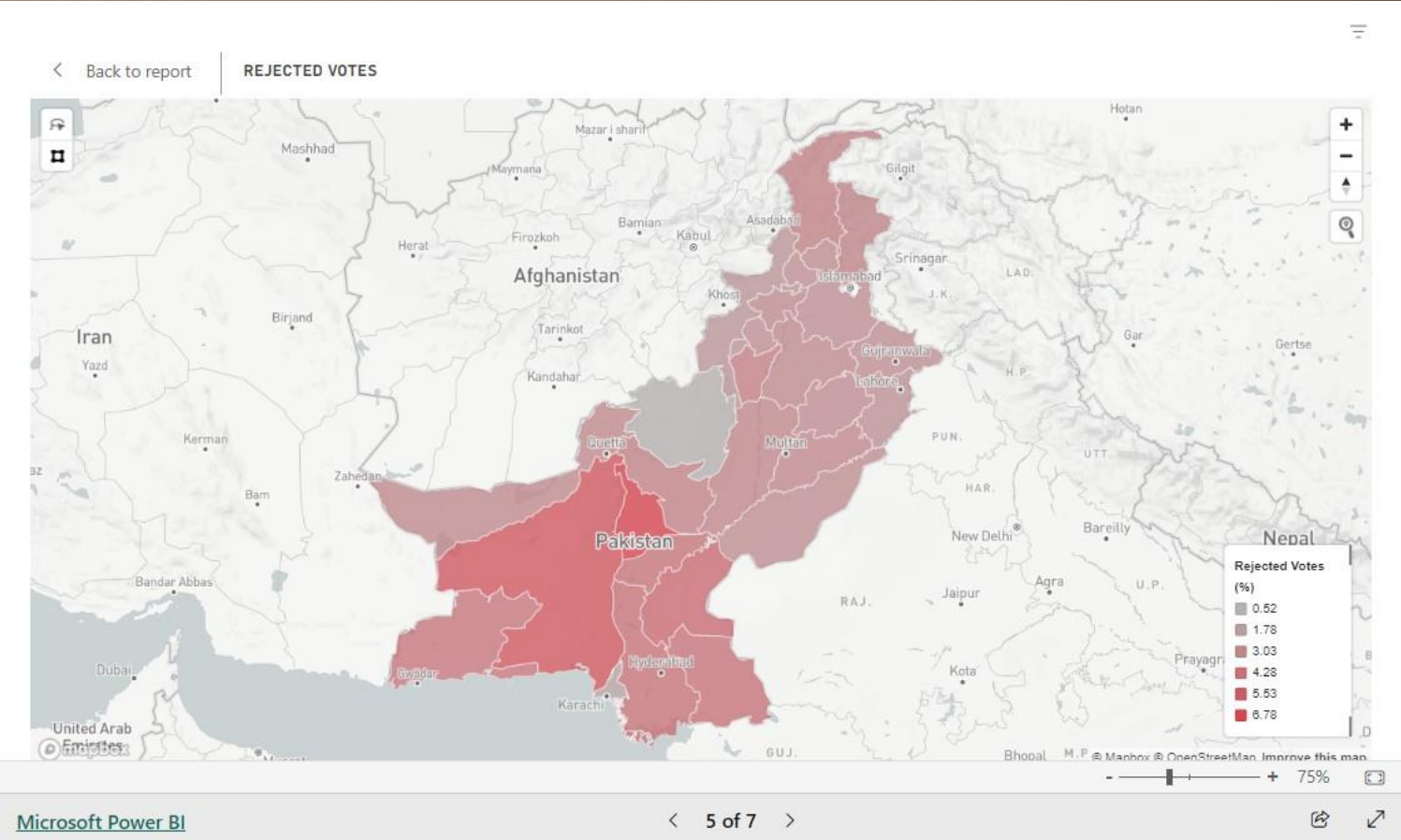

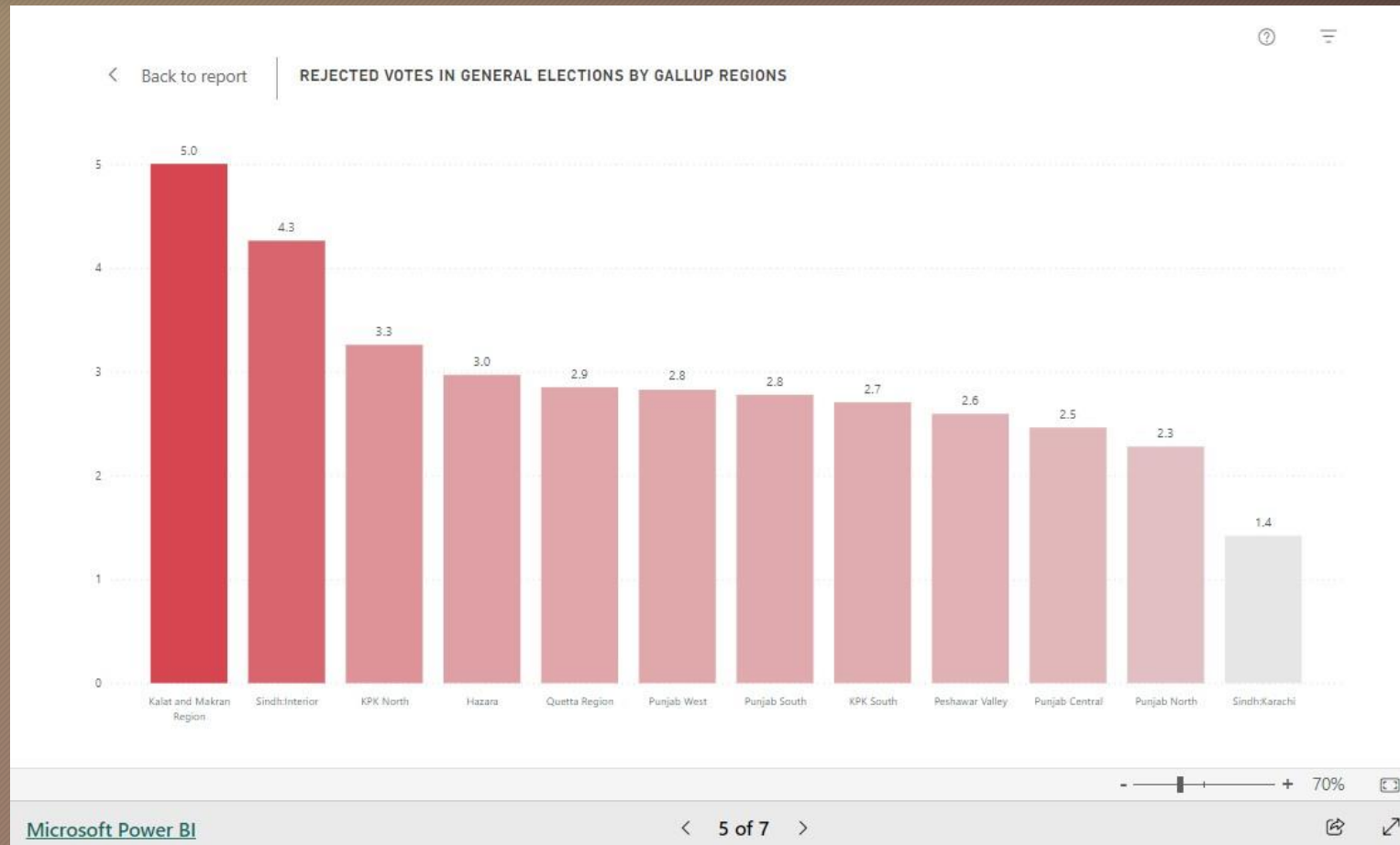

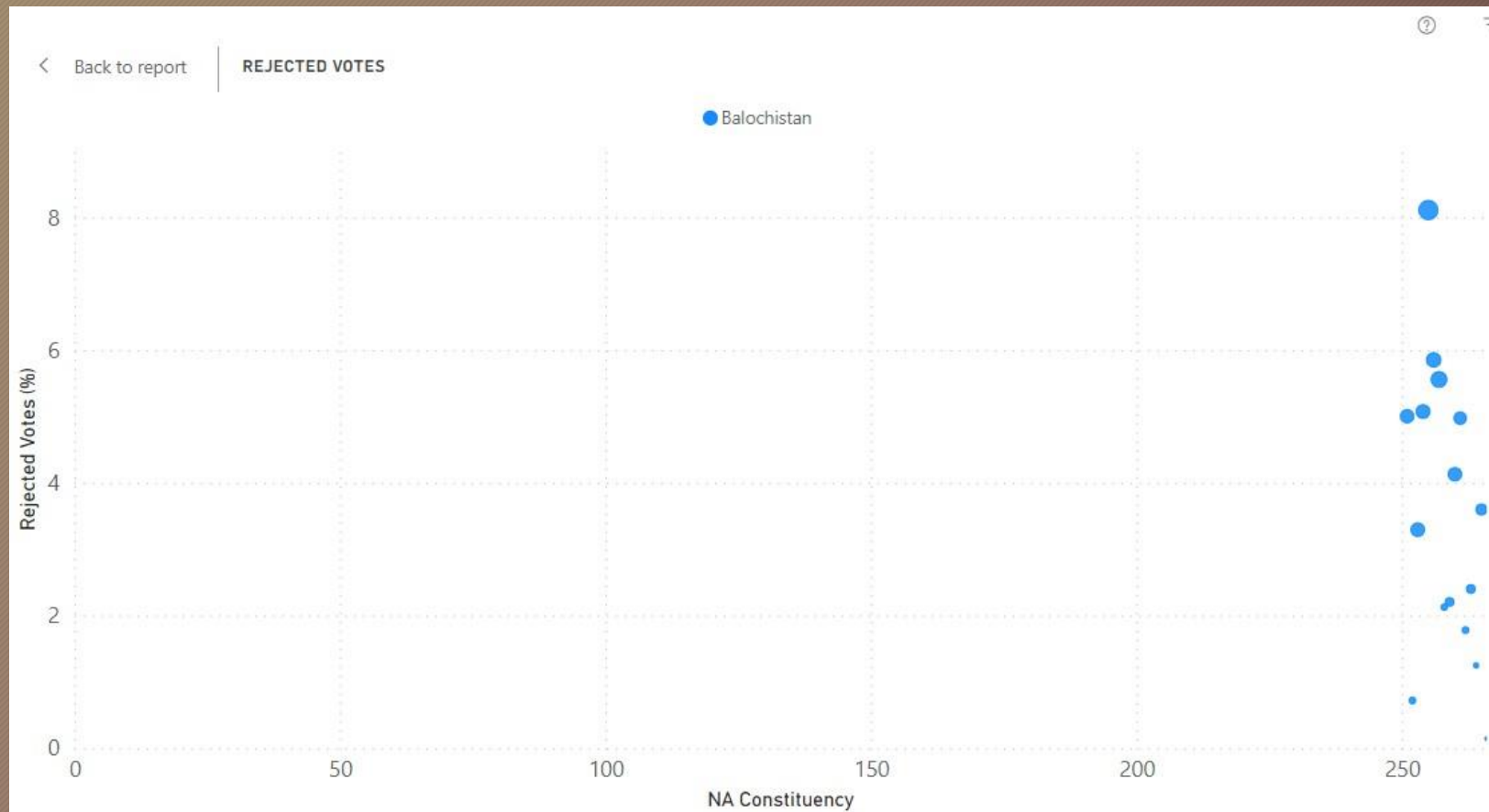
