Jamaat-e-Islami Pakistan (JI-P) received a total of 1.34 million votes in the 2024 General Elections, making it the 3rd most popular religious party after Tehreek-e-Labbaik Pakistan (TLP) and Jamiat Ulema-e-Islam F (JUI-F), and 6th most popular overall with 2.3% of the national vote share - Gallup Pakistan Digital Analytics on Elections

Gallup Pakistan Digital Analytics team on Elections has performed analytics on Election 2024 data released so far by Election Commission of Pakistan. How did Jamat-e-Islami Pakistan (JI-P) perform in the 2024 Election?

Jamaat-e-Islami Pakistan received a total of 1.34 million votes in the 2024 General Elections, making it the 3rd most popular religious party after Tehreek-e-Labbaik Pakistan (TLP) and Jamiat Ulema-e-Islam F (JUI-F), and 6th most popular overall with 2.3% of the national vote share.

OTHER KEY LEARNINGS FROM THIS PRESS RELEASE:

1. JI-P received a total of **1.34 million votes** in the 2024 General Elections, making it the 3rd most popular religious party after Tehreek-e-Labbaik Pakistan (TLP) and Jamiat Ulema-e-Islam F (JUI-F), and 6th most popular overall with **2.3% of the national vote share**.
2. **Across provinces:** JI-P received the highest number of votes in Sindh at 0.51 million votes, making up 38.4% of its total votes across the country. In Punjab it received 0.43 million votes, making up 32.5%, followed by KP where it received 0.35 million votes, accounting for 26.4%. Meanwhile it received an equal proportion of votes in Balochistan (18.8 thousand) and Islamabad Capital Territory (ICT) (18.4 thousand), each accounting for 1.4% of JI-P's total votes.
3. **Across division:** JI-P received the highest number of votes in Karachi Division in Sindh province with 0.45 million, while Zhob Division in Balochistan received the lowest with only 309 votes total.
4. **Combined votes:** The combined vote bank for JI-P and JUI-F was 3.5 million votes, making up 6% of the national vote share in the 2024 General Elections. This is 0.92 million more votes, and a 1.1% higher vote share than Muttahida Majlis-e-Amal (MMA) in the 2018 General Elections.
5. **Performance in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP):** The combined vote bank for JI-P and JUI-F in KP was 1.6 million votes, making up 20% of the provincial vote share in the 2024 General Elections. This is 0.34 million more votes and a 2.3% higher vote share than MMA had in KP in the 2018 General Elections.
6. **Performance in Karachi Division:** JI-P had impressive support in the Karachi Division for the 2024 General Elections, having the 4th highest vote share across all political parties at 13%, and the highest share across religious parties.

METHODOLOGY:

The press release is based on data from the Form 47 of the Provisional Results Dashboard from the Election Commission of Pakistan website, noting the details of votes cast in each polling station. The data has been computed to represent overall results at the provincial and national levels.

Gallup Pakistan Electoral Repository: An Introduction

The Gallup Pakistan Electoral Repository is comprised of the following sources:

1. Election Commission data on past 11 elections in Pakistan, available over each constituency. This data was acquired from Election Commission website and converted into digital database in SPSS form and is now referred to as Gilani Index of Electoral Record.
2. Gallup Exit Polls for every election since 1985.
3. Gallup pre and post-election survey record since 1985.
4. Analysis by Dr. Ijaz Shafi Gilani on elections piece by piece, as well as in combined form.
