## 2024 General Election

### (Press Release 17)

**ANP received 0.62 million votes in the 2024 General Elections, accounting for 1.1% of the national vote share, coming out as the 10<sup>th</sup> most popular political party nationally, and 3<sup>rd</sup> most popular provincial party - Gallup Pakistan Digital Analytics on Elections**

*(Islamabad, Pakistan): 18<sup>th</sup> April, 2024*

Gallup Pakistan Digital Analytics team on Elections has performed analytics on Election 2024 data released so far by Election Commission of Pakistan. This Press Release is part of series of Press Releases under this program. ### **How did Awami National Party (ANP) perform in the 2024 Election?**

ANP received 0.62 million votes in the 2024 General Elections, accounting for 1.1% of the national vote share, coming out as the 10<sup>th</sup> most popular political party nationally, and 3<sup>rd</sup> most popular provincial party.

### **OTHER KEY LEARNINGS FROM THIS PRESS RELEASE:**

1. ANP received nearly **0.62 million votes** in the 2024 General Elections, accounting for **1.1% of the national vote share**, making it the 10<sup>th</sup> most popular political party nationally, and 3<sup>rd</sup> most popular provincial party.
2. **Across provinces in 2024:** ANP received the highest proportion of votes in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) with 0.57 million votes, making up 91.4% of its total votes across the country. In Balochistan it received over 45 thousand votes, making up 7.3%, followed by Sindh where it received 6,504 thousand votes, accounting for 1%. Meanwhile it received 1,717 votes in Punjab, and 173 in Islamabad Capital Territory (ICT), making up 0.3% and 0.03% of its total votes respectively.
3. **Across divisions in KP in 2024:** ANP continued its stronghold in Peshawar and Malakand divisions, getting 0.43 million votes with 13.2% vote share, and 0.12 million votes with 6.4% vote share respectively. Meanwhile Hazara Division reported zero votes for ANP.
4. **2018 vs 2024:**
  - **Total Votes in KP:** ANP received 0.17 million lesser votes in 2024 compared to 2018, the increase in votes was highest in the Kohat division, accounting for 15,948, however votes decreased significantly by 94,490 in the Malakand division.
  - **Vote Share in KP:** Vote share of ANP in KP decreased by 3.1% in 2024 compared to 2018, Malakand division recorded the highest fall by 6.1%, however Kohat division saw an increase by 7.4%.

## **METHODOLOGY:**

The press release is based on data from the Form 47 of the Provisional Results Dashboard from the Election Commission of Pakistan website, noting the details of votes cast in each polling station. The data has been computed to represent overall results at the provincial and national levels.

### **Gallup Pakistan Electoral Repository: An Introduction**

The Gallup Pakistan Electoral Repository is comprised of the following sources:

1. Election Commission data on past 11 elections in Pakistan, available over each constituency. This data was acquired from Election Commission website and converted into digital database in SPSS form and is now referred to as Gilani Index of Electoral Record.
2. Gallup Exit Polls for every election since 1985.
3. Gallup pre and post-election survey record since 1985.
4. Analysis by Dr. Ijaz Shafi Gilani on elections piece by piece, as well as in combined form.
