A total of 2.89 million people voted for TLP in the 2024 elections, 0.76 million more compared to the 2018 Elections - Gallup Pakistan Digital Analytics on Elections

(Islamabad, Pakistan): 12th March, 2024

Gallup Pakistan Digital Analytics team on Elections has performed analytics on Election 2024 data released so far by Election Commission of Pakistan. This Press Release is part of series of Press Releases under this program. Previous press release under this series can be found [here](#), which looked at rise and fall of votes in absolute numbers for main parties in Punjab and its regions between 2018 vs 2024.

How has support for TLP transformed between 2024 and 2018:

The results reveal that a total of 2.89 million people voted for TLP in the 2024 elections, 0.76 million more compared to the 2018 Elections.

OTHER KEY LEARNINGS FROM THIS PRESS RELEASE:

1. A total of 2.89 million people voted for TLP in the 2024 elections, 0.76 million more than the 2018 Elections, where total votes were 2.13 million.
2. TLP saw a raise in total votes across all provinces, except for Sindh.
3. Interestingly, more people voted for TLP in Islamabad, than the Balochistan province.
4. **Punjab:** 2.42 million people in Punjab voted for TLP in the 2024 elections, 0.84 million more than the 2018 Elections, where total votes were 1.58 million. All divisions saw an increase in both votes and vote share from 2018 to 2024, except for Gujranwala Division where vote share decreased by 0.2%.
5. **Sindh:** 0.32 million people in Sindh voted for TLP in the 2024 elections, 0.10 million less than the 2018 Elections, where total votes were 0.42 million. All divisions saw an increase in both votes and vote share from 2018 to 2024, except for Karachi Division where votes decreased by 0.17 million, and vote share by 5.5%.
6. **Khyber Pakhtunkhwa:** 95,608 people in KP voted for TLP in the 2024 elections, 5,661 more than the 2018 Elections, where total votes were nearly 89,947. While overall vote share for TLP remained the same as 2018, there was variation in votes and vote share across all divisions.
7. **Balochistan:** 23,675 people in Balochistan voted for TLP in the 2024 elections, 12,335 more than the 2018 Elections, where total votes were nearly 11,340. All divisions saw an increase in both votes and vote share from 2018 to 2024, except for Sibi Division where votes decreased by 813, and vote share by 1.1%.
8. **Islamabad:** 29,830 people in Islamabad voted for TLP in the 2024 elections, 9,065 more than the 2018 Elections, where total votes were nearly 20,765.

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METHODOLOGY:

The press release is based on data from the Form 47 of the Provisional Results Dashboard from the Election Commission of Pakistan website, noting the details of votes cast in each polling station. The data has been computed to represent overall results at the provincial and national levels.

Gallup Pakistan Electoral Repository: An Introduction

The Gallup Pakistan Electoral Repository is comprised of the following sources:

1. Election Commission data on past 11 elections in Pakistan, available over each constituency. This data was acquired from Election Commission website and converted into digital database in SPSS form and is now referred to as Gilani Index of Electoral Record.
2. Gallup Exit Polls for every election since 1985.
3. Gallup pre and post-election survey record since 1985.
4. Analysis by Dr. Ijaz Shafi Gilani on elections piece by piece, as well as in combined form.
