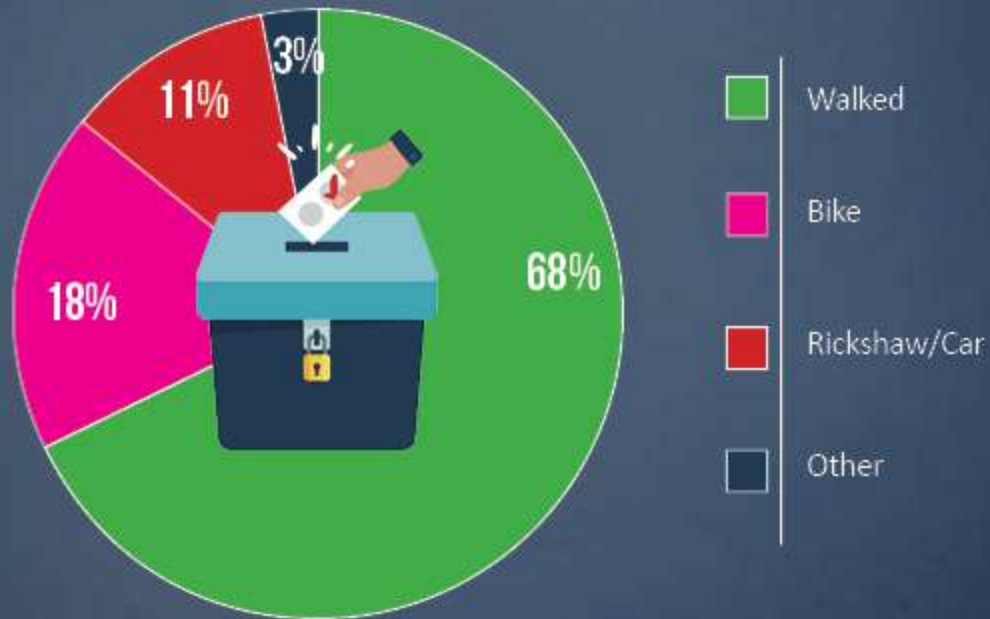

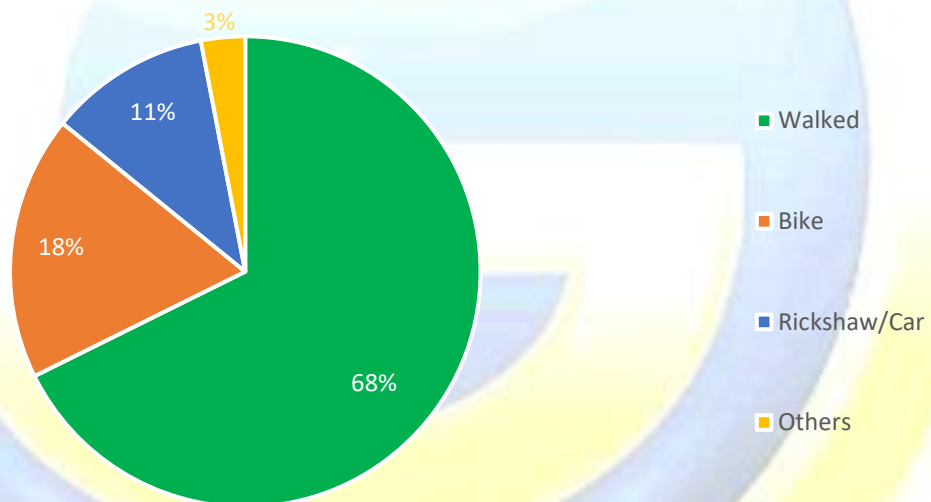
Nearly 7 in 10 Pakistanis (68%) walked to the polling stations to cast their vote in the 2024 General Elections: Gallup & Gilani Pakistan

(Islamabad) 9th May, 2024

According to a survey conducted by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, nearly 7 in 10 Pakistanis (68%) walked to the polling stations to cast their vote in the 2024 General Elections.

A nationally representative sample of adult men and women from across the country who cast their vote in the recent elections was asked the question, “Please tell me what means did you use to get to the polling station?” In response, 68% said ‘Walked to the polling station’, 18% said ‘Bike’, 11% said ‘Rickshaw/Car’, and 3% said ‘Others’.

The study in Pakistan was conducted and released by Gallup & Gilani Pakistan, the Pakistani affiliate of Gallup International. The recent survey was carried out among a sample of 1,017 men and women in urban and rural areas of all four provinces of the country, conducted from 29th February – 15th March 2024. The error margin is estimated to be approximately $\pm 2-3$ percent at the 95% confidence level. The methodology used for data collection was telephonic surveys (CATI).
